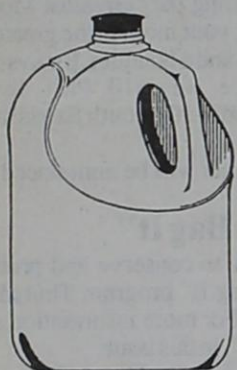

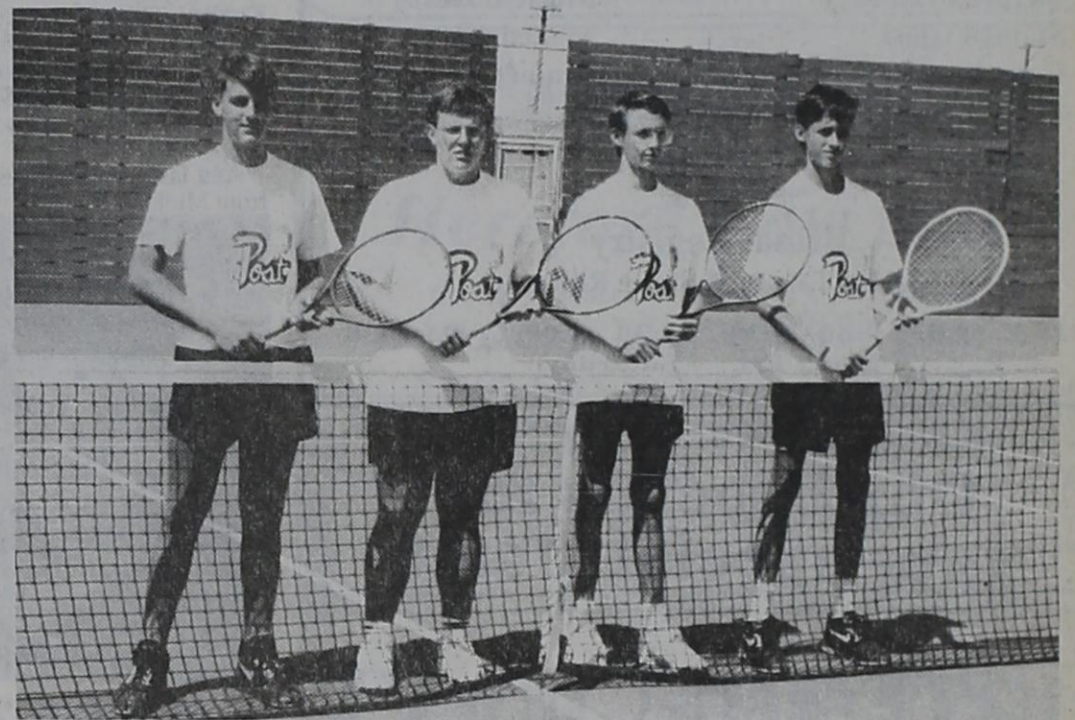

Young attends seminar at A&M

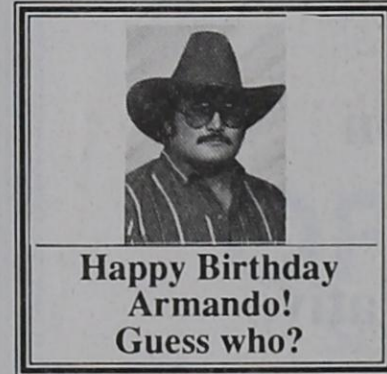
County Treasurer Ruth Ann Young attended the 20th Annual County Treasurers' Seminar at Texas A&M University April 13-16.

The theme for the seminar was "Unification." The seminar was a program of the V.G. Young Institute of County Government of the Texas Agricultural Extension Service and the County Treasurers Association of Texas. The seminar was sponsored and conducted in cooperation with the Texas Association of Counties.

State Comptroller John Sharp delivered the keynote address. Subjects discussed in the seminar ranged from Depository Contracts, Investments Policies, Grants and County Records to Self Protection. More than 30 speakers addressed the seminar. Concurrent roundtable discussions were a part of the program, with county groupings conducted according to population size.

County treasurers are required to complete 20 hours of educational effort every two years according to state law. Treasurers attending were awarded 2.0 continuing education units (20 hours) by Texas A&M's Office of Continuing Education.

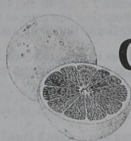

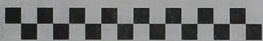

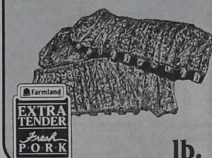

Antelopes drop two in district baseball

The Post Bold Gold Antelopes went on the road this past week in search of district 4-2A respectability. They came home with a little respect despite two tough losses.

"It is a big step from Little League (for some of the kids) to the type of baseball played at the High School level", said Coach Fred Postel about the teams progress in their first year of action.

Coach Postel also commented, "It's also very different from Babe Ruth baseball." The 'Lopes took a 2-2 mark into Idalou last Tuesday and got into trouble early.

After a scoreless top of the first, the 'Lopes came out slow on defense and the Wildcats scored four runs.

By the third inning, Idalou had built a comfortable 7-2 lead. The Wildcats then coasted to a 10-3 district victory. Phil Leininger picked up the loss for the Antelopes, his first of the season.

Shane Horton carried the Antelope offensive attack with one home run and 2 RBIs.

Post improved it's defensive performance against a tough New Deal nine that had just come off an upset win over previously unbeaten and 4th ranked Ralls.

Again, the first inning set the tone for the game as the Lions scored 3 in the bottom half of the inning. New Deal added 2 in the 4th and 4 more in the 5th to open a 9-0 advantage before the Bold Gold bats came to life.

Post went into the final inning trailing 9-1. Shane Horton hit a homer and garnered 3 RBIs but the rally fell short.

New Deal handed the 'Lopes their second loss in a row by a 9-6 count. Tommy Ammons picked up the loss for Post as the 'Lopes season record now stands at 2-4.

And by the way, the jump was also good enough to win the first place medal at the event for Ranetta. One would have to say that she is ready for Regionals.

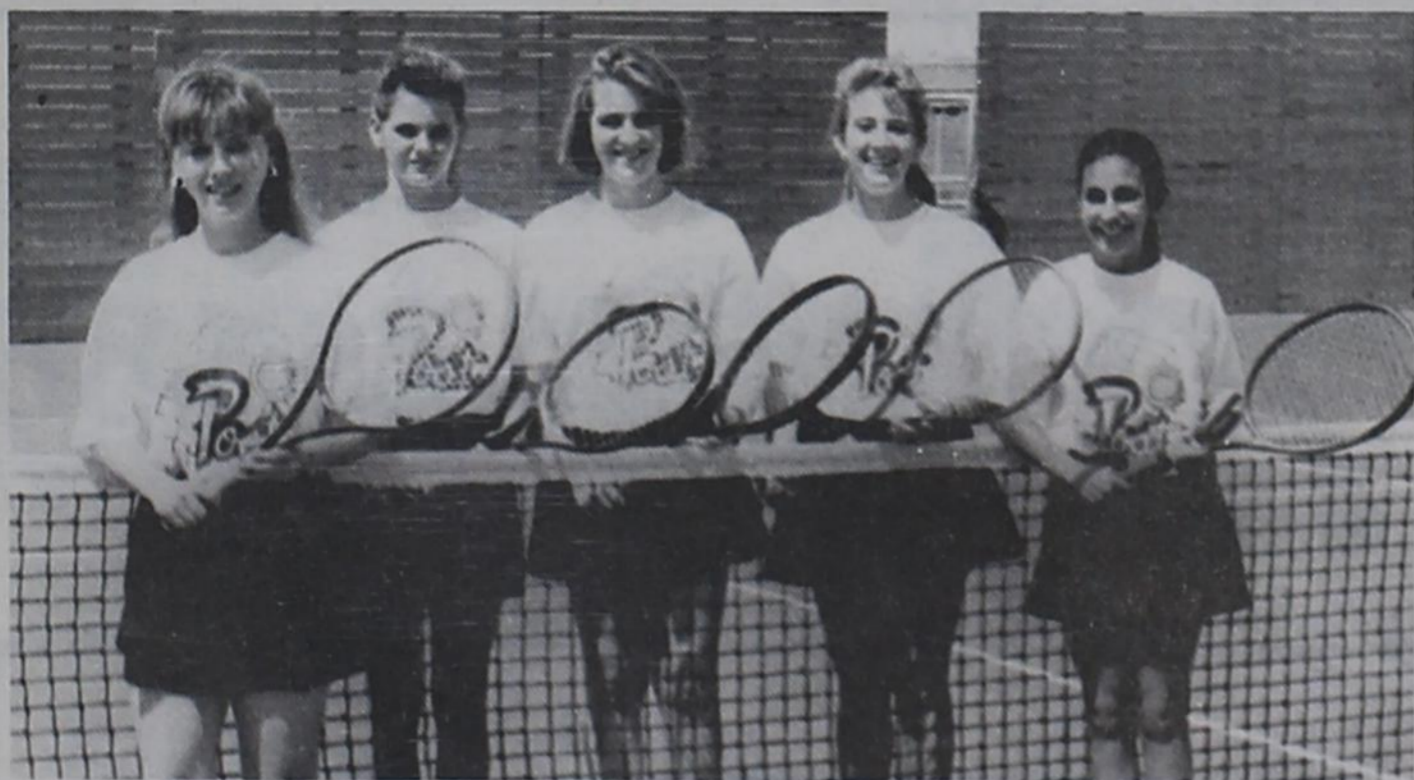

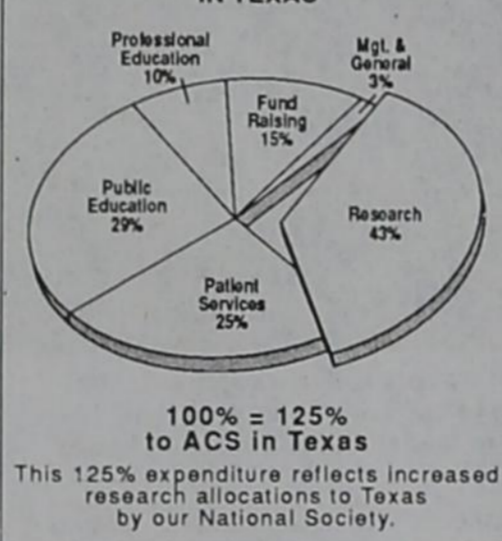
