## NOTICE OF COMPARABLE TAX RATES AND REVENUES

The legislature has enacted a statute on school funding to comply with a court mandate enforcing the state constitution. Under prior statutes (SB 1) the tax rate for last year provies $\mathbf{\$ 5 , 2 8 9}$ per student in state and local revenues. Under this statute (SB 351) that same rate now provides $\$ 5,472$ per student in state and local revenues.

State law only requires a minimum tax rate of $\$ .7543$ for county education districts. State law does not require a school district to adopt additional taxes. Neither does state law require a school district to adopt a tax rate that maximizes the receipt of state funds.

The board of trustees of the Southland School District hereby gives notice that is is considering the adoption of a tax rate of $\$ .4582$ that will provide $\$ 5,385$ per student in state and local revenues.
