Good Reasons to Eat Potassium-Rich Foods
While many people are aware that too much sodium can intensify high blood pressure, few may know much about its counterpart, potassium.
Dr. Mary Kinney Sweeten, nutritionist wit the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, said while sodium can increase blood pressure in some help control blood pressure and regulate heart rhythm.
She said that many experts agree that just as there are good reasons to avoid too much sodium, an ingredient of salt and other food additives there are good reasons to eat foods that contain plenty of potassium there is evidence suggesting that if a diet is rich in potassium, the likelihood of falling victim to high blood pressure or hypertension lessens. Sweeten said an article in the New England Journal of Medicine also
said one extra serving per day of potassium-rich food can cut the risk of death from strokes as much as 40 percent "You're more likely to have a healthier diet by eating potassium-rich foods because usually these foods contain other nutrients, Sweeten said. ples of foods that contribute large amounts of potassium (in relation to sodium content) while offering plenty of vitamins and minerals such as iron.
Fruits and vegetables also provide potassium, but this changes if the foods are heaving processed, according to Sweeten.
