The fine and explanation of the problem．was outlined in detail at the Tuesday City manager Bob Turner reported that for several months the city has told he inspectors that＂we are trying to clean up the problem，but that excuse wil only work for just so long，＂Turner said，＂and then we are going to be subjected
to some steep fines．＂
