The Garza Memorial Hospital board of directors, meeting in regular session Tuesday, April 17, determined places on the May 5 ballot, with the order drawn with David Tyler, Becky Warren and Ronny Ammons.  
The directors also accepted the quarterly assurance report and authorized administrator Maritta Reed to decide whether or not the hospital would participate in the LynnCo Credit Union.  
Three indigent applications were approved as well as submitting delinquent accounts in the amount of \$4,193.68 for collection.

# Funding for New Industry Gets City Council Attention

The Post City Council approved resolutions at the regular meeting Monday evening related to state and federal economic development funding for Wright Fibers Inc., which is scheduled to begin producing cotton bale coverings at the Postex plant building here.  
The council authorized a resolution required by the Texas Capital Development Fund through the Texas Department of Commerce for \$500,000 in funding for the new industry here. The plan calls for repayment by Wright Fibers in three years and the fund will also be available as it is repaid for use by other industrial prospects.  
Another resolution approved by the council sets in motion a \$490,000 fund from the federally operated Economic Development Administration, which is sponsored locally by the Post Economic Development Corporation (PEDC). PEDC chairman Giles Dalby, with South Plains Association of Governments (SPAG) representative Karen King, explained the funding to council members.  
Herb Wright, now sole owner of Wright Fibers Inc., was also at the meeting to answer questions. Wright recently purchased his partner's share of the operation and the council approved the change as required by the state and federal funding regulations.  
Mayor Giles McCrary presented a special recognition to Wanda Wilkerson

for her 25 years of service. (See details next week).  
In other action, the council met "Ruegher," the newest member of the Garza County Sheriff's Department. Sheriff Freddy Cockrell introduced "Ruegher" in a get acquainted session. "You'll find he is a very friendly dog, and there is no way you could tell by looking at him that when he goes to work, there is no fooling around," the sheriff said.  
"He is strictly a sniffer," the sheriff added, "he is trained solely to sniff out drugs, and in the three days of our training period, he always found the test material that was extremely well hidden."  
The council authorized city manager Bob Turner to research the details concerning the purchase of an additional warning siren. Money for the siren was budgeted several years ago, and Turner is to report to the council at its next meeting as to the cost and where to locate the new unit.  
At Turner's suggestion, the council authorized a study of the cost and methods of repairing sidewalks on Main Street. The discussion centered around various proposals, including the sharing of the cost by property owners. Council members agreed that the sidewalks are in need of repair.  
In administrative reports, Turner reminded the council that Post still ranks among the lowest in tax rates in West Texas and one of the few cities with no bonded indebtedness.  
Mayor Giles McCrary told the council that Main Street manager Wanda Mitchell has been invited by Seminole to visit and explain about the project.

"Seminole folks have seen what we have done and they want to know how to get involved, they plan to visit here with a delegation," the mayor said.  
Possible water supply problems at the baseball park were also discussed, with Turner explaining that the bridge construction on the Snyder Highway has cut off the main water line and the city has installed a temporary three-quarter inch line through the culvert.  
Attending the meeting were Mayor McCrary, council members Irene Fry, Larry Waldrup, Dan Lamb, Jack Alexander and Larry Mills, city manager Turner, city secretary Wanda Wilkerson and city attorney Harvey Morton.  
The council ended its regular meeting with an executive session to discuss litigation. There was no decision following the executive session.

# Parents Urged to Help with Prevention of Child Abuse

April is child abuse prevention month, and public awareness about the issue is sponsored locally by the Garza County Child Welfare Board.  
It may seem totally foreign to many of us, but the simple fact is, there are a lot of children in this community, as is the case across this nation, who are victims of abuse by parents, guardians, relatives or family acquaintances.  
In Garza County we are fortunate to have Child Protective Services Caseworker Ken LeBlanc serving us. Although we share his efforts with Dickens and King counties, having LeBlanc living in Post with his family gives us a better opportunity to improve the quality of service to our community.  
LeBlanc holds a degree from Texas Tech University and has worked with children for a number of years in various roles. He was employed as camp ranger at Camp Post for the Boy Scouts before taking on the caseworker position.  
LeBlanc is a member of the Post Lions Club and the Order of the Arrow. He teaches Sunday school at his church and is active with the church youth as well as serving as scoutmaster for Boy Scout Troop 316.  
Working with LeBlanc, the Child Welfare Board hopes to bring this issue into the open and increase public awareness about the problem and ways to help prevent children from being victimized.  
One of the items the Child Welfare Board has used in this effort is "The Twelve Commandments for Parents" essay, which was recently printed by the First Baptist Church in its "The Messenger".  
It's good information for any of us with children or grandchildren:  
**The Twelve Commandments for Parents**  
*Say what you mean and mean what you say...*  
Shoot straight with your words and feelings. Your children deserve to know how to play your game.  
*Always tell the truth....*  
Tell the truth, even if you think or know it will hurt the child. You expect them to tell you the truth.  
*Always be the same...*  
All youth need someone strong to lean on, especially in crisis time. By being

consistent, they can lean on you.  
*Have faith in your children...*  
Give them some latitude. If you show you trust them, they will respond by being trustworthy. If you have faith in them, they'll have faith in you.  
*Discipline only in love...*  
Never discipline in anger. If you threaten to punish and don't, you have only accomplished frustration. Consider and think about discipline before acting. The offender might be doing something you didn't realize you had taught him or her.  
*Love the other parent...*  
One of the greatest gifts that parents can give their children is to show love and understanding for one another. Children learn what real love is from what they feel and witness from their parents.  
*Be consistent with your word...*  
Follow through. If you mean "no" say "no." If you mean "yes" say "yes." Make decisions your children can rely on.  
*Communicate...*  
Most family problems are caused by something unsaid, assumed, or not thoroughly discussed. Misunderstandings usually come from poor communications and the lack of facts.  
*Always keep your promises...*  
Never promise anything you can't or don't intend to fulfill. If circumstances make it impossible for you to keep a promise, then talk it out and explain the reason thoroughly.  
*Apologize...*  
Parents aren't perfect. Never fail to admit your faults and shortcomings. Admit your errors. If you are guilty of misjudging, apologize. If you wrongly accuse, ask forgiveness.  
*Act out what you say...*  
Don't tell your children one thing and then have another set of rules for yourself. Be the example.  
*Consult your children...*  
Children have a lot more sense and depth than you give them credit for having. Seek their ideas. Ask their opinions. Be proud when they demonstrate to you their love and understanding.

# Commissioners Approve Community Center Audit

An audit of the Post Community Center joint expenditure agreement between the city and county was authorized by the Garza County Commissioners' Court at the regular meeting Monday morning.  
The firm of Hartman & Sawyers, C.P.A. will conduct the audit.  
Commissioners also studied a problem with drainage on property in Precinct One, following a report by Damon Ethridge on behalf of himself and other farmers in the area.  
Road grading in the area over the years has filled in the "bar-ditches" and is creating a serious run-off problem on the fields.  
Commissioner Sammy Ellis will research various ways to solve the problem, including consulting with soil conservation personnel and report to the court later.  
Certified Appraiser Bill Noble was authorized by the court to prepare a feasibility study and cost estimates on appraising land for right-of-way on the road to be constructed for access to Lake Alan Henry near Justiceburg.  
A proposal to prepare a complete listing of all county-owned property by a San Antonio firm was rejected by the commissioners.  
The court approved the annual participation fund of \$500 to the Garza Soil

### Take With Plenty of Water

Increasing one's intake of water often is recommended with health problems such as kidney stones or urinary tract infection. Water is "good medicine" in combination with a variety of commonly used medicines including sulfonamide anti-infective agents and the bulk-forming laxatives. In addition to making swallowing easier, water makes these medicines safer and can increase their effectiveness.

Sulfonamides primarily are used for urinary tract infections. However, if there is a deficiency of water in the body, only small amounts of urine are formed. The result is an increased tendency for the formation of sulfonamide crystals in various parts of the urinary tract. Drinking additional water helps prevent the formation of sulfonamide crystals.

Bulk-forming laxatives may contain methylcellulose, polycarbophil, or psyllium. Each of these agents relies on the presence of water in the large intestine for its action. The Handbook of Non-prescription Drugs indicates that each dose of bulk laxative "should be taken with a full glass of water (at least 8 ounces)."
