BCS Report Stresses Conservation Progress

The rapid progress in soil conservation for the last 20 years is the keynote of the annual report of the Soil Conservation Service for the 1951 fiscal year. The report also emphasized the need for soil conservation effort and stresses the fact that total conservation is essential.

Tremendous progress has been made in the science and practical application of soil and water conservation during the last two decades.

The service helped 128,502 farmers and ranchers develop conservation plans on 36,259,299 acres last year. This brought the total as of June 30, 1951, to 883,348 plans covering 246,740,009 acres of land.

There are now about 2,400 organized soil conservation districts operated by farmers and ranchers under state laws. The survey spent a total of some 64 million dollars for the fiscal year. Of this amount, about 52 million was for regular operations in soil conservation districts. About seven million was used for flood control work. About one and a half million was for research.

Last Five Years Are Called "Golden Era"

Economists have labeled the past five years of prosperity enjoyed by the farmers of this country as "the Golden Age of American agriculture". According to authorities, there have been few, if any, eras which even approximate in prosperity that of the last five years.

It has not touched every farm family equally, but looking at the broader panorama, these years have brought opportunity, dignity, and a heightening self-respect to rural America.

This era has been characterized by rising prices, larger production per unit of labor, a phenomenal increase in crop yields, mechanization of farm operations, application of proved practices based on research, expansion of commercialization and specialization, and last but not least, the remarkable improvement in the farmer's physical plant and standard of living.

Economists maintain that never before has there been such a vast application of power to agriculture nor such a rapid advance in knowledge and its acceptance.

As for the future, increased application of new methods and more machinery will prolong the "golden age."

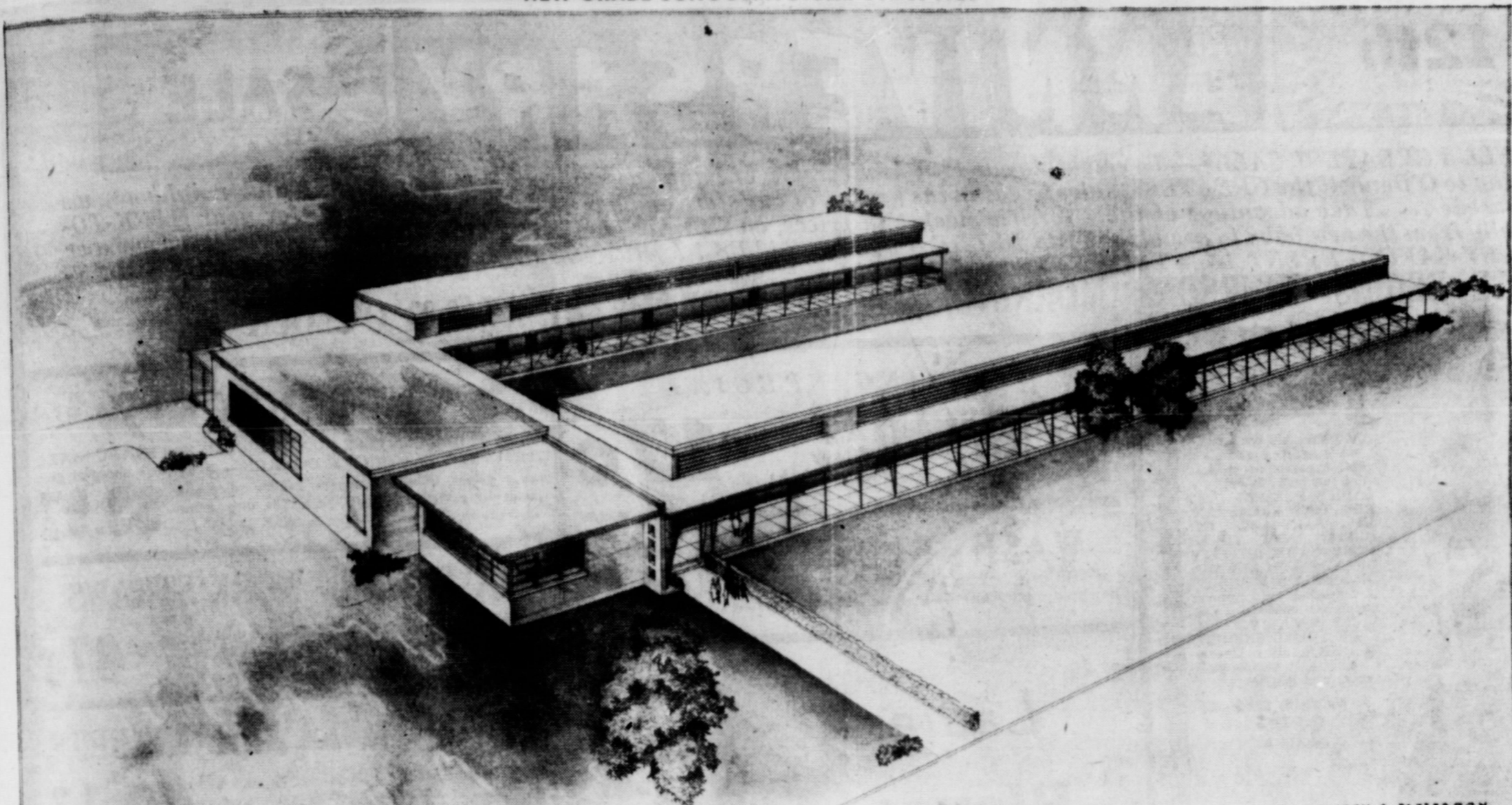

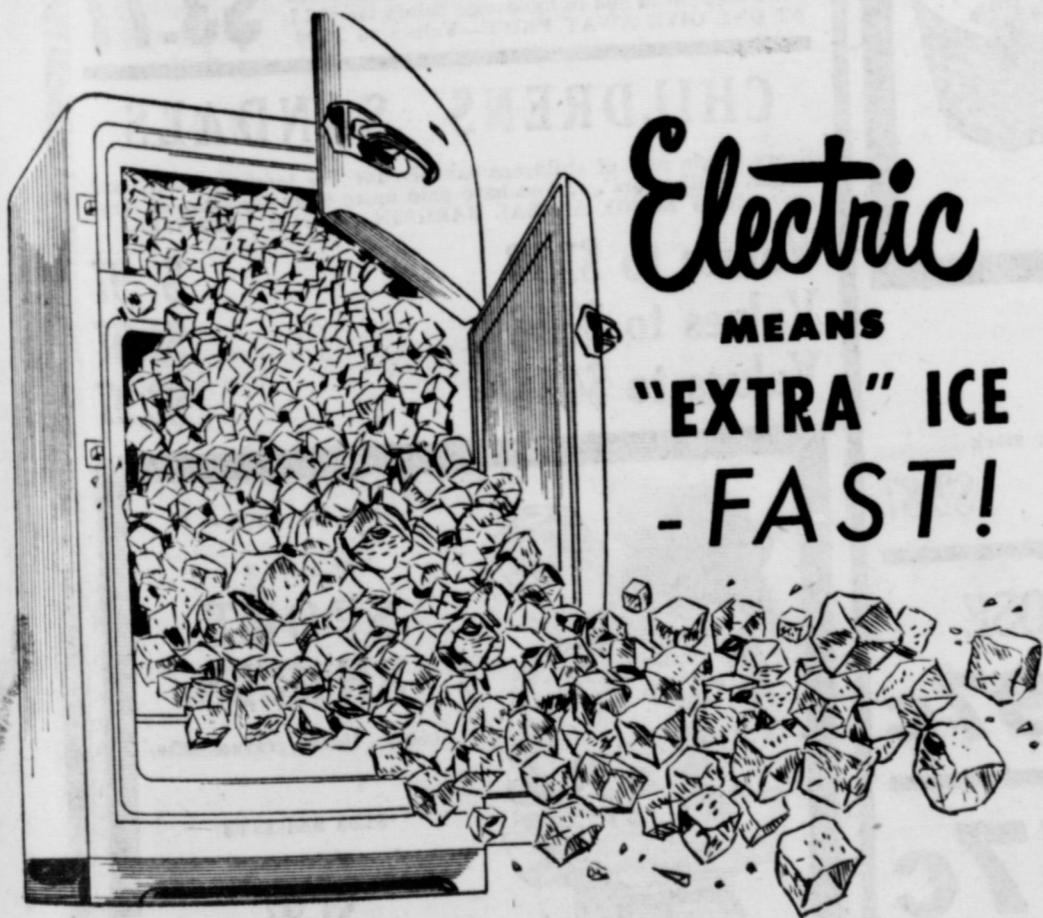

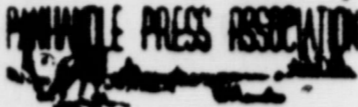

**Fertilized Soils Drink Hard Rains
Unfertilized Soils Break Down Under Hard Rains**

Does your farm land "drink" in heavy rains? Or do those rains break down the surface soil, seal the top like a lid, puddle and then run off? The answer depends on soil care, Missouri University agronomists. The accompanying photos show what happened after a beating rain on two freshly plowed fields adjacent each other at the Sanborn Experiment Field at Columbia, Mo. Both fields had been in corn since the top field was fertilized; the lower one not. For the test, all crops were removed and then the top field was plowed. Soil in the top field took the rain stride. The water drained quickly down. There was practically no soil damage, or loss of topsoil. The plowed clods were intact and the surface looks soft and porous.



In the lower field, the beating rain broke the bare surface soil into particles. Clods were dissolved, tiny particles quickly filled the spaces of the surface soils, forming a hard, lid-like crust. Water could get down in, so it ponded on the surface. This field suffered a double loss. It lost needed moisture for crops and it lost valuable topsoil to runoff.

Farm Wife May Equal Spouse in Crop Know-How

The hand that rocks the cradle is regaining its traditional skill in agriculture.

Prof. Grant B. Snyder, head of the Department of Olericulture at the University of Massachusetts and rural youth leader, predicts that modern farm wives will soon be growing out of the kitchen into full working partnership with husbands.

He bases his opinion, he said, on records of the National Junior Vegetable Growers Association, an organization that offers rural youth in 48 states "apprenticeship" training in the best methods of commercial gardening. This training program is a year-long production-marketing contest sponsored by A&P stores, which provides \$8,000 annually in scholarship funds.

In the 1951 contest, Prof. Snyder pointed out, "more than 40 per cent of the 148 winners who split the \$8,000 melon were girls."

"Many of these future farm wives," he added, "are college students taking agriculture, and I am sure they will put their education and their NJVGA experience to good use on their future farms."

Prof. Snyder, co-founder and chief adult adviser of NJVGA, said the 1952 contest, which is open to boys and girls 12 to 21 years of age, "is expected to be the biggest in NJVGA history."

Kentucky Minister Defies Racketeers

PADUCAH, Ky.—Threats against his life will not deter the Rev. William H. Estes, pastor of the Broadway Baptist church here, from continuing his exposure of gambling and vice conditions.

"I have no intention of keeping my mouth shut as long as these conditions exist here," Mr. Estes said. He recently received a phone call warning him to cease his crusade against the racketeers. It was the second such call.

The minister said that members of his congregation told him a group of "shady characters" attended a Sunday service in which he denounced vice conditions.

Servicing Will Prevent Expensive Breakdowns

The big season of work is here. If you haven't prepared your equipment for the long hard grind, you better hurry.

What about the tractor? If it has sat idle in the barn through the cold months, it needs attention. Service chores now are easier than later when you're in the midst of the rush season.

Give your tractor a spring lift with fresh oil, grease and gasoline. Stale gasoline literally gums up an engine; clean the carburetor carefully making sure there's no gum in jets and in the float chamber.

The oil probably had hours of use last fall, so change it. Examine the oil filter; if the element is dirty, play safe. Install a new one.

Next, check the ignition system and the spark plugs. You can tape a minor break but if the ignition cable insulation is brittle, don't take a chance put in a new set of cables.

Have the spark plugs cleaned and adjusted, even though they were new late last season. While they're scientifically designed to keep a fine adjustment through long hard use, plugs perform more efficiently if cleaned and checked every 100 hours—equal to 5,000 miles on your truck or car.



While on the subject of ignition, check the timing; your tractor service manual shows how. Improper timing is a power thief but easily remedied. Don't drag a plow or harrow around your acreage in second gear when a few minutes work will let you do it in third.

Clean the air filter now—and throughout the season. During the busy season douse it in kerosene, add fresh oil every ten hours or if fields are real dusty, every five. Remember, too, that a good operator puts a grease gun to pressure fittings every ten hours on wear-and-tear spots.

Keeping your tractor and other equipment in good operating condition is a matter of pure dollar economy.
