form since 1973. He is alongtime sudentof Indian lore He starts the Taba'na Yuan'e with the building of a small fire, using only
natural materials. The fire is lighted by the friction of rubbing two sticks together.
Follow Following the singing of a tribal prayer of thanks for the fire, the "Chief" performs a Four Winds dance where a pipe of peace is presented to the Four
directions then to Mother Earth and to Wakantanka, the Great Spirit above, to seek their blessing. A wad of grass. is placed on the coals and as the smoke indicates the wind
