## Want To Prohibit Sale Of Fireworks July 4

AUSTIN, June 26.—It is pretty grim patriotism to kill and injure Texans on a holiday celebrating our independence Marvill Hall, state fire insurance commissioner, reminded today as he issued a plea to city officials to adopt emergency measures banning the promiscuous sale and use of fireworks in all forms on the Fourth of July.

"We must not make it easy for the saboteur to gain possession of quantities of explosive material," the Commissioner said. "It doesn't make sense to guard our armories and sources of raw materials, all the while permitting this orgy of noise and hazard to continue."

He said approximately one-third of the total United States population is protected from injury due to fireworks because of state legislation and city ordinance.

## Deadline Set For Mattress Applications

The deadline for receiving applications for low-income farm families for cotton mattress materials has been set for June 29, by the Washington AAA office, A. & M. College Extension Service officials have advised county agricultural and home demonstration agents.

The Federal Surplus Commodities Corporation will furnish cotton and ticking for all applications and work in mattress making centers will continue until all applicants have made their mattresses.

To date, 151,791 Texas applications have been received in 192 counties and 14,603 mattresses have been made.

## Want To Prohibit Sale Of Fireworks July 4

AUSTIN, June 26.—It is pretty firm patriotism to kill and injure Texans on a holiday celebrating our independence Marvill Hall, state fire insurance commissioner, reminded today as he issued a plea to city officials to adopt emergency measures banning the promiscuous sale and use of fireworks in all forms on the Fourth of July.

"We must not make it easy for the saboteur to gain possession of quantities of explosive material," the Commissioner said. "It doesn't make sense to guard our armories and sources of raw materials, all the while permitting this orgy of noise and hazard to continue."

He said approximately one-third of the total United States population is protected from injury due to fireworks because of state legislation and city ordinance.

## Deadline Set For Mattress Applications

The deadline for receiving applications from low-income farm families for cotton mattress materials has been set for June 29, by the Washington AAA office. A. & M. College Extension Service officials have advised county agricultural and home demonstration agents.

The Federal Surplus Commodities Corporation will furnish cotton and ticking for all applications and work in mattress making centers will continue until all applicants have made their mattresses.

To date, 151,791 Texas applications have been received in 192 counties and 14,603 mattresses have been made.

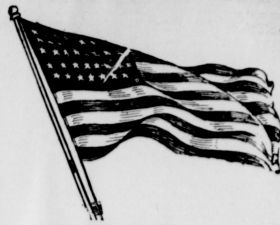

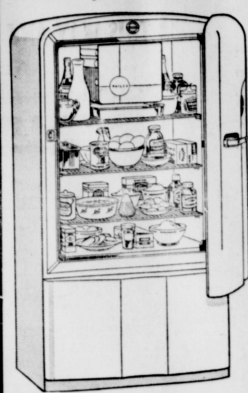
