### Demo., G.O.P Election Set For Saturday

Saturday is primary voting day for the Democratic and Republican parties where voting on both ballots will be at the school. This is the first time in history that the Republican party in Texas has held a primary election. Republican precinct convention will be at school at 7:05 p. m. and Democratic convention at school at 2 p. m. To be nominated are all state officials as well as local state senator and representatives. The only local contest is Precinct 2 in Lynn where Ode Brewer is opposed by Clarence Williams in commissioner race and in precinct 2 Dawson where A B Furlow and Moody Neeley are in a similar race. Locally there has been little, if any interest in politics this year and voting is expected to be lighter than usual.

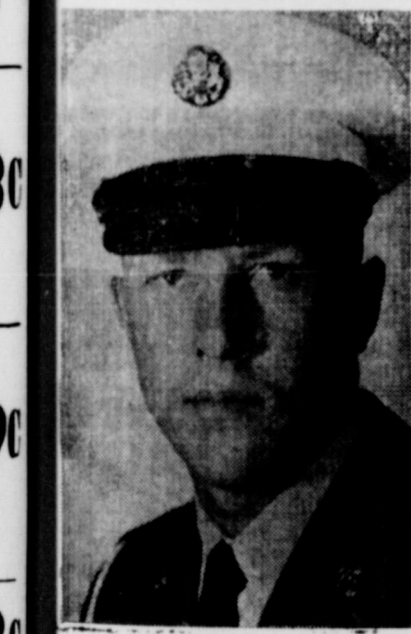

**MEN MAY RETIRE AT 62**

Men. If you are 62 or older, you may be entitled to social security benefits now.

This reminder comes from John G. Hutton, District manager of the Lubbock Social Security Office who explained that, as a result of the 1961 changes in the social security law, it is now possible for men as well as women to draw reduced benefits at age 62. The effective date of the change was August, 1961. When asked if all men should file for benefits at 62, Mr. Hutton pointed out that most men who are over 62 and still working for high earnings would be better off to wait until they are 65 to file for full benefits. He explained that high earnings would prevent payment of reduced benefits.

The primary purpose of this new provision, he stated, was to enable workers who retire between 62 and 65 or workers in this age group whose earnings are low for any num-

ber of reasons to start receiving benefits immediately. This is in line with the basic social security philosophy which is to partially replace lost income as a result of retirement or disability.

Mr. Hutton went on to say that once a man elects reduced payments his benefit rate will remain reduced even after he reaches age 65. However for most men it will be many years before they would lose money by filing early. Most men feel that the immediate income outweighs any possible loss of benefits in the distant future.

Each man has to decide on his choice either to file early or to wait until he is 65. Hutton said that the staff at the Lubbock Social Security Office will be able to give each man detailed information on the amount of benefits he would be able to receive and give other facts to assist men in making their decision. He urged all men under 65 who feel that they may qualify for reduced benefits to come to the office.

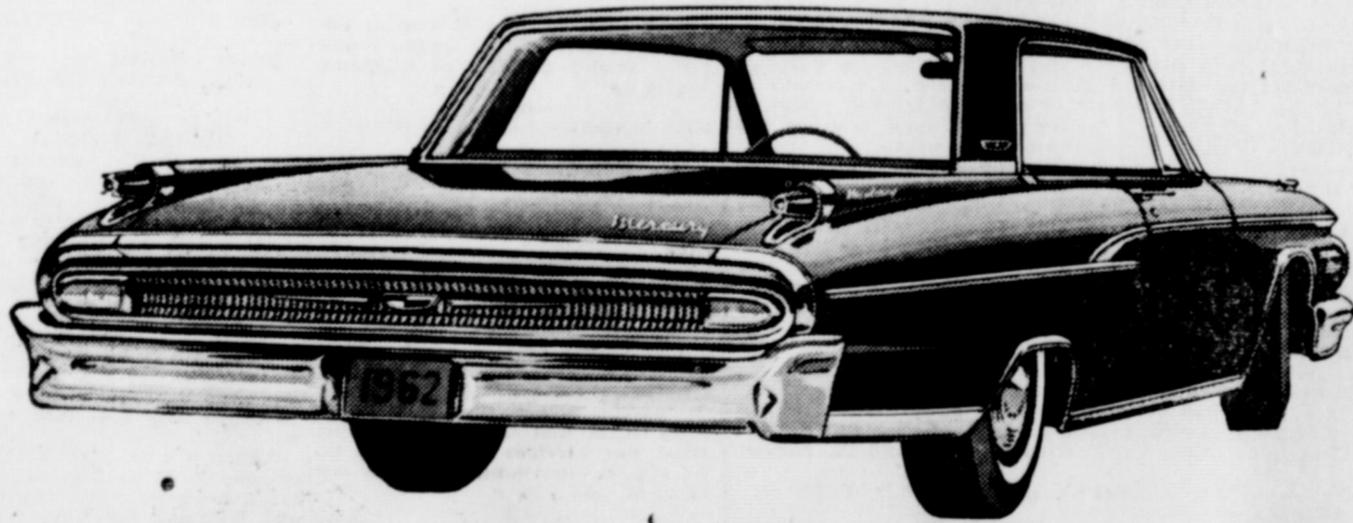

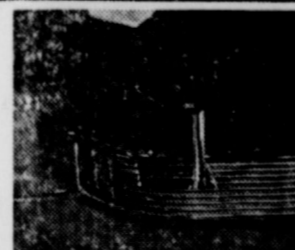

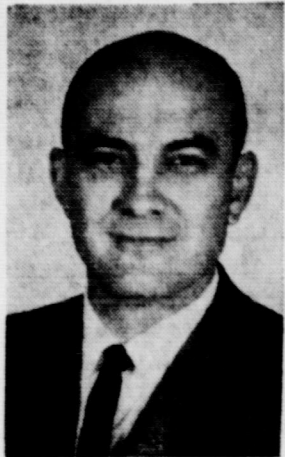

**MEN MAY RETIRE AT 62**

Men, if you are 62 or older, you may be entitled to social security benefits now.

This reminder comes from John G. Hutton, District manager of the Lubbock Social Security Office who explained that, as a result of the 1961 changes in the social security law it is now possible for men as well as women to draw reduced benefits at age 62. The effective date of the change was August, 1961. When asked if all men should file for benefits at 62, Mr. Hutton pointed out that most men who are over 62 and still working for high earnings would be better off to wait until they are 65 to file for full benefits. He explained that high earnings would prevent payment of reduced benefits.

The primary purpose of this new provision, he stated, was to enable workers who retire between 62 and 65 or workers in this age group whose earnings are low for any number of reasons to start receiving benefits immediately. This is in line with the basic social security philosophy which is to partially replace lost income as a result of retirement or disability.

Mr. Hutton went on to say that once a man elects reduced payments, his benefit rate will remain reduced even after he reaches age 65. However, for most men it will be many years before they would lose money by filing early. Most men feel that the immediate income outweighs any possible loss of benefits in the distant future.

Each man has to decide on his choice either to file early or to wait until he is 65. Hutton said that the staff at the Lubbock Social Security Office will be able to give each man detailed information on the amount of benefits he would be able to receive and give other facts to assist men in making their decision. He urged all men under 65 who feel that they may qualify for reduced benefits to come to the office.

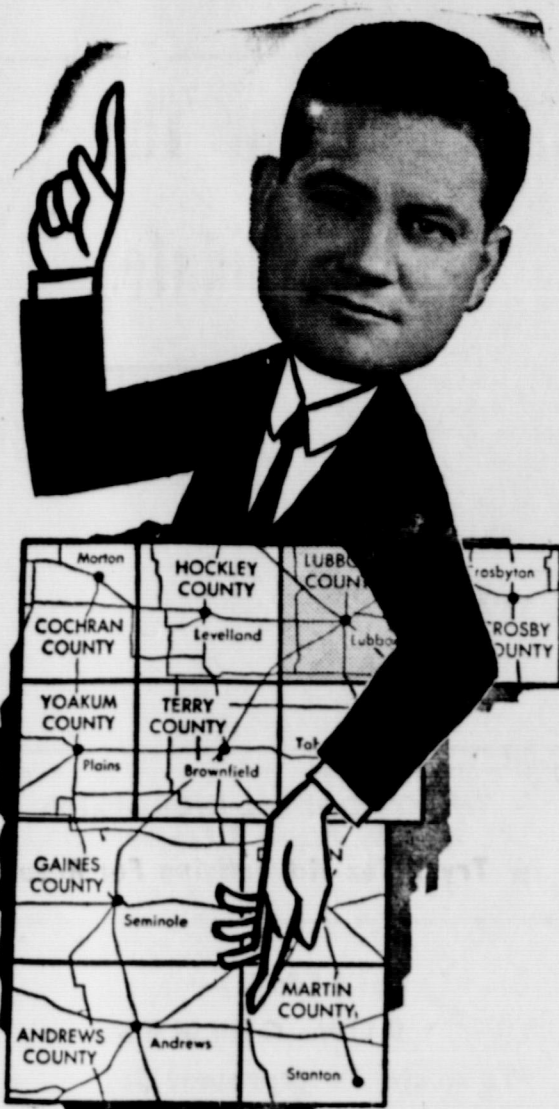

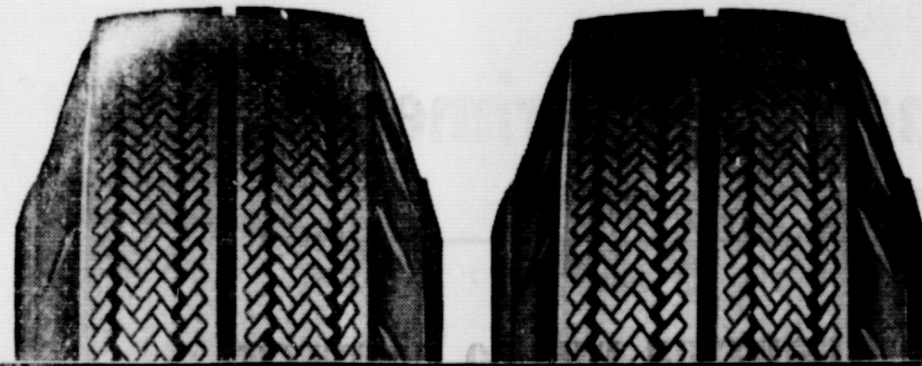
