PARENTS OF BROWNIES AND GIRL SCOUTS TO MEET JAN. 24

A plan which will bring better Scouting to more girls thru the formation of a Girl Scout council in the South Plains section of Texas will be considered by the citizens of O'Donnell on Tuesday, Jan. 24th. A meeting to explain the plan will be held at the high school auditorium at 7:30. The meeting is open to anyone interested, according to Mrs. C. N. Hoffman.

A study committee, made up of representatives from many communities in this section, has been meeting since September to make a plan of work and budget for the proposed council's first year of operation. Mrs. Bill Davis, Mrs. Hoffman and Mrs. J. T. Forbes of O'Donnell served on this committee. "The plan for the new council will bring many advantages to O'Donnell," said Mrs. Paul Burrus, Olton, Chairman of the South Plains Study Committee. "Among them will be the services of a Girl Scout professional staff, training and help for all Girl Scouts volunteers, assistance with troop organizations and registration and opportunities for girls to enjoy adventurous camping experiences thru day, troop and established camps."

Miss Burgess, who has been working with the Study Committee, will be in O'Donnell Tuesday, Jan. 24 to help explain the services of the new council.

Facts For Farmer

Now that the crops are laid by, many farmers are turning their attention toward Federal tax filing time in January, according to John G. Hutton, manager of the Lubbock Social Security Office.

Mr. Hutton explained that many farmers will be required to file two types of tax returns in January, 1956 for the 1955 calendar year: (1) the farmer who is self-employed will be required to file an income tax report and pay his social security tax if net earnings for 1955 are at least \$400 and the gross income is at least \$800 and (2) the farmer who has paid cash wages of \$100 or more to any employee in agricultural labor in 1955 will be required to file a return on Form 943, listing the name and social security account of each such employee.

Mr. Hutton pointed out that employees of the Social Security Administration are not authorized to advise or aid any taxpayer in the preparation of a tax return. He emphasized that such assistance as needed should be secured from the District Director of Internal Revenue or someone who specializes in filing tax returns. However, any question as to benefits payable under the Social Security law will be gladly answered by his office, Mr. Hutton concluded.

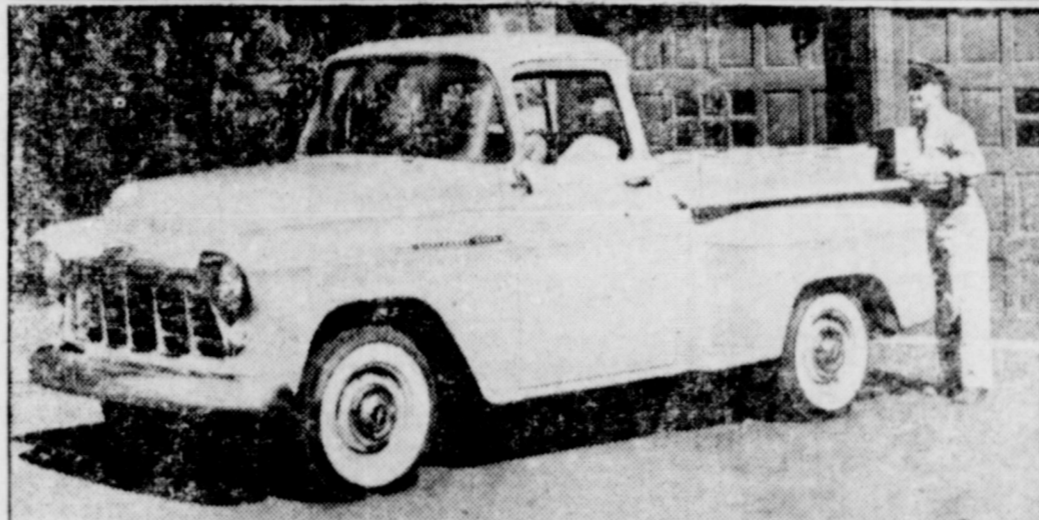

MR. 1956 HAS MANY ADVANTAGES

The 1956 version of the New Year's baby will get more breaks at birth, statistically speaking, than his brother got fifteen years ago, State Health Department statisticians say.

Among other things, his chances of having the advantages of a hospital birth under competent medical care are more than double the chances his brother had in 1940.

Nearly 9 out of 10 babies are born in hospitals nowadays. 15 years ago, 3 out of every 5 babies

and healthy are much improved over the chances his 15 year old brother had, since the infant death rate is less than half the rate in 1940.

The mother of the New Year's baby will be better off too. Her counterpart of 1940 ran a death risk 7 times greater than today's mother runs during the birth process. Improvements in maternal care makes the difference.

And finally, it will be easier for the physician who attends the birth of the New Year's baby to keep up with the details than it was in 1940.

DO IT YOURSELF

Enthusiastic public acceptance of the "do it yourself" taxpayer assistance program has led to its continuance and improvement for income tax filing period beginning Jan. 1, according to John R. Robinson of the Internal Revenue Service office in Lubbock.

Last filing period the Service made a substantial reduction in the cost of rendering individual taxpayer assistance, by encouraging the public to fill out their own tax forms, using the instruction booklet sent thru the mail. Those needing further help were assembled in groups with a tax specialist answering individual questions as each taxpayer filled out his return.

Taxpayers will do themselves and their government a service by preparing and filing their returns early, Mr. Robinson said.

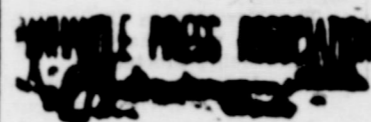

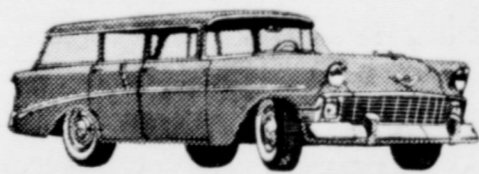

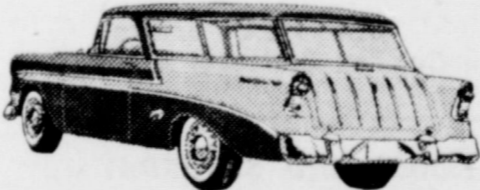
