AN AERIAL VIEW OF POSTEX COTTON MILLS

This will be the first public open house of Postex Mills in two years-the last being in Cotton Week during the spring of 1958.

We are sorry but federal law forbids youngsters under 16 years of age from being admitted to the mills.

Postex Mills employ around 500 persons with the cotton mill working around the clock on a three-shift basis, six days a week. The sewing room is operated on a single shift basis.

Modern Postex equipment includes 360 automatic looms and 17,750 spindles. The big sanforizer, pictured below, is one of the world's biggest. It was installed last year.

Guides will be provided to conduct guests in small groups through the entire plant and explain plant opera fion. Postex Mills take the raw cotton from the bale and process it completely through to Garza and Foxcroft sheets, both flat and contour, and pillow cases, bleached and in six colors.
