

That something could be a hemmorage, thrombus, embolus, compression or a spasm. Each one of those key words is a major cause

A hemmorhage (bleeding) is the result of a break in a brain artery which allows blood to escape and damage surrounding tissue. Another name for strokes of this type is "apoplexy"

A thrombus is caused by a clot of blood forming in a brain artery stopping the flow of blood to the part of the brain it supplies. But when a clot is formed in a diseased heart or elsewhere in the body and pumped to the brain to plug an art-ery, it is called an embolus.

A tumor, swollen brain tissue or a large clot in another vessel may press upon a brain vessel to stop the flow of blood. This is called compression. A spasm is caused when a muscular artery constricts or tight-ens up, reducing the flow of blood to a particular brain area.





He also stated that even if there was a defect in Nancy's stove, it was an obvious defect and that she was negligent in not discover-

ing it.

Can Nancy win her lawsuit?

Yes, said the court. The stove as offered to the public was, by reason of its negligent construction, inherently dangerous. The manufacturer knew or ought to have known of the defective condition of the article it placed on the market for general use. It places no hardship on manufacturers of such articles to charge them with knowledge of their own methods of manufacturing and of the defects in such methods if they exist.
