#### S. S. News Given McDonald, A L Loper, John Johns

'Our latest local figures show that the great majority of fulltime workers retire because they are in ill health or because they have lost their jobs. Few people in the South Plains area are retiring from fulltime work just to collect social security payments," John G. Hutton, manager of the Lubbock social se-curity district office said today.

Under the Social Security Act persons who continue working and earning over \$1200 per year are not eligible to receive their full soc-ial security benefits. Since in almost every case a person's income is sharply reduced when he retires, social security benifits where disigned to partially replaced this lost ncome. When the law was passed it was though better to pay more adequate benefits to those whose income.

working days were over than ' to spread the money thinner by also paying benefits to men over 65, or to women over 62, who were still working and who had suffered no substantial loss of income.

Mr. Hutton reminded those who intend to work part time after ap-plying for old-age insurance benefits to get full information at their nearest social security office as to howtheir earnings might affect their benefits. Substantial earnings could mean the loss of some if not all their benefits. However, after one reaches age 72 there is no longer any restriction upon his earnings. This is particulary important to the self-employed, many of whom never retire and who otherwise might never receive any re-turn on their contributions.

'The retirement test is part of the basic philosophy of social in-surance" Mr. Hutton concluded. "as it not only prevents excessive drains on the old-age and survivors insurance trust fund but also serves to guarantee that those most likely to need some replacement of lost income receive it."



# To Prevent Trouble . . .

A wise map once said. "Who would not give a trifle to prevent what he would give a thousand worlds to cure."

This study cost approximately \$50,000. Today there are about 5,0 00 blind childern in the U. S. who are victims of retrolental fibroplasia. Each child will cost an estimat-ed \$100,000 each for education training and support from birth to death-or a grand total of \$500 million.

of the Social Security Office de-clared today that if a long-disabled worker is now over age 50, it is important that he file his application for disability payments as soon as possible, and before January 1, 19 8, so that h will not lose any monthly benefit paymnts. When an ap-plication is filed before January 1, 1958, payments can begin with the month of July, 1957. Disabled workers who apply in January, 19 58, or later, will not be paid bene-fits for months before the date of their applications. In no rase is the worker entitaled to disability pay-ments until he has been disabled for at least 6 months, and in all cases he must fulfill the work re-quirment of 5 years out of the immediate 10 years before he became disabled and a year and half out of the last three years before he ben disabled.

Br recent Congressional action. the long-disabled worker now has another 6 months until June30, 19 58, to file an application and still have his social security earnings record protected by freeze as of the date he actually became disabled.

This 'freeze' protects a worker's social security earnings record, when he is unable to work because of a severe and long-lasting disability but does not pay benefits until age 50.

Hutton pointed out that the law now permits a veteran to receive compensation from the Veterans Administration for service connected disabilited without any reduction in the amount of his dis-

ability insurance benefits under social security. This change, signidisabled for some years and to those with service-connected disability, became effective when President Eisenhower signed Public
