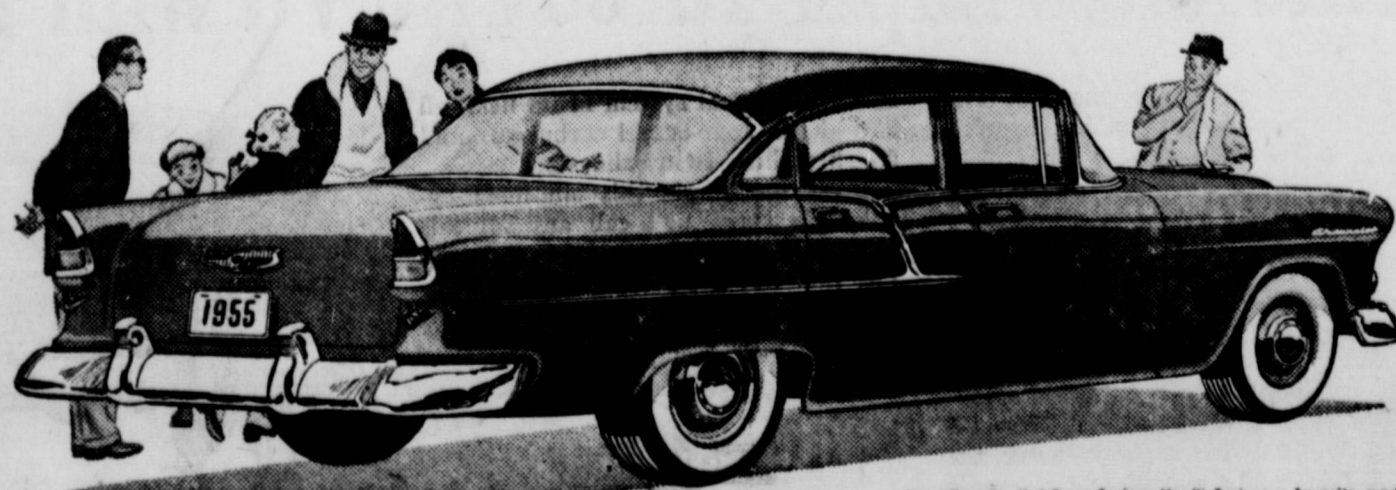

### Heir Shoots Up Town With Cap Pistols

BRIGANTINE, N. J.—Heir to the Heinz pickle fortune, John Lapore Given, Jr., was given the heave-ho by this New Jersey town recently for shooting cap pistols.

Given was ordered by Magistrate Robert Peacock either to leave Brigantine or go to jail on a disorderly conduct charge brought by Mr. and Mrs. Robert Born, the defendant's neighbors.

The Borns said Mr. Given had been invited to their home to take pictures of their daughter's birthday celebration. An argument started, they testified, and he went home, got five toy pistols, loaded them with blanks and shot them off around the Born home. He was accused also of using abusive language.

Given left town just five minutes before the deadline. Before leaving, he expressed some complimentary remarks about the town's hospitality.

Mr. Given said he was the grandson of the late H. J. Heinz, and was an heir to some \$23,000,000 left by the pickle magnate. A spokesman for the concern said Mr. Given took no part in operating the company.

### Pickle Queen

Lives Near N. Y. Town  
PALANTINE BRIDGE, N. Y.—The pickle queen of the Mohawk Valley is Mrs. Ada Nellis.

The 13-room house, 100 years old, where Mrs. Nellis lives, has been her home since she went there, a bride of a farmer, 51 years ago. Then the Nellis place was a 100-acre dairy farm, but since Mr. Nellis' death, the land has been sold and Mrs. Nellis has turned her house into a boarding home for elderly people.

Still she makes pickles as in the old days, to serve on her own table, to donate to the church bazaars and to donation sales, to give as presents at Christmas, to help stock the shelves of her four married children. Not one of her three daughters, and they would tell you so themselves, can make pickles half as good as their mother can. It's Bonnie Lee, 10, who lives with Great Grandma, who's going to be a pickle-maker of the old school. Each summer she helps with the pickling.

### Planetarium Shows Complex Universe

PHILADELPHIA — The Fels Planetarium show, "Hurling Through Space", shows just how many and how complex the motions of the earth really are.

There are many excellent and graphic ways to prove the rotation of the earth. There is the Foucault pendulum. There is the centrifugal effects of the earth's rotation, which accounts for the uphill flow of the Mississippi River, and there is the apparent rotation of the heavens.

The first proof of the earth's rotation was furnished in 1679 when the English physicist Hooke verified a prediction made by Sir Isaac Newton. Newton held that, if the earth rotates, a body on its surface will not be traveling as fast as a body in the top of a high tower, for the latter body will be farther from the axis of rotation.

He computed that at the equator a ball dropped from a 400-foot tower will land more than 1 1/2 inches east of the point where it would have fallen if the earth were not rotating.

This rotation of the earth produces other effects as well. The Earth is not spherical but has an "equatorial bulge", just like people. That equatorial bulge makes the axis of the Earth wobble, so that the north pole is not always pointed to the same part of the sky. Because of this slow change, in about 14,000 years the bright star Vega will be the pole star, instead of the present Polaris.

### Chicago Cubs Make Smalltown Fan Happy

RIVER FOREST, Ill.—Underweight, 10-year-old "Half Pint" Dave Picket, who has a weak heart, is the proudest kid in town.

He is the mascot and bat boy of the State Bank Nine, one of the four Little League baseball teams in this Illinois township. Dave is boasting these days about going up to Chicago as the guest of the Chicago Cubs, the big league team which is his idol in the sports world.

He had a strong yearning to play baseball, a life's ambition that he inherited from his father, Larry Picket, employee of a local hardware company.

Half Pint's ambition is to grow up and be a player for the Cubs.

But Dave isn't physically built for baseball. He has a congenital heart condition which has slowed his growth and makes him tire easily. The best he could do when the Little League teams were formed here was to hold down a position as bat boy. He sadly put on the "1/2" numeral, denoting that he was not an active player.

One day he wrote to Cubs Manager Phil Cavaretta for an autograph. With the autograph from Cavaretta came an invitation to Dave and his mother to be guests of the Cubs in box seats near the out.

## Chenettes Make Music For Town Park

BIGLERVILLE, Pa.—There's a Mardi Gras air today in this thriving little community, not far from historic Gettysburg. And it's the women of the town who are responsible.

The girls have banded together to form the novel Biglerville Kitchenettes, members of which use all manner of kitchen utensils to produce music.

### Community Betterment

The 40 members of the band have one sole aim—community betterment. Right now, the town needs a new playground or a public park.

While the serenade is going on, non-playing girls pass bread-baskets and tureens among the audience, wheedling and cajoling contributions from the delighted audience. This money, quite logically, is transferred into a tremendous kitchen pot. To date, the Kitchenettes have raised the level of the pot to a hefty \$3,000—more than enough, they figure, to purchase the land for Biglerville's newest play area.

Famed writers, painters and other civic-minded persons, intrigued by the Biglerville project, have contributed valuable items.

Last Spring, the Kitchenettes undertook to present a musical performance based on the various seasons of the year and the seasons' effect on apple-growing, one of Adams County's principal sources of income.

The play was so popular that it played to standees for three consecutive nights—quite a pat on the back for the Kitchenettes' talents, for Biglerville has a population of 890 and the town auditorium seats 700. Receipts totaled \$800.

Another unique custom of the Kitchenettes is the serenading of brides and grooms, often after the newlywed pair returns from the wedding trip.

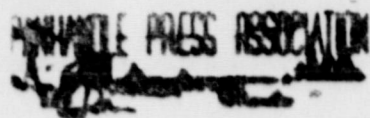

A hen that lays 250 eggs a year eats only 25 to 26 pounds of feed more than one that lays no eggs. There's no profit in feeding non-producers.

Detailed information on maintaining quality in stored grain is offered in a new publication just released by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service. Ask your local county agent for copy of L-233.

Chiggers may not cause a lot of damage but they can take the pleasure out of picnics and out-of-door activities. A pound of five percent dust of either chlordane or toxaphene applied to 1,000 square feet of lawn will control the pests for a week.

Eggs having off-color yolks usually can be traced to hens fed cottonseed products. Such eggs are appearing in Texas retail markets and are objectionable to consumers. Most cases of such yolks are traced to hens having access to cattle or hog feeding operations where a cottonseed product is being fed or hens may be eating cottonseed of cottonseed hulls used as nesting litter.

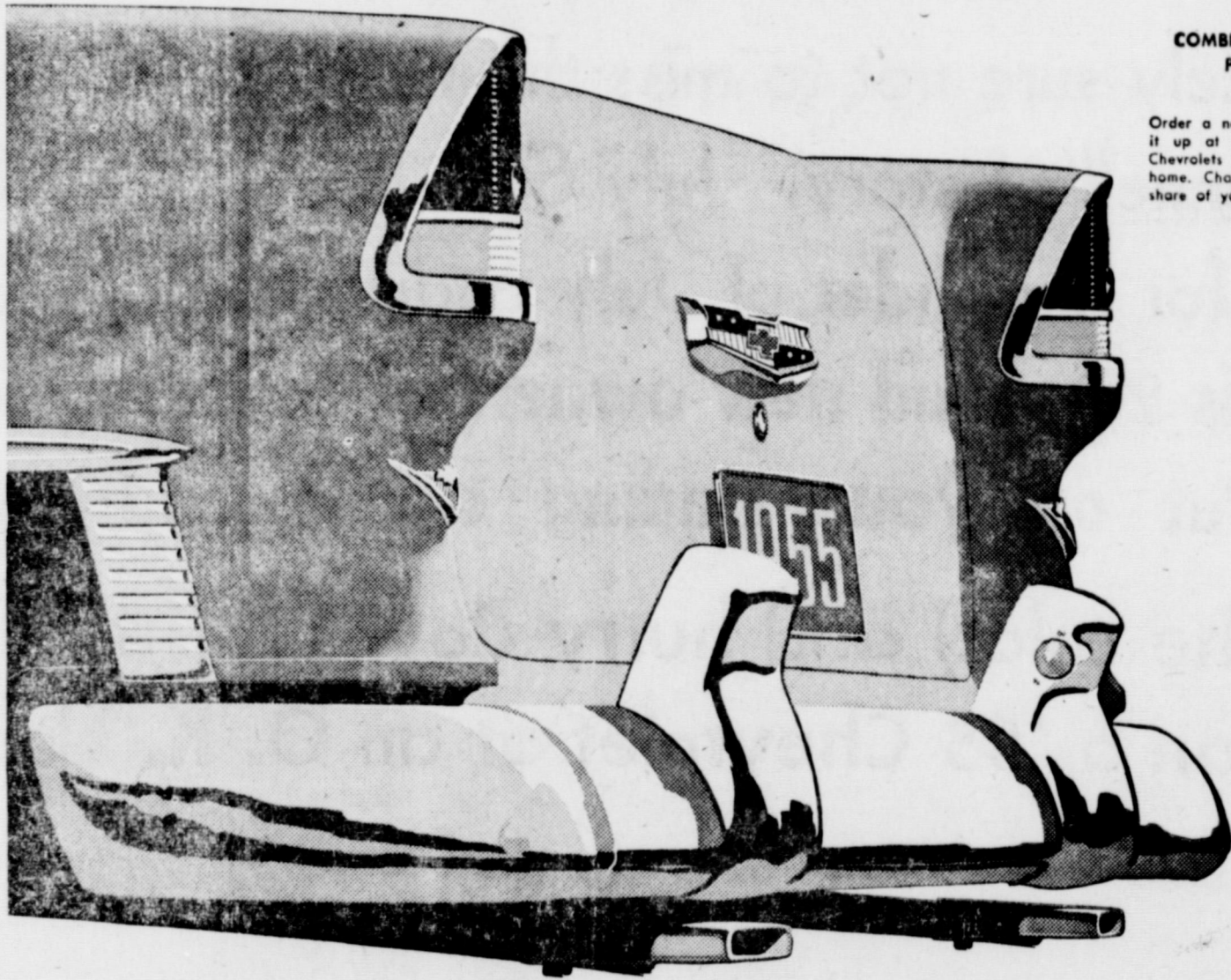

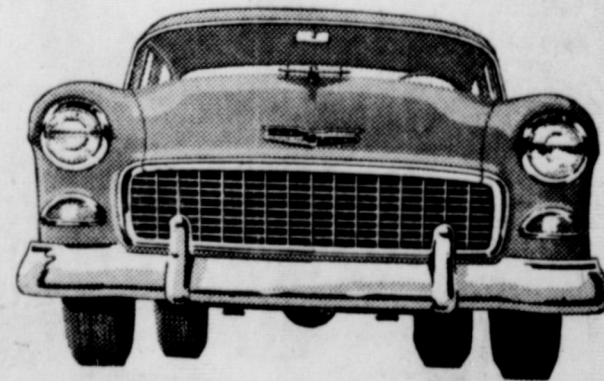

Each artist also holds classes in his own medium and students can learn the art of jewelry making, or take a sketching class with a professional model, or "throw" a vase on the electric wheel.

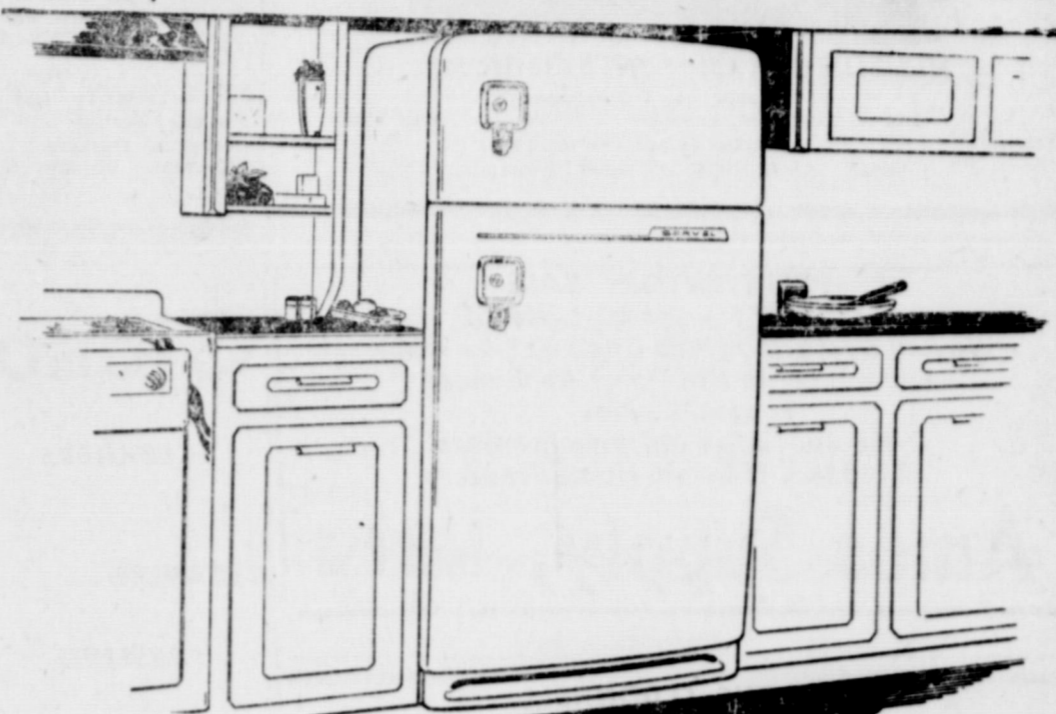
