V. A. Quiz

Q - I receive a pension from VA. In reporting income for the past year for VA pension purposes, I do not have to include my pension payments, do I?
A - No. Your VA pension payments are not considered income for purposes of your report on 1958 income.

Q - I have either lost or misplaced the discharge I received when I came out of service. Where do I get another and is there any charge for the replacement?
A - To replace a lost discharge, write the Personnel Records Center of the Armed Forces, 9700 Page Blvd., St. Louis, Mo. Give your service number and include your branch of service. There is no charge for replacement.

Q - I'll be entering school at the start of the spring semester, under the Korean GI Bill. My present employer says he will keep me on part time if I wish. Is there a limit on what I can earn in a part time job and still keep my school allowance?
A - There are no restrictions on earnings in part time employment for students attending college under the Korean GI Bill. Students taking on the job training, however, may have their allowance reduced when allowance and earnings combined exceed \$310 a month.

How to determine the number of income tax exemptions you get shouldn't be too much of a problem for most taxpayers. However, more people get tangled up with the Internal Revenue Service in an audit of their tax return over dependents than any other item. The law is liberal on allowing exemptions for children attending schools even though they may have earned enough income to file a return on their own. The taxpayer must make sure that each dependent meets the requirements spelled out in the tax instructions. It pays to carefully study your tax instructions on dependents. You may find you are entitled to some extra \$600 exemptions by reading these instructions. On the other hand you may find that you are not entitled to an exemption and save yourself an audit by Internal Revenue.

Texas cotton producers saved an estimated \$64 million plus in 1958 in labor costs by using machine harvesters and machines and chemicals for grass and weed control.

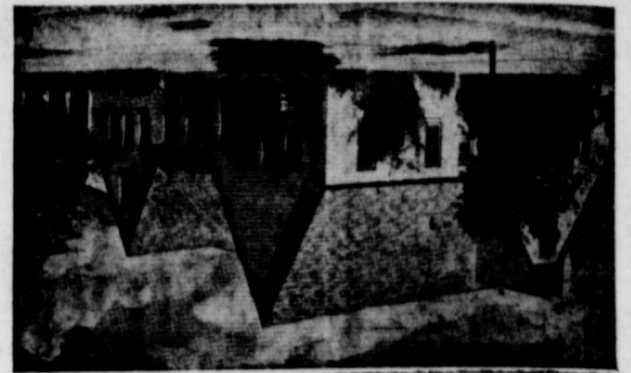
Feed grain prices in the 1958-59 marketing year are expected to average a little less below the 1957-58 level, principally as a result of large supplies.

The use of starter solutions to stimulate freshly transplanted vegetables in cold soil is perhaps one of the cheapest and easiest methods of obtaining an extra 20 to 30 percent increase in yields.

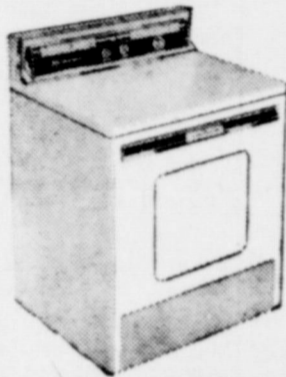

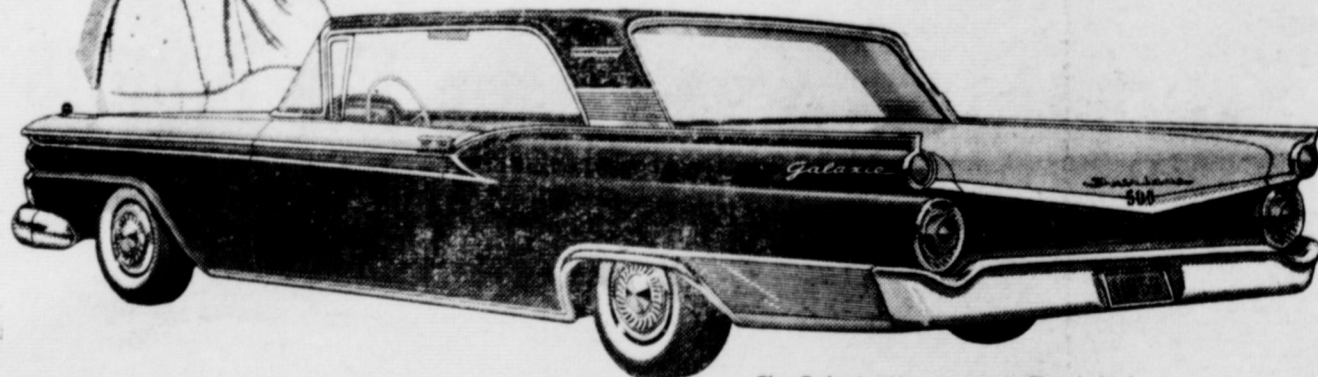

Ornamentals are a favorite victim of cotton root rot and the disease troubled many Texas homeowners last year. Now is the time to begin planning a control program to combat the disease and reduce damage this year, advises Harlan Smith, extension plant pathologist. For more advice he suggests getting a copy of L-359, "Cotton Root Rot," from local county agents.

Chemical brush control is dealt with extensively in three leaflets published by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. They are available from local county agents.

Grasshoppers are likely to be more widespread in the west and midwest this summer but are expected to be less destructive than in 1958. However, weather conditions between now and hatching time will have a strong bearing on numbers and a check will be made next spring to determine the areas where control measures are needed.

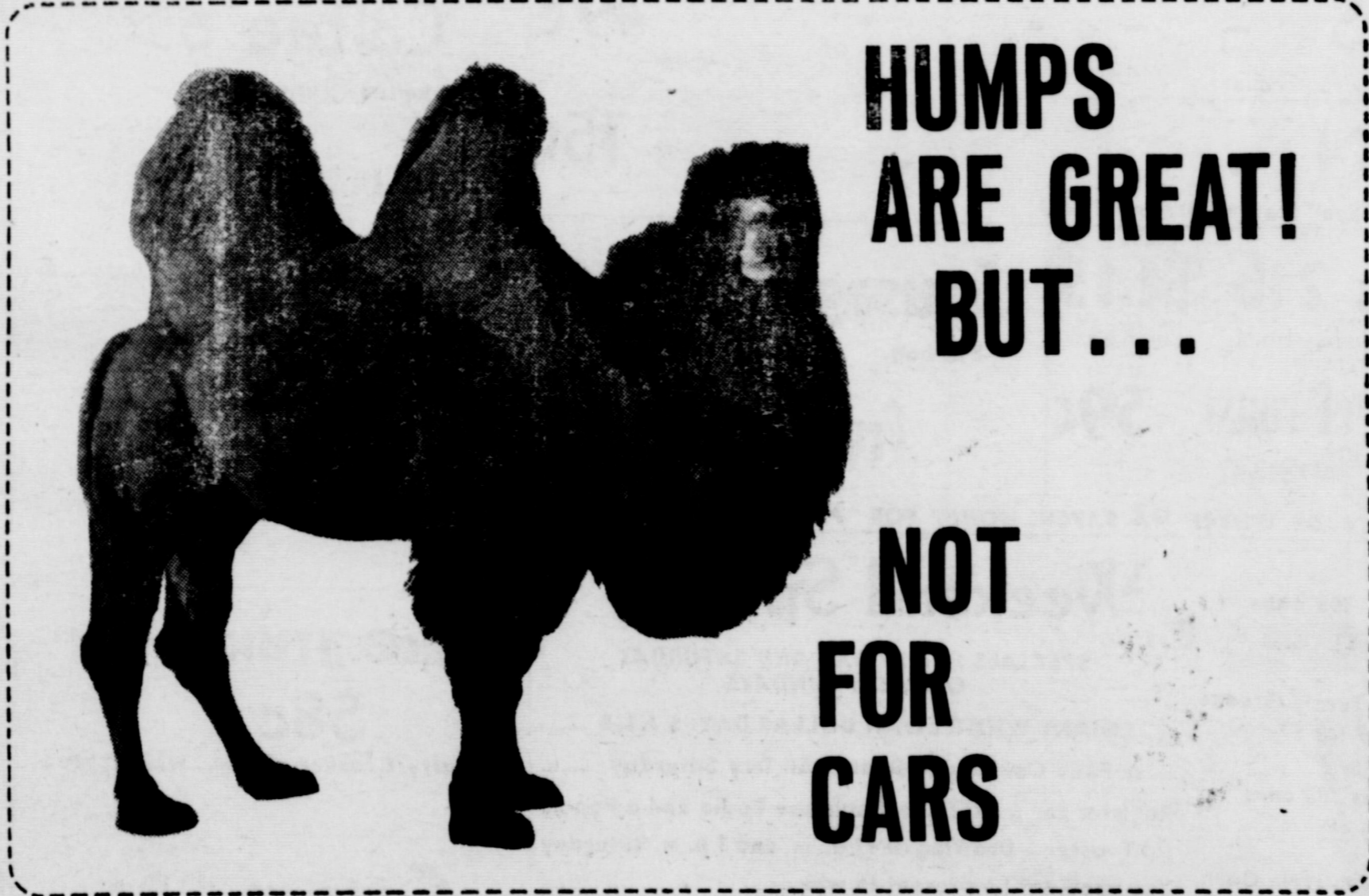

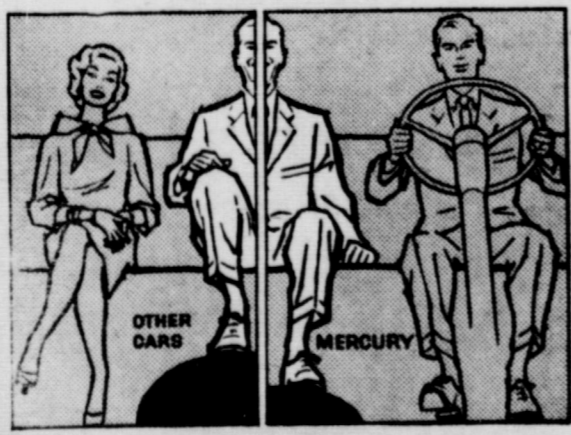
