Few Insects To Date -0-

conditons during the Weather past week have been favorable for fruiting of cotton. Most plantings have good to excellent set of forms. Insect infestations have been light ina majority of fields.

Fleahoppers were reported in light infestations in a 11 counties. Medium infestations were found in some fields in Dawson, Hockly, and Yoakum Counties. Since most cot-ton has a good set of fruit, the insects are causing little damage in most fields.

Bollworm activity continues light. While scattered eggs and small worms have been found through-out the area, no reported infestations were sufficient to require control. Since increased bollworm act-ivity often follows irrigation in a week to ten days, cotton should be checked for eggs and small rorms. Cabbage looper ragging of cotton leaves has been more apparent during the past week. In most fields a majority of the worms were large or had pupated.

Spotted heavy infestations of ap-hids were present inscattered fields. Lygus bugs were found in small numbers in many fields, but no damaging infestations were reported. False chinch bugs occurred in light infestations on cotton in many fields. but were not reported seriously camaging cotton at the pres-

J. O. Caswell at Lake Thomas. -000 Postage Goes Up On 1st

-0-For the second time in a quarter century, the cost of mailing a letter has been increased.

Effective August 1, regular letters and first class mail postage will be increased from three cents to four cents for the first ounce or fraction thereof. The postal rate was boosted on

July 1, 1933, making the letter rate rase from two cents to the current three cent price. Other types of mail will also cost more after the August 1 increase.

Postal cards, for instance, cost three cents instead of two cents, and this same rate applies to letters mailed for local delivery. First class airmail postal cards will go from four to five cents, and

airmail letters will cost seven cents for the first ounce or faction thereof, as opposed to the current rate of six cents. Although new denominations of

postape stamps are being issued to meet the increased rate it will not be necessary to use the new stamps as long as whatever is being mailed has the correct amount of postage. Therefore don't throw away all c e n t. stamps and stick them on. grandchildren.
