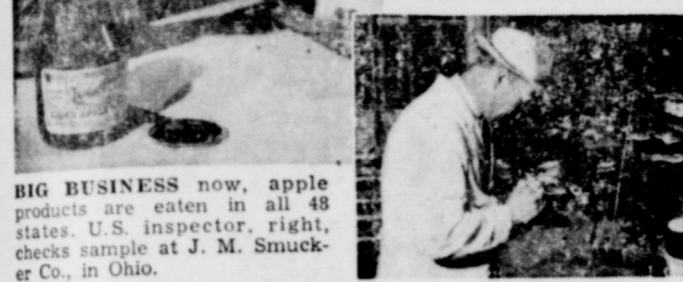

## Records Smashed in Shell Output

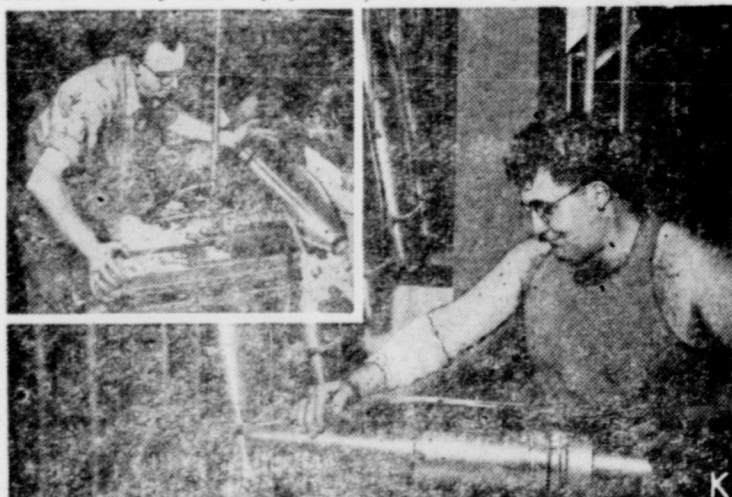
In January, 1953, the Philadelphia Ordnance District awarded the American Car and Foundry Company a sizeable contract for eight-inch howitzer shells. Normally, it takes about a year, starting from scratch, to get into production. Instead, the first shells were produced in May, in about four months' time.

ACF shellmakers who gained experience in heavy-caliber shell production during two world wars knew exactly what had to be done to get rolling as quickly as possible.

Some of these men had set up production lines to make British eight-inch shells during World War I. Others had gained considerable experience producing eight-inch and 240 mm howitzer shells at ACF's Buffalo plant during the last war. They knew what materials and machines were needed—and how to make the best of heavily-used equipment.

Every possible short cut was taken; construction continued as the machines were embedded in cement floors.

Within four months the first line was set, even though walls and roofs were still going up. On May 5, 1953, the first shell was forged and machined. By July, finished shells were pouring out of the plant as fast as cans of food from a processing plant.
