Few Insects To Date

Weather conditions during the past week have been favorable for fruiting of cotton. Most plantings have good to excellent set of forms. Insect infestations have been light in a majority of fields.

Fleahoppers were reported in light infestations in a 11 counties. Medium infestations were found in some fields in Dawson, Hockly, and Yoakum Counties. Since most cotton has a good set of fruit, the insects are causing little damage in most fields.

Bollworm activity continues light. While scattered eggs and small worms have been found throughout the area, no reported infestations were sufficient to require control. Since increased bollworm activity often follows irrigation in a week to ten days, cotton should be checked for eggs and small worms. Cabbage looper ranging of cotton leaves has been more apparent during the past week. In most fields a majority of the worms were large or had pupated.

Spotted heavy infestations of aphids were present in scattered fields. Lygus bugs were found in small numbers in many fields, but no damaging infestations were reported. False chinch bugs occurred in light infestations on cotton in many fields, but were not reported seriously damaging cotton at the present time.

Postage Goes Up On 1st

For the second time in a quarter century, the cost of mailing a letter has been increased.

Effective August 1, regular letters and first class mail postage will be increased from three cents to four cents for the first ounce or fraction thereof.

The postal rate was boosted on July 1, 1953, making the letter rate rise from two cents to the current three cent price.

Other types of mail will also cost more after the August 1 increase. Postal cards, for instance, will cost three cents instead of two cents, and this same rate applies to letters mailed for local delivery.

First class airmail postal cards will go from four to five cents, and airmail letters will cost seven cents for the first ounce or fraction thereof, as opposed to the current rate of six cents.

Although new denominations of postage stamps are being issued to meet the increased rate it will not be necessary to use the new stamps as long as whatever is being mailed has the correct amount of postage.

Therefore don't throw away all your three cent stamps or the two cent cost cards. Just buy some one cent stamps and stick them on.

Run-off In Clerk's Race

On the South Plains and in Lynn, Dawson and Borden counties, Yarborough and Daniel coasted to easy victories and A. B. Furlow retained his post of Commissioner Pct. 2 in Dawson county 358 to Garvin Randolph's 169. Wesley Roberts of Lamesa carried Andrews, Lynn, Dawson and Gaines counties 6139 to Charles McReynolds 2718 in the 99th Dist. Representative race.

In Lynn county Horace Brunette turned back J. P. White, Sr. in the Justice of Peace race here 297 to 65. C. W. Roberts with 829 votes and Mrs. Wade Holland with 795 votes are in the runoff for county clerk. E. A. Howle received 396 in that race. Woodrow (Ode) Brewer returned as Commissioner Pct. 2 with 348 votes over O. J. Stanley's 1242 votes to Blakeley's 788 votes and Daniel won 1499 votes out of a total of 2926 votes in the governor's race.

Voting on the South Plains was somewhat heavier than at first expected although short of two years ago.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT THE GENERAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 4, 1960

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 26
PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 4, 1960
Section 1. That Section 51a of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended by adding a new subsection to be known as Subsection 51a-1, which shall read as follows:
"Subsection 51a-1. The Legislature shall have the power to provide for the payment of medical care on behalf of needy recipients of Old Age Assistance, Aid to the Blind, or Aid to Dependent Children as provided in Section 51a of Article III and for the Permanent and Totally Disabled as provided in Article III, Section 51b of the Constitution of the State of Texas, providing for direct or vendor payments for medical care on behalf of such recipients, providing that the acceptance of financial aid from the Government of the United States for such payments, providing that the payments for such medical care shall be in addition to the direct assistance to such recipients providing that the amount paid out of State funds shall never exceed the payments out of Federal funds for such purposes; providing for the necessary election, form of ballot, proclamation, and publication.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT THE GENERAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER 4, 1958.

HJR #17—Number 5 on the Ballot.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 4, 1958.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 17 proposing an amendment to Article XX of the Constitution of the State of Texas, by adding thereto a new section to be known as Section 66, to provide that the legislature shall have authority to provide a system of retirement and disability pensions to certain retiring Texas Rangers and their widows; stating the maximum of such pension; and providing a fund from which such pensions may be paid.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. Article XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas, shall be amended by adding thereto a new Section 66, to read as follows:

"Section 66. The Legislature shall have authority to provide for a system of retirement and disability pensions for retiring Texas Rangers who have not been eligible at any time for membership in the Employees Retirement System established by Chapter 352, Acts of the Fifty-fifth Legislature, Regular Session 1957, and who have had as much as two (2) years service as a Texas Ranger, and to their widows; and the amount of such pension shall not exceed \$50 per month to any such Texas Ranger or his widow, provided that such widow was legally married prior to January 1, 1957, to a Texas Ranger qualifying for such pension.

"These pensions may be paid only from the special fund created by Section 17, of Article VII for a payment of pensions for services in the Confederate army and navy, frontier organizations, and the militia of the State of Texas, and for widows of such soldiers serving in said armies, navies, organizations or militia."

Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to the vote of the qualified electors of this State at an election to be held throughout the State on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1958, at which election all ballots shall have printed thereon:

"FOR the Constitutional amendment providing for pension to retired Texas Rangers who are ineligible to participate in the Employees Retirement System of Texas, and their widows."

"AGAINST the Constitutional Amendment providing for pension to retired Texas Rangers who are ineligible to participate in the Employees Retirement System of Texas, and their widows."

Sec. 3. The Governor shall issue the necessary proclamation for said election and have the same published as required by the Constitution and laws of this State.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO BE VOTED ON AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 4, 1958.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 8 proposing an amendment to Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Texas, by adding thereto a new section to be known as Section 5, to provide that the legislature may authorize the creation of a Hospital District coextensive with the incorporated limits of the City of Amarillo, Texas; authorizing the County of Potter to render financial aid to and participate in the operation of such Hospital District; authorizing the Commissioners Court of said county to assess and levy taxes on property outside the incorporated limits of such city; further authorizing a countywide Hospital District for Wichita County, Texas, and authorizing the creation of two districts in Jefferson County; and further providing that any enabling Act shall not be invalid because of their anticipatory character.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Article IX of the Constitution of the State of Texas be, and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto another section to be designated as Section 5, which shall read as follows:

"Section 5 (a) The Legislature may by law authorize the creation of two hospital districts, one to be coextensive with and have the same boundaries as the incorporated City of Amarillo, as such boundaries now exist or as they may hereafter be lawfully extended, and the other to be coextensive with Wichita County.

"If such district or districts are created, they may be authorized to levy a tax not to exceed Seventy-five Cents (75c) on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) valuation of taxable property within the district; provided, however, no tax may be levied until approved by a majority vote of the participating resident qualified property taxpaying voters who have duly rendered their property for taxation. The maximum rate of tax may be changed at subsequent elections so long as obligations are not impaired, and not to exceed the maximum limit of Seventy-five Cents (75c) per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) valuation, and no election shall be required by subsequent changes in the boundaries of the City of Amarillo.

"If such tax is authorized, no political subdivision or municipality within or having the same boundaries as the district may levy a tax for medical or hospital care for needy individuals, nor shall they maintain or erect hospital buildings, but the district shall by resolution assume all such responsibilities and shall assume all of the liabilities and obligations (including bonds and warrants) of such subdivisions or municipalities or both. The hospital tax rate submitted shall be sufficient to discharge such obligations, liabilities, and reimbursements, and to operate and maintain the hospital system, and the Legislature may authorize the district to issue tax bonds for the purpose of the purchase, construction, acquisition, repair or renovation of improvements, and equipment of the same, and such bonds shall be payable from said Seventy-five Cents (75c) tax. The Legislature shall provide for transfer of title to properties to the district.

"The Legislature may by law permit the County of Potter (in which the City of Amarillo is partially located) to render financial aid to that district by paying a part of the expenses of operating and maintaining the system and paying a part of the debts of the district (whether assumed or created by the district) and may authorize the levy of a tax not to exceed Ten Cents (10c) per One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) valuation (in addition to other taxes permitted by this Constitution) upon all property within the county but without the City of Amarillo at the time such levy is made for such purposes. If such tax is authorized, the district shall by resolution assume the responsibilities, obligations, and liabilities of the county in the manner and to the extent hereinabove provided for political subdivisions having boundaries coextensive with the district, and the county shall not thereafter levy taxes (other than herein provided) for hospital purposes nor for providing hospital care for needy individuals of the county.

"(c) The Legislature may by law authorize the creation of a hospital district within Jefferson County, the boundaries of which shall include only the resident property taxpaying voters voting in County Drainage District No. 7 and the Port Arthur Independent School District, as such district existed on the first day of January, 1957, with the power to issue bonds for the sole purpose of purchasing a site for, and the construction and initial equipping of, a hospital system, and with the power to levy a tax not to exceed Seventy-five Cents (75c) on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) valuation of property for the purpose of paying the principal and interest on such bonds.

"The creation of such hospital district shall not be final until approved at an election by a majority of the resident property taxpaying voters voting at said election who have duly rendered their property for taxation upon the tax rolls of either said Drainage District or said School District, nor shall

such bonds be issued or such tax be levied until so approved by such voters.

"The district shall not have the power to levy any tax for maintenance or operation of the hospital or facilities, but shall contract with other political subdivisions of the state or private individuals, associations, or corporations for such purposes.

"If the district hereinabove authorized is finally created, no hospital district may be created embracing any part of the territory within its boundaries, but the Legislature by law may authorize the creation of a hospital district incorporating therein the remainder of Jefferson County, having the powers and duties and with the limitations presently provided by Article IX, Section 4, of the Constitution of Texas, except that such district shall be confirmed at an election wherein the resident qualified property taxpaying voters who have duly rendered their property within such proposed district for taxation on the county rolls, shall be authorized to vote. A majority of those participating in the election voting in favor of the district shall be necessary for its confirmation and for bonds to be issued.

"(d) Should the Legislature enact enabling laws in anticipation of the adoption of this amendment, such Acts shall not be invalid because of their anticipatory character."

Sec. 2. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at the general election to be held the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, 1958, at which election all ballots shall have printed thereon:

"FOR the constitutional amendment authorizing the Legislature to create a Hospital District coextensive with the incorporated limits of the City of Amarillo, Texas, and authorizing Potter County to lend financial aid to and participate in the operation of said Hospital District, and further authorizing the Legislature to create a countywide Hospital District in Wichita County, Texas, and Hospital Districts in Jefferson County, Texas."

"AGAINST the constitutional amendment authorizing the Legislature to create a Hospital District coextensive with the incorporated limits of the City of Amarillo, Texas, and authorizing Potter County to lend financial aid to and participate in the operation of said Hospital District, and further authorizing the Legislature to create a countywide Hospital District in Wichita County, Texas, and Hospital Districts in Jefferson County, Texas."

Sec. 3. The Governor shall issue the necessary proclamation for said election and have the same published as required by the constitution and laws of this state.
