Builds Own Home:

Beats Housing Shortage
BERLIN, N.H.—One way to beat
the housing shortage—if you have the time and talent, backbone and brawn—is to go out in the woods and start building your own house with your own hands.

That's what Bob Hughes, Berlin artist and high school art instructor, decided to do about two years ago, and if all goes well, he hopes to move in with his wife and two children before long.

The 36-year-old jack-of-all-trades has been building the new house almost single-handed during summers, weekends, and any spare time he can find.

The front door will have 15 panels of thick pine, recessed and carved by the gifted young artistteacher-marionette maker into the 12 signs of the zodiac, with three panels for another design. The front hall will be paneled in pine, some a foot and a half wide. The stairs are huge solid oak blocks.

Bob Hughes is his own architect, designing the house himself and working from his own set of " blue-prints. It is a combination of modern and traditional. The living room has a large picture window, composed of twelve panes which saves the expense of a single sheet of plate glass, and has the advantage of individuality.

The kitchen will be done in white ash, and has a laundry shoot down into the basement.

Looking tanned and rugged. with a crew cut, dungarees and G.I. shoes, Bob didn't think he was doing anything particularly remarkable in building his own house. Although he was aboard the first landing craft to hit the coast of Normandie on D-Day, he knows he is not the first amateur to build a home for his family in this area. And he pointed out that he didn't dig the cellar-hole and has no intention of installing the furnace and plumbing.

Presence of Molecules Explains Expansion SCHENECTADY, N.Y. - Why

does heat make things expand? Matter is made of molecules which are in constant motion, and the higher the temperature, the faster they move. If you have a volume of gas in a rubber balloon, the pressure of these molecules against the rubber is balanced by its pull. Warming the gas makes the molecules move faster, so they push harder against the rubber. It yields a little, and the gas expands.

With cooling, their motion is slowed, they exert less pressure, Something similar occurs in a liquid, and also in a solid, although the molecules are held more tightly together. The amount which a solid expands for the same rise in temperature is considerably less than with a gas or liquid.



#### Birth Records Important

Most peoople are partial to months of late summer and fall. But not State Health Department birth record keepers.

To the staff of the department's

Bureau of Vital Statistics, August through October is the roughest time of the year.

The reason: parents who know their children must have birth certificates before they enter school for the first time but who put off making requests for certified copies until the last minute.

Last year bureau personnel pro-cessed more than 40,000 requests during those three monhs. For a limited staff, that meeans hours of night and week end work without overtime pay.

Bureau personnel shudder when they think of the estimated 227,000 kids who will be eligible to enter the first grade in September. Many of them have copies of birth

records already and will create no problem. Others live in areas where local school boards do not require proof of age before admitting the child to the hallowed halls of learn-

ing.
But the majority don't certified proof of age, despite the fact that they live in areas where school officials insist on such proof. It's this category that gives bureau statisticians and clerks sleepless

Says Bureau Director W. D. Car-roll: "We're ready to give immedi-ate service to applications which come in before the fall rush."
