## THE COMMERCIAL USE OF TEXAS HIGHWAYS IS A PRIVILEGE, NOT A RIGHT

$\geqslant$ The highways of Texas are the property of its citizens. They constitate a system of nearly 200,000 miles of road of which 20,000 miles are designated as State highways and the remainder are county roads. All types of oad are represented in this system, less than $5 \%$ have so-called "perma-
hundred million dollars. From 1917 to 1930 , inclusive, counties and road districts of the State issued $\$ 243,592,834$ in bonds for the construction and
mprovement of roads and bridges. In the two-year period ending August 31, 1930, the State Highway Commission expended $\$ 89,080,825$, of which

In view of these tremendous costs the preservation of our highways from rapid wear and destruction is a matter of very vital interest to their ownrs, viz., the public. It is especially important that they be made to outlast the life of the bonds, which run from 20 to 30 years.

The use of the public highways for commercial purposes is not a right but a privilege which may be withheld or granted subject to such restricSuch regulations are intended to promote safety, preserve the highways and safeguard the interests of the public.

Texas Railroads, which pay the entire cost of construction and maintenance of their own roadbeds and, in addition, make substantial contributions to the cost of Texas highways, are thoroughly regulated with respect to their services, rates, methods and practices. There is no good reason why commercial users of the highways, built and maintained at the expense of the public, should not likewise be regulated to such extent as the publie interest requires and pay such charges as will represent proper compensa-
ton the prive mated

- The statutes governing highway transportation as enacted by the Fortysecond Legislature represent the wishes of the citizens of this State and express their desire to give equal rights to all and special privileges to none. These statutes should be given a fair trial and their value ascertained. Unless this is
surely ensue.
