    Collector's office of a change in residence from one precinct to another in the county. Any changes in voter registration must be made in person.
    Chita Hataway, Garza County Tax Assessor-Collector, reports that almost 300 voter registration cards were returned in the recent mailout. If you have moved recenty and tease check with the tax office to make sure your registration is in order The year 1990 is an important election year in Garza County, as well
