"Should I follow Plan A or B?" This is a big question in the minds of many cotton farmers. Those who do not completely understand the plans or can not decide which to follow are advised to see their local county agents or other authorities who can explain the plans.

Texas cotton producers saved an estimated \$64 million plus in 1958 in labor costs by using machine har-vesters and machines and chemicals for grass and weed control.

Feed grain prices in the 1958-59 marketing year are expected to average a little less below the 1957-58 level, principally as a result of large supplies.

The use of starter solutions transplanted stimulate freshly vegetables in cold soil is perhaps one of the cheapest and easiest methods of obtaining an extra 20 to 30 percent increase in yields.

Over two and one half million dollars have now been obligated to landowners in the Plains area of Texas thru the Great Plains Conservation Program. For a thorough explanation of the program, obtain L-410 from ounty agents or the Agricultural Information office in College Station, Texas.




