## Voters Are Warned Of Regulations

H. C. Cain, county Democratic chairman, and A. M. Cagle, tax assessor-collector, join this week in reminding voters that failure to transfer poll taxes or exemptions from one ward, precinct or county to another sometimes nullifies the right to vote, even though one may have the poll tax receipt or exemption.

In case a voter moves from one precinct to another less than five days before an election, he must transfer his poll tax or exemption to the new precinct by applying to the presiding judge, or present an affidavit upon going to cast his vote.

A certified list of voters must be presented to the presiding judge of each precinct on July 24 this year, or three days prior to the election.

### FSA IN LYNN COUNTY TO PURCHASE FARMS

The county office of the Farm Security Administration has been notified that Lynn County has been re-designated to purchase farms under the Bankhead-Jones Farm Tenant Act, according to County Supervisor, Wyman J. Welch. Application blanks may be obtained in the county office in the Court House at Tahoka, and should be filed not later than August 15.

Farm tenants, sharecroppers and farm laborers who have established residence in Lynn County are eligible to file applications. Preference will be given to married persons or persons with dependent families who own livestock and equipment necessary to carry on farming operations. Additional information may be obtained at the county office.

## G. B. Derrick Dies At Home In Idalou

As the Index went to press last Thursday, a message was received here telling of the grave illness of G. B. Derrick of Idalou father of Mrs. Roy Everett and Mrs. J. M. Christopher. Members of the families left immediately for Idalou but did not reach Mr. Derrick's bedside before his death.

Funeral services were held Friday afternoon in the Church of Christ at Idalou with Elder E. P. Drennon of this place and Elder A. M. Lemons officiating.

Mr. Derrick, who was 83 years of age, had been in failing health for several months, but had appeared to be much improved, well enough, in fact, to visit his daughters here about three weeks ago. A paralytic stroke was immediate cause of his death. He had lived in Idalou twenty-one years, being the first druggist in that city. He retired from public life about four years ago. A member of the Church of Christ since early manhood, he had consistently set an example for all with whom he came in contact as a husband and father, a neighbor, a business man and a faithful Christian.

He is survived by the two daughters here and four others, Mrs. J. O. Easter of Lorenzo, Mrs. J. M. Caddell, Mrs. Elmer Cuddell, and Mrs. Jimmie Kerr, all of Lubbock; by three sons, H. L. Derrick of Toyah, V. H. and Leslie Derrick of Idalou, by thirteen grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.

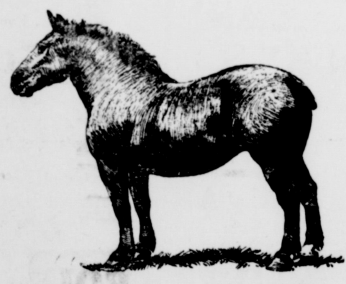

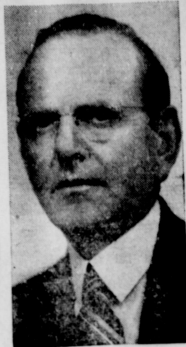
