something else that aisal district has done Informal Review

Reviow by the Appraisal Review Board: If you can't resolve your problem informally with the appraisal district staff, you may have your case heard by the appraisal review board
The appraisal review board (ARB) is an independent board of citizens that reviews problems with appraisals and other concerns listed above. They have the power to orde the appraisal district to make the necessary changes io an ARB hearing (called a notice o protest) before the deadline, the ARB will set your case for a hearing: You'll receive written notification of the time, date, and place of the hearing. The hearing will be informal. You and the appraisal district representative wil be asked to present evidence about you case. The ARB will make its decision based on the evidence presented. You can get a copy of a protest form from the appraisal district office at
Note: You shouldn't try to contact ARB members outside of the hearing. The law requires you to sign an affidavit saying tha you haven't done so before the ARB hears your case.
Review by the District Court: After it decides your case, the ARB must send you a copy o with the decision you have the right to appeal to district court. If you choose to go to court, you must start the process by filing a petition within 45 days of the date you receive the
