Konczak, who is retired from Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, was a Park Superintendent of Confederate the **Reunion Grounds State** Historical Park as well as several other Historical Parks during his career. He has authored three books and numerous articles and is currently working on a regimental history of the 24 Arkansas Infantry in which his Great-Great-Grandfather served. He is a member of the Callahan County Historical Society, Sons of Confederate Veterans, the Association of Professional Naturalists, West Texas Historical Society, and several other professional associations.

The Participants will spend Saturday morning in closed sessions discussing selected topics including "Artifacts and Manuscripts", "Military History of the Civil War", " Confederate Symbols", and "Texas in the War". The diverse make-up of the attendees should allow for spirited and productive debate on this controversial issue. 


