**NOTICE TO BIDDERS**

Sealed proposals addressed to the Honorable Mayor and City Council of O'Donnell, Texas, will be received at the City Hall, O'Donnell, Texas until 8:00 P. M. November 9, 1961 for furnishing all necessary materials, machinery, equipment, superintendence and labor for constructing certain street improvements for the City of O'Donnell, Texas. Owner consisting of the following approximate quantities: 25,520 linear feet of curb and gutter and 35,000 square yards of street paving (27 blocks).

Bidders must submit a Cashier's or Certified Check issued by a bank satisfactory to the Owner, or a Proposal Bond from a reliable Surety Company, payable without recourse to the order of The City of O'Donnell, Texas, in an amount not less than five percent (5 percent) of the largest possible bid submitted as a guaranty that the Bidder will enter into a contract and execute bonds and guaranty in the forms provided within ten (10) days after notice of award of contract to him. Bids without the required Check or Proposal Bond will not be considered.

The Successful Bidder must furnish a Performance bond and a Payment bond on the forms provided in the amount of 100 percent of the total contract price from a Surety Company holding a permit from the State of Texas to act as Surety or other Sureties acceptable to the Owner.

All lump sum and unit prices must be stated in both script and figures. In cases of ambiguity or lack of clearness in stating the prices in the bids the Owner reserves the right to consider the most advantageous construction thereof or to reject the bid. Unreasonable (or "unbalanced") unit prices will authorize the Owner to reject the bid. The Owner reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive formalities, and to accept the bid which seems most advantageous to the City's interest.

Bidders are expected to inspect the site of the work and to inform themselves regarding all local conditions under which the work is to be done.

Payment for the work performed on this project will be from funds furnished by the City of O'Donnell, Texas and paving assessments against abutting property and the Owners thereof, in accordance with the provisions set forth in the specifications.

Attention is called to the provisions of the Acts of the 43rd Legislature of the State of Texas, page 91, Chapter 45 (Article No. 5159A Civil Statutes 1925) concerning the wage scale and payment of prevailing rates of wages as established by the owner. 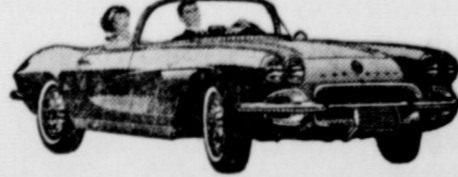

**SOME SCHOOLS TEACHING INCOME TAX REPORTING**

### A New Trick With Chocolate Icebox Cake



**MOST EVERY SMART HOMEMAKER** has a bag of tricks up her sleeve—a few short cuts to good eating—recipes so delicious and so glamorous as to be unrecognizable as short cuts. Here's one that is sure to be a welcome addition—a graham cracker and chocolate refrigerator cake. Sweet cooking chocolate, the delicious secret of so many famous Continental desserts, is used for the filling.

#### GRAHAM CRACKER REFRIGERATOR CAKE

1 package (¼ pound) Dash of salt  
sweet cooking chocolate 2 egg yolks  
1 tablespoon water 1 cup whipping cream  
12 double graham crackers

Melt chocolate in water in saucepan over low heat, stirring constantly. Add salt. Then add egg yolks, one at a time, beating well after each. Cool. Meanwhile, whip cream. Then fold a little of the whipped cream into chocolate mixture. Blend well. Fold in remaining cream, blending well. Chill.

Spread double graham crackers with chilled chocolate mixture and layer 6 together in a loaf; repeat, making 2 loaves. Cover top and sides with remaining chocolate mixture. Chill 8 to 12 hours in refrigerator. Serve in slices. Makes 8 servings.

### Spiderweb Business Proves Profitable In California Town

**YUCAIPA, Calif.**—Such precision devices as gunsights, astronomical instruments and survey instruments require crossed hairs. Mrs. Nan Songer supplies spider webs with which the "hairs" are made.

Her business goes back to her childhood when, because of her frail health, her parents encouraged her to be out-of-doors as much as possible. She became interested in insect life—first moths and butterflies, then crickets, and finally spiders.

By 1939, when 27, she had been experimenting with extracting the silken web from spiders for several years. The government was inquiring whether the web would be produced commercially.

Human hairs had been utilized for years in gunsights, bombsights and periscopes, but were susceptible to extreme temperatures. They contracted and broke in the sub-zero cold of the stratosphere—and sagged in high temperatures. An extremely fine, sturdy and elastic strand was needed—and the spider web was the answer.

Using fine needles, Mrs. Songer draws the silk from one of the spider's spinnerets and reels it on a metal frame for shipment.

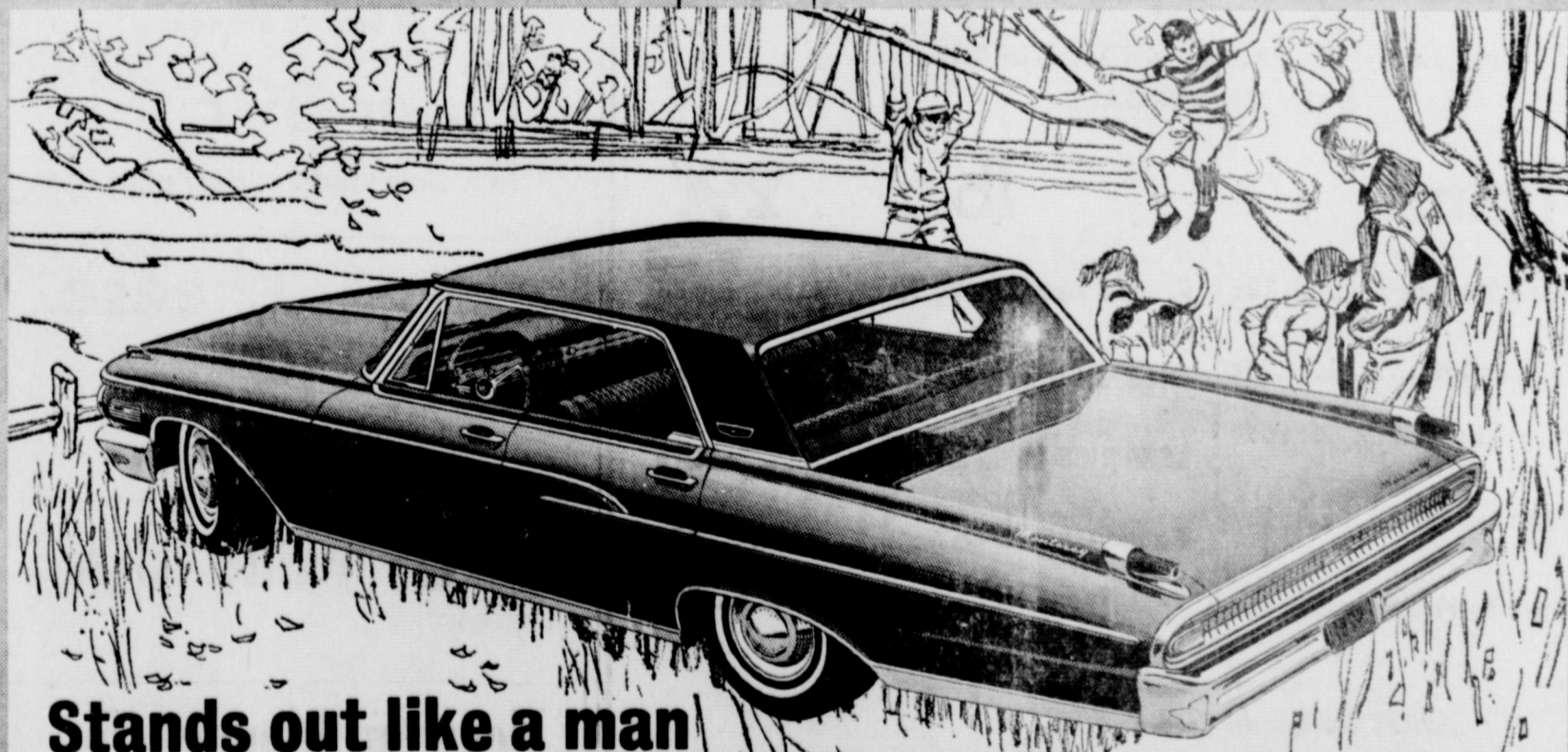
