# Vote For Senate Bill 116 Saturday

Saturday, Feb. 22nd, qualified voters in the O'Donnell Consolidated School District will be given an opportunity to vote on Senate Bill 116. Provisions of this bill make it possible to assess the Bond Tax and the Maintenance Tax separate and will allow the School Board to set the necessary tax within limits of funds necessary to service the bonds under the Bond Tax and to set the Maintenance Tax sufficient to meet budget requirements. Schools over the entire state are rapidly coming to this form of taxing. Last Saturday the Wilson School District here in our own county voted Senate Bill 116 along with an \$80,000 bonds. It is pointed out, however, that in O'Donnell's case there will NOT be a bond election at Saturday's voting.

The rising cost of maintenance and operation of our school plant necessitates the securing of additional funds. Voting of Senate Bill 116 is considered a much better method of securing these funds than having to re-evaluate all of the property of the district.

If the voters of this school district wish to maintain the schools that we now have, then each voter should come out Saturday and vote "FOR THE MAINTENANCE TAX". Voting will take place in the school tax office this Saturday.

## White Leads Cagers

As the basketball season nears its close in early March, the varsity team of the Eagles have won 12 games while dropping 10. In the district play the team won 3 and lost 5. Plains, Ropes and Sundown are currently in a three way tie for first place, O'Donnell follows next followed by Seagraves and then Friendship.

Ken White, one of the best players on the South Plains, is high scorer with 325 points made in 22 games for 15 points per game.

In 22 games Jerald Barton made 240 points for average of 11 points per game. Simpson made 151 points in 22 games for 7 points per game and Bessire in 21 games made 136 points for average of 6 points. In 21 games Gardenhire made 45 points for average of 2.

## Kite Safety Told

Safety rules for boys and girls who fly kites were outlined this week by Jimmy Lemons, manager for Texas Electric Service Co.

As explained by Mr. Lemons, the five safety rules in order of their importance are: First, fly your kite out in the open where it will not get caught in wires or trees. Second, use only string made of cotton, silk, linen, nylon or rayon. Third, use only wood in your kite frames. Fourth, fly kites only in good weather. You don't want to get them rain soaked. And fifth, if your kite should get caught in electric wires, call Texas Electric Service Co. They will send someone to get it down for you.

"Local youngsters who fly kites have been very careful in the past about where and when they flew their kites," Mr. Lemons said. "We had a perfect record last year with not one boy or girl being injured and only a few kites demolished. This year, I fully expect that even the number of kites lost will be reduced because it seems that every year our boys and girls listen more carefully to our warnings"
