- by Wes Burnett $\quad$ Garza County Commissioners voted to approve advertising bids for a new radio system, following an explanation of the need and costs during

City Council members Larry Waldrip and Jim Schooler, along with
manager Bob Turner.
Last week the city council voted to approve sharing the cost of the new
radio radio system, pending approval
the law enforcement committee
County Judge Giles Dalby explained the need for replacing the current radio transmitter, repeater, antenna and coaxial cable, and outlined the
proposal.
Citing continuing high maintenance costs on the current radio system, which is 18 years old, Dalby said that the total cost for the new system
should be under $\$ 15,000$. This year the city and county have paid more than $\$ 2,000$ for repairs to the old system, according to an estimate by county
treasurer RuthAnn Young treasurer Ruth Ann Young
The new radio system will provide law enforcement officials with 16
channels, compared to the current limitation of six, and during emergency
poweroutages, a rechargeable battery will keep the syst power outages, a rechargeable battery will keep the system operating.

The ceremony is held each year on March 22 , as visitors and Garza
County residents gather around a circular ceremonial ring to watch a County residents gather around a circular ceremonial ring to watch a
dancer, clad in traditional beaded buckskins and feathered headdress,
perform an Indian version of an extended weather forecast perform an Indian version of an extended weather forecas
Taba'na Yuan e translates to "The Sunrise Wind ""

Taba'na Yuan'e translates to "The Sunrise Wind:"
The Plains Indians used the dance to check the
exact moment of sunrise, which would determine their success in the
coming year. According to the legend, the wind must be checked at sunrise on the
day after the sun reaches the halfway point in its journey from the south to
nort north. Garza County farmers and ranchers have relied on the Taba'na Yuan'e for more than 80 years to provide a hint as to cheir success in the
coming year.

original form since 1973 . He is a long-time student of Indian lore.

## Ground breaking ceremony set for April 19 at Lake Alan Henry

The City of Lubbbock has announced that special ground breaking ceremonies are scheduled April 19 at the Lake Alan

In a recent letter of explanation to May
eck" outlined the len Ma Crary, Lubbock's Mayor B.C "The design engineers completed the project plans and specifications in mid-
990 ".McMinnexplained "Prior to construction of the dam, a permit had to be obtained from the United States Corps of Engineers. .S. Fish and Wildlife Service, The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, the
National Advisory Council for Historical Places and the Texas Historical Commission, the city received the necessary ' 404 Permit' from the Corps. "This permitrequired purchasing additional land for wilddife mitigation complete with a management plan and staff wildlife biologist. The permit also required the
development of an archaeological mitigation plan to ensure that the reservoir area's development of an archaeological mitigation plan to ensure that the reservoir area's
cultural resources were field investigated, documented and specific artifacts curated.
"The City of Lubbock entered into an agreement with the Brazos River Authority
in in May 1989, for the administration of the Lake Alan Henry project. The Authority
will thus manage the construction of the dam, reservoir, intake structure and will tus manage the construction of the dam, reservoir, intake
spill ways and will manage the overall operationonce constructed.
"Since the Brazos River Authority's function is the construction and "Since the Brazos River Authority's function is the construction and management of large and medium sized reservoir projects, they will bring to this project the

"The bids for construction of the dam and reservoir were opened at the Authority's offices in Waco on December 4, 1990. Low bidder was Granite
Construction Company. You may recognize this name; Granite has performed the construction of all five phases of the State Highway Department's I-27 project through Lubbock.
"It is my understanding that Granite Construction, a Califormia based firm, will actually assign another rgroup from theircomspany toconstructuthe Lake Lake Alan Henry

The actual dam and reservoir construction began this month. "Once the reservoir is completed in 1993, it will take quite some time to fill. will take between two to six years to completely fill. "As the reservoir fills over this lengthy period of time, considerable evaporation
will occur. A relatively high total dissolved solids concentration in the run-off
water from the Justiceburg area, coupled with the evaporation, will mean that the remaining 'salts' will concentrate in the reservoir.

as we can economically use all of the water that it will produce.
"Last fall, hee city enlisted the services of a firm of groundwater hydrologists to
