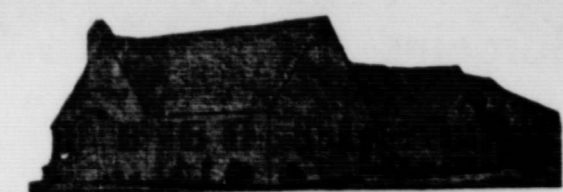

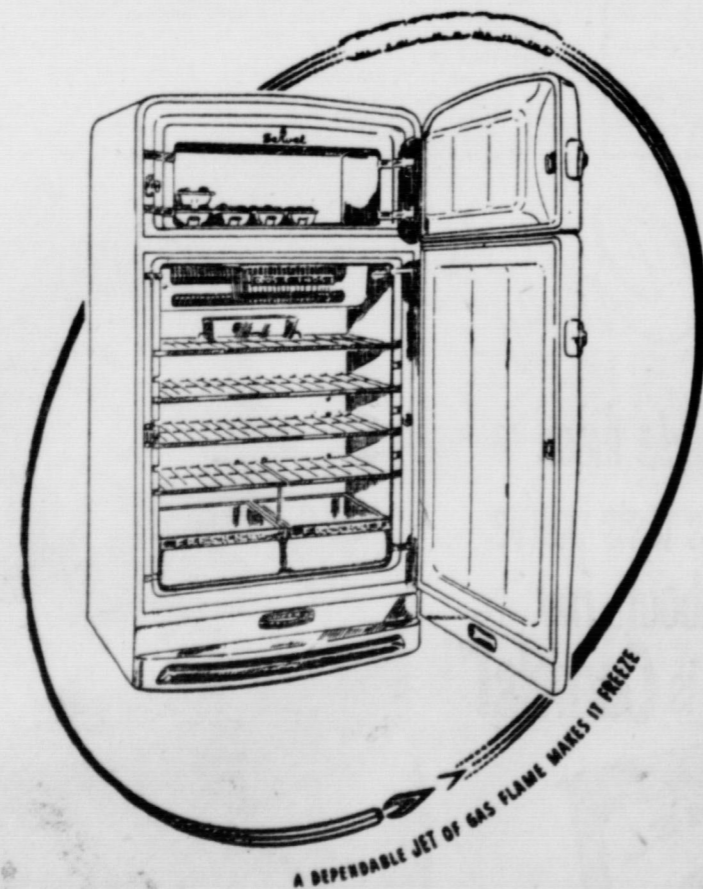

New Burley Strains Are Almost Free of Wildfire

New strains of burley tobacco that are almost immune to wildfire, one of the most destructive diseases of the crop, have been created by an agriculture department plant scientist.

The strains also have a lower nicotine content. This, too, is a major advance, because nicotine in present day burley—used principally in blended cigarettes—is higher than is desired.

A third point about the new plants is that they seem to be a little more vigorous in growth than other lines.

But it will be two or three years before growers have these plants, because they must be improved and selected for local conditions before they are released.

The man who originated the new strains is Dr. E. E. Clayton. He developed the wildfire resistance in the new lines from a wild species. The new line was developed after a systematic study of several hundred wild species during the last 15 years.

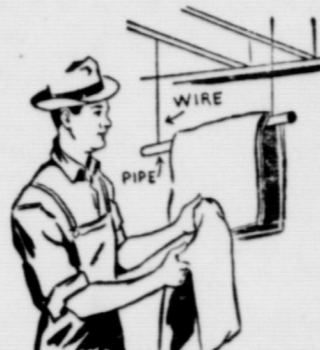
Starter Fertilizing Insufficient for Crop Use of Fertilizer Alone Won't Build Corn Yields

One reason why some farmers swear at and not by fertilizer, is that they don't use enough plant food, the middle west soil improvement committee points out.

Adding a small amount of "starter" fertilizer at planting time may get corn off to a quick start. But scanty applications often fail to

provide sufficient nourishment to carry the crop through the season on low fertility soils.

Without a reserve of plant food in the soil, the corn crop will starve in midsummer and not have enough nourishment to make ears.

The use of fertilizer alone will build corn yields on most farms. But for maximum yields, the farmer needs to build the soil's tilth structure and organic matter supply.

When well-fertilized deep-rooted legumes are grown regularly in the rotation, the soil is mellowed and conditioned for high corn yields. There are extra reserves of crop-feeding organic matter available.

Iowa Factories in 1950 Outproduced Iowa Farms

For the first time in 11 years, Iowa factories outproduced Iowa farms.

As of January it was estimated that Iowa factories turned out 2 1/2 billion dollars' worth of food products, machinery, chemicals, drugs, printed matter and other goods. Sales of farm products in 1950 were estimated at more than \$2 billion, but no estimate was as high as \$2 1/2 billion, even including the value of produce eaten and used on the farm.

Factory products frequently nosed farm products out of the number one spot in Iowa's economy between 1924 and 1939, although it usually was a close race.

In 1924, for instance, cash receipts from farm marketings totaled \$666,533,000 and manufactured products sold for \$685,276,088.

Farm production is expected to increase in Iowa during 1951, as elsewhere in the nation, but with the increased rearmament program in full swing, factory production will also increase.

Farmers Are Warned About Use of Poisons Respirators Advised For Dusting Operations

This summer American farmers and gardeners will use about 1,000,000,000 pounds of bug-killing materials, much of it containing parathion, especially those highly effective on the destructive leaf aphid.

Insecticides containing parathion are used a great deal by commercial fruit producers.

Now produced by several chemical companies, parathion in its original state is a brownish liquid. But as a commercial insecticide it



Respirators should always be worn when handling parathion-base insecticides. Protective rubber gloves also should be used since the toxic chemical can be absorbed through the skin.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 23 proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Texas by adding to Article XVI thereof a new Section to be numbered 63, and authorizing the Legislature to provide for a statewide system of retirement and disability pensions for appointive officers and employees of the several counties of this State; providing that participation therein by counties shall be voluntary; and authorized by the qualified voters of such county; and providing that the administration of said system may be committed to the same body set up to administer the statewide municipal retirement system authorized under Section 51f of Article III, providing for the calling of an election and the publication and issuance of the proclamation therefor.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Article XVI of the Constitution of the State of Texas, be amended by adding thereto a new Section, to be numbered Section 63, which shall read as follows: "Section 63. The Legislature shall have the authority to provide for a statewide system of retirement and disability pensions for appointive officers and employees of the counties of this State under such a plan and provided that the Legislature shall not be authorized to make an appropriation for any retirement or disability benefits authorized committed to the same body set up to administer the municipal retirement system provided for by Section 51f of Article III."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to the qualified voters of this State on the second Tuesday in November, 1951, and shall be held throughout this State on the second Tuesday in November, 1951, and at said election the ballots shall have printed thereon the words:

"FOR the Constitutional Amendment authorizing a statewide system for retirement and disability pensions for appointive county officials and employees," and "AGAINST the Constitutional Amendment authorizing a statewide system for retirement and disability pensions for appointive county officials and employees."

Each voter shall strike out one of said classes on his ballot, leaving the one unmarked which expresses his vote upon the proposed Amendment.

Sec. 3. The Governor of the State of Texas shall issue the necessary proclamation for said election, and shall have the foregoing proposed Amendment published as required by the Constitution for proposed amendments thereto.

Sec. 4. If at said election, a majority of the votes are "FOR the Constitutional Amendment authorizing a statewide system for retirement and disability pensions for appointive county officials and employees" the foregoing proposed Amendment shall become Section 63 of Article XVI of the Constitution of Texas, and the proclamation shall be made by the Governor thereof.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas amending Section 51a, providing that the Legislature shall have the power to provide for the payment of assistance to aged persons over the age of sixteen years, needy blind persons over the age of sixteen (16) years; needy children under the age of sixteen (16) years; and needy persons over the age of sixteen (16) years, upon expenditures for such purposes not exceeding the sum of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) per annum; providing a maximum of Thirty Dollars (\$30) per month for assistance for aged persons; providing for the payment of assistance after the payment of the Union Tax; providing that of such from State funds shall not exceed the amount of Federal funds for the necessary election, and providing for the form of ballot, proclamation, and certificate.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

Section 1. That Section 51a of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended, and the same be amended that the same shall hereafter read as follows: "Section 51a. The Legislature shall have the power, by general law, to provide, subject to the limitations and restrictions herein, and such other limitations, restrictions and conditions as may be deemed expedient for assistance to the payment of assistance to:

(1) Needy aged persons who are over the age of sixty-five (65) years; provided such assistance shall be paid to any State-supported institution, inmate, and provided that no person shall be eligible who has resided in the State of Texas for one (1) year immediately preceding the filing of the application; provided that the payment per month from State funds shall not exceed the sum of Thirty Dollars (\$30);

"Any applicant for assistance shall include the spouse in each case shall dispose of any property prior to the date of application, ineligible to receive assistance; provided that the payment per month from State funds shall not exceed the sum of Thirty Dollars (\$30);

(2) Needy blind persons who are over the age of sixteen (16) years; provided such assistance shall be paid to any State-supported institution, inmate; and provided that no person shall be eligible who has resided in the State for one (1) year immediately preceding the filing of the application for such assistance; or, if under the age of one (1) year, or other relative with whom the applicant resides in the State for one (1) year immediately preceding the filing of the application; provided that the payment per month from State funds shall not exceed the sum of Thirty Dollars (\$30);

(3) Needy children who are over the age of sixteen (16) years; provided that if otherwise eligible, may not be eligible to receive assistance; provided that the payment per month from State funds shall not exceed the sum of Thirty Dollars (\$30);

"Should the Legislature enact any law providing for the payment of assistance to aged persons, or to needy blind persons, or to needy children, such law shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of this section; provided, however, that the amount of Federal funds available for such purposes shall not exceed the amount of State funds available for such purposes; provided that the total amount of State funds available for such purposes shall not exceed the sum of Forty-two Million Dollars (\$42,000,000) per annum."

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to the qualified voters of this State on the second Tuesday in November, 1951, and shall be held throughout this State on the second Tuesday in November, 1951, and at said election the ballots shall have printed thereon the words:

"FOR the Constitutional Amendment authorizing a statewide system for retirement and disability pensions for appointive county officials and employees," and "AGAINST the Constitutional Amendment authorizing a statewide system for retirement and disability pensions for appointive county officials and employees."

Farming Notes

Texas Jersey cattle breeders last year ranked at the top or near there in 3 different categories according to information released by the American Jersey Cattle Club.

A skin burn from anhydrous ammonia should be washed immediately with water and then treated as an ordinary burn.

Farmers who use anhydrous ammonia are urged to be on the alert for hazards that might cause accidents. If this new source of nitrogen is handled properly and the right kind of equipment is used, it is no more dangerous to store and apply than the hazards that go with many other farm operations.

Surveys made among farm families in which farm accidents have occurred show that many of the serious accidents happen during the last working hours of the day. This indicates that fatigue is a contributing cause of farm accidents and farm workers thus are urged to be even more careful when they become tired.

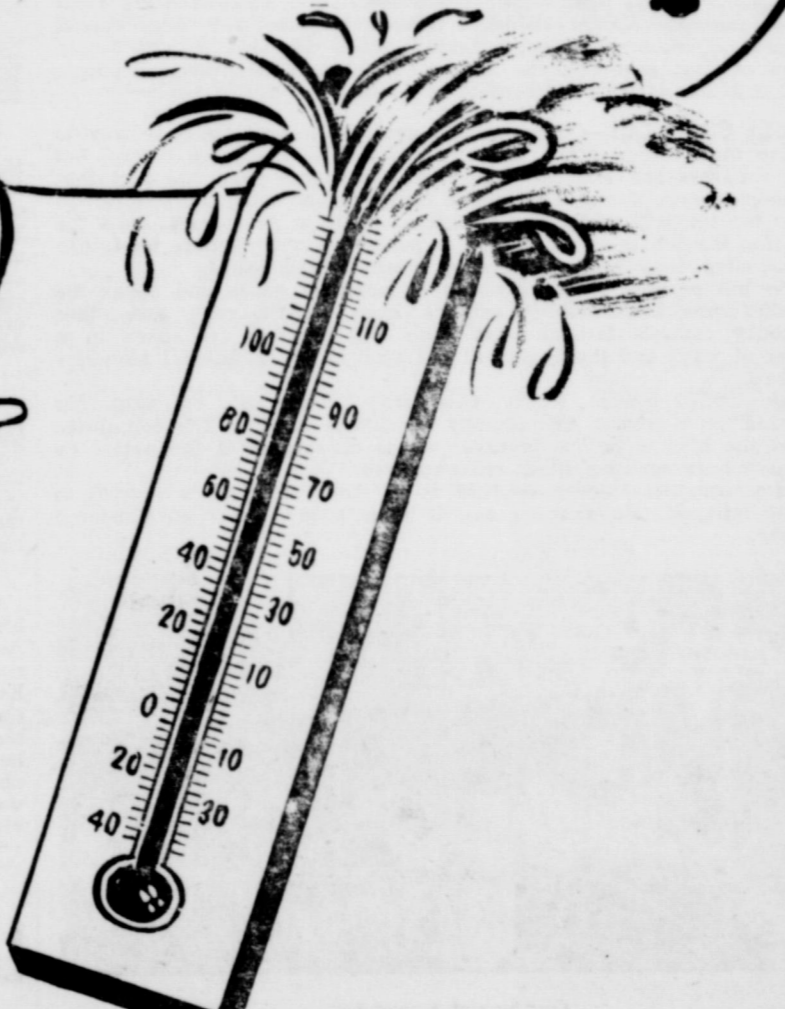
