Post People Help Victims of Accident

A Tuesday evening, February 27 bus accident on rain-slick U.S. Highway 84, about one and one-half miles northeast of Post, resulted in minor injuries to nine Texas Tech University students enroute to the Dallas-Fort Worth area for concerts.

Two of the students were hospitalized in Lubbock's St. Mary of the Plains Hospital.

A spokesman for the group said 47 passengers, including former PHS choir director Mike Jones, were on the TNM&O bus when it skidded out of control about 6:30 p.m.

Garza County sheriff units, the Post Volunteer Fire Department, the Post EMTs and concerned citizens were at the sight of the accident in minutes to help the bus passengers and transport them to Post where the First Baptist Church opened its Fellowship Hall to the students.

Other churches and individuals were also on hand with food and blankets.

Green Thumb Program Now Twenty Years Old

Howard, Jr has proclaimed the week of March 11-17 as "Employ the Older Worker Week."

In his proclamation, Judge Howard said, "Among the most important resources are the experience, ability and wisdom of our older workers. And, to meet the economic and social challenges of the 90's, Texas must maintain and support gainful employment opportunities for older Texans."

"I urge all employers, both public and private, to hire an older Texan - prove that ability is ageless."

Voters will also vote "yes" or "no" on the following three statements:

"The legislature and the supreme court should not limit the right of citizens to demand a trial by jury of their peers in either civil or criminal cases."

"The elected legislature, not an appointed federal judge, should act to maintain Texans' right to nominate and elect judges instead of creating an appointed judiciary. The legislative plan should include the nomination and election of urban district judges from districts with smaller populations (similar to the population of existing judicial districts in rural areas)."

"The legislature should adopt comprehensive insurance reform legislation to eliminate price fixing,

cause an immediate rollback of insurance rates, and require insurance companies to engage in good faith and fair dealing with policyholders."

Man Armed with Shotgun Burglarizes Fort Justice

Mary and Riley Miller, owners of Justiceburg's Fort Justice, drove into the Fort's parking lot at about 8:15 p.m. Sunday, March 4 and discovered a burglary in process. The owners were met at the rear of the building by a man armed with a shotgun, who used the gun to motion them to move on.

Garza County law officers rushed to the scene after the Millers drove to a residence near Fort Justice and telephoned the sheriff's office to report the burglary and

armed man.

According to sheriff's office reports, the burglar (or burglars) succeeded in pulling the bars off windows in the rear of Fort Justice and gained entry to the building by breaking the glass and unlocking the window. Although merchandise was stacked up near the back door of the building, the burglar evidently fled the scene before he could load his truck.

EPA, Storage Tanks, Landfill Discussed at City Council Meeting

Representatives of Parkhill, Smith & Cooper (PSC) of Lubbock, painted a gloomy picture of the future of underground storage tanks and landfills when the Post City Council met in regular session Monday, March 5.

Paul McMillan of PSC outlined for the council the Environmental Protection Agency's (EPA) regulations governing the registration, installation and closure of underground petroleum storage tanks.

In other business the council approved Arnold Fry's request for \$972.15 to cover fencing material for the new remote control car track located in David Nichols Park. Fry reported that the track was in use this past weekend and that 15 cars were running.

Fry also reported on the new control stand for the use of the car operators donated and built by Bernard Pewitt.

Larry King of General Telephone made one of that company's regular appearances at Monday's meeting to visit with

council members. Mayor Giles McCrary expressed his appreciation to King and to GTE for the company's continued cooperation and the Brownfield office's ongoing good relations with the City of Post.

In a report on the cemetery, Bob Turner told the council that letters had been mailed asking people to turn back cemetery lots that were reserved in the past and were not paid for. Turner explained that recovering these lots would postpone the city's opening

The company's gross annual revenues will increase by approximately \$399,600, or less than one percent annually.

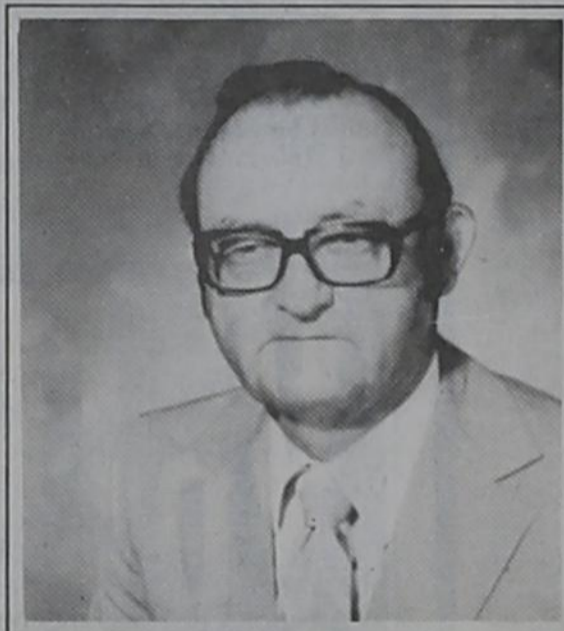

The council approved a request from the cemetery board for extended water service, at a cost of about \$350, to those areas in the cemetery not presently served.

Present at the Monday meeting were Mayor McCrary; Commissioners Larry Waldrip, Dan Lamb, Jack Alexander and Larry Mills; Wanda Wilkerson; Bob Turner; and Harvey Morton.

Administered by the Texas Water Commission (TWC), the EPA program calls for the permanent closure of all tanks that cannot meet EPA requirements, including spill and overflow prevention and release detection. Tanks meeting the requirements will only buy the owners a few years before eventual removal, McMillan said.

According to EPA guidelines, an 850-gallon tank now in use by the City of Post should have had release detection systems in place by December 22, 1989, but the number of storage tanks registered has slowed down the work of the TWC.

It was the decision of the council that the tank now in use locally should be removed at the city's "earliest appropriate convenience" and that paperwork on the removal process should be started immediately.

Butch Davis of PSC updated the council on proposed EPA landfill regulations which will be released by late spring and will drastically affect the City of Post's garbage removal. The proposed regulations, if not changed by variances, would be financially devastating to small and rural communities.

Several alternatives to the landfill problem were discussed - including closing portions of the existing landfill, securing acreage for a new landfill, transporting the garbage to another location and privately operated landfills - but no decision was called for at the Monday night meeting.
