Trustees name consultant for superintendent search

Citizens invited to serve on redistricting advisory committee

Meeting in a special called session Thursday, May 21, members of the Post Independent School District board of trustees approved the selection of John Townly of Roanoke, Texas to serve as a consultant in the search for a

Trustee Jeff Lott presented a briefing to the board, explaining Townly's background and qualifications as a consultant. Townly, a retired superintendent who also teaches at North Texas State University, was Borden County ISD's consultant in its recent search and hiring of a superintendent.

Lott said that Borden County trustees were pleased with Townly's services redistricting advisory committee.

Loans to aid farmers in Texas

by U.S. Senator Phil Gramm U.S. Senator Phil Gramm has announced that farmers in four Texas counties are eligible to apply for low-interest emergency loans to help recover from damages and losses to crops due to adverse weather conditions during the 1991 crop year.

The four counties eligible for the loan assistance are Crosby, Garza, Hill and Stonewall counties.

For those who cannot obtain credit through normal channels, the U.S. Farmers Home Administration will make loans available at below-market

interest rates to family farmers. In addition to the above counties, 17 other Texas counties have been named as contiguous counties and therefore are eligible for assistance. The counties affected by adverse weather conditions are Borden, Bosque, Dickens, Ellis, Fisher, Haskell, Johnson, Jones, Kent, King, Knox, Limestone, Lubbock, Lynn, McLennan, Navarro, Scurry Counties.

Morrow is currently playing Mr. Bumble in the Center Stage Theatre's production of "Oliver". The show opened May 8 on Staton



This ANN That

School will be out in just a few days and many of us will be going on vacation trips both long and short. Some of us are still not as careful as we should be about buckling up the passengers in our cars. The most vulnerable traveler on the road is the small child who must depend on an adult to assure his or her safety.

Some parents and grandparents think that they can protect infants and young children from injuries in a car accident by holding them in their laps. They cannot.

In a 30 mph crash, for example, a child may be thrown forward with a force equal to 30 times its own weight. If the adult is wearing a seat belt, the child may be torn from the adult's arms and hurled into the dash or windshield.

If the adult is not wearing a seat belt, both the adult and child will fly forward and the probability is that the child will be crushed between the adult and the dash. The best way adults can protect children in automobiles is to buckle them up.

A recent North Carolina study has shown that hundreds of crashes in that state each year are caused when unrestrained child passengers distract drivers. Think for a moment: How much attention does a driver pay to driving when a child passenger falls off the seat, hangs out the window, pulls the driver's hair, or tries to open the door? With children buckled up an adult driver can concentrate on driving without having to worry about the child being hurt. Both driver and child will be calmer and more relaxed when the destination has been reached.

In an accident children need to have the crash forces spread more evenly over their fragile bodies, and that's whea child safety seats do. They are fastened to the car by the safety belt already in the car, and in a crash they protect the child from colliding with the car's

Remember to use a seat that fits the child, fits the car, and is fastened according to the manufacturer's instructions. Small children cannot decide for themselves to buckle up. They depend on adults to protect them from harm, so buckle them up.

Tips to help children accept the safety seat as a way of life are: *Buckle up from the start (from

the first ride home from the hos-Set the example of being

* Require seat belt use for all

passengers in the vehicle. * Make sure the child is comfortable.

Plan ahead for the child's physical needs such as bathroom stops and food and drink. * Help entertain the child in the

car. Allow the child to have some "in the car only" toys which they like and can play with only in the child safety seat.

* Provide positive reinforcement for good behavior by complimenting the child on his or her improvement in ability to sit in the seat and play without distracting the driver.

* Buckle up every time the child is in anyone's car.





Program Area beef cattle producers will have the opportunity to participate in a unique program on Thursday, May 28. The program will be co-ordinated by our office and will be sponsored by Satellite Cattle Exchange, Ltd. Representatives from SCE will be on hand to present the program which will begin at 12 noon on the 28, at the Chaparral Restaurant in the Garden Room. Participants will be furnished with a buffet meal, compliments of SCE. The program is being coordinated by Keith Davis, local SCE rep. The possibility also exists for participants to actually take part in a planned sale that Satellite Cattle Exchange will be broadcasting during the same time frame, However, this part of the program depends upon satellite dish avail-

The idea of satellite broadcasted cattle sales was slow to gain popularity in the early developmental years. However, times has changed and this marketing avenue has become very popular to both the buyer and the seller. Research has shown that this means of marketing cattle for sellers has the following benefits: 1 - forward contracting cattle for future delivery without customary margin calls; 2 - exposure to nationwide buyers network; 3 - cattle are sold fresh, on the farm and still gaining weight and 4 - selling direct to the end user boosts selling prices.

Buyers have also come to rely

Buyers have also come to rely heavily on videoed cattle sale because sales allow them to 1 - lower transaction costs due to trucking costs and shrinkage; 2 - bid on cattle from remote locations; 3 - reduce money and time searching for cattle; 4 - view large numbers of cattle at one time and, 5 - purchase healthier cattle that will have less exposure to disease.

Both registered and commercial cattlemen are urged to make plans to take part in the program and meal. Spring rains, winter moisture have started us on what could be a grazing year and this new marketing approach will offer beef producers a new insight into marketing. Make plans to be present for the program, the meal, and hopefully the actual sale on Thursday, May 28. Feel free to call our office if we can answer questions.


