## HIV, AIDS education gets attention from school staff

Health officials
HIV, are having a major impact on society and the seriousness of the diseases are affecting everyone, whether by exposure to the media stereo-typing or by the actual contraction of the disease.
Education is taking on a arimary role in the attempt to stop the spread of HIV
and AIDS and public educars have determined that awareness of the serious Pat Thompson, Post Independent School District (ISD) counselor, has recently attended workshops on the subject of HiV and AIDS education. From
these workshops she was able to present alarming facts and information to
school board members atthe regularmeeting in April. During her presentation, Thompson summarized the positions of the Texas Education Agency (TEA), the Center for Disease Control, the National Schoo
Board Association and the American Association of School Administrator concerning AIDS and the education of the subject for school aged children. The 11 points Thompson presented to the board were. 1. The World Health Organization reporst that one in every 75 males and one
nevery 450 females in the United $S$ Sates is infected with HIV. Texas Department of Health(TDH) has cited 214 known cases of AIDS in children and adolescents,
Best estimates indicate that the number of HIV positive individuals is at least 10 imes the number of diagnosed cases.

3. HIV/AIIS education should

Deadline for Filing Protests with the ARB*

On or before May 31 (or 30 days after a notice of appraised value was mailed to you, whichever is later)
Late protests are allowed if you miss the usual deadline for good cause. Good cause is some reason
beyond your control, like a medical emergency. The ARB decides whether you have good cause.
Late protests are due the day before the appraisal review board approves records for the year. Contact your appraisal district for more information.

## Special Deadlines

Special Deadines
For change of use (the appraisal district informed you that you are losing agricultural appraisal because
you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determination you changed the use of your land), the deadline is before the 30th day after the notice of the determinaion
was mailed to you. For ARB changes (the ARB has informed you of a change that increases your tax liability and the change
didn't result from a protest you filed), the deadline is before the 30 th day after the notice of the determination was mailed to you.
