#### S. S. News

Of special interest to disabled workers is the provision of the Social Security Act which provides for disability payments at age 50 order to qualify for these benefits. the disabled person must be unable to perform any substantial gainful activity and must have worked under social security for at least 5 out of 10 years immediately preceding the date he became disabled. At least a year and a half of this work must have been during the three years just before the disability began. In addition the disabled individual must have filed an application for these benefits.

Disabled workers who have been unable to work for a prolonged per-iod may lose their rights to disability payments at age 50 if they do not file an application before June 30th. Failure to file for these disability provisions may also affect their rights to benefits upon retirement and to benefits for their survivors in the event of the worker's death. Any disabled person who meets the requirements set forth above is urged to contact his nearest social security office. If the individ ual is unable to make this contact in person, a friend or relative may notify the Social Security office.


