## LYNN CO. AGENT IS HONORED

### Has A Fine Record

W. B. Griffin, Lynn county agricultural agent since January 1947, was one of seven Texans named as recipients of the National County Agricultural Agents Association's Distinguished Service Award. Griffin was nominated by the Texas Association for the high award. Houston County Agent P. S. Nix made the announcement. Nix is also chairman of the Texas Awards Committee.

The awards are made each year to a select group of county agents who over a period of years are recognized for their many outstanding contributions to agriculture and improved rural living. Presentation of the awards will be a highlight of the National Association's annual meeting to be held in Seattle, Washington, August 31 - September 4.

Griffin was first employed by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service in June 1945 as assistant county agent in Lubbock county where he served until his transfer to Lynn county.

Working through adult leaders and following plans developed by them and the county program building committee, Griffin has established an outstanding program which includes crops, livestock, soil and water conservation, irrigation, community improvement and others.

### S. S. News Given

A person doesn't have to quit working completely or sell his business to become eligible for Old-Age Insurance benefits under the Social Security Act, according to John G. Hutton, manager of the Lubbock Social Security district office.

The Law required that deductions be made from benefits of eligible persons if their earnings from work or a business are over \$1200 in a year. However, even though earnings are over \$1200, the worker or self-employed person would be eligible for one or more monthly payments if the earnings were not more than \$2080 per year.

Hutton explained further that it is also possible for a beneficiary to receive payments when earnings exceed \$2080; no deductions are made for a n y month in which earnings are \$80 or less, or the beneficiary is 72 years of age or older.

Persons who meet the age and work requirements should inquire about benefits even though they are still employed, or are in business for themselves. Hutton stressed that the difference between being eligible for benefits and actually receiving benefits is only too often the mere filling of a claim.

This Saturday, July 26th is the first Democratic Primary for Texas and voting in Big O will be as usual at the High School.

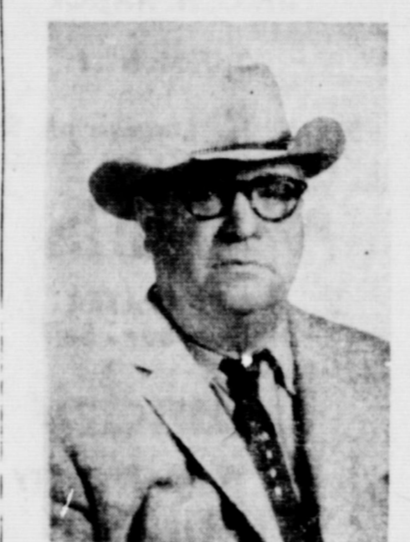

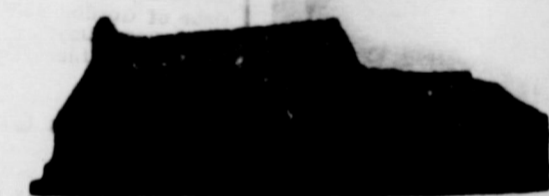

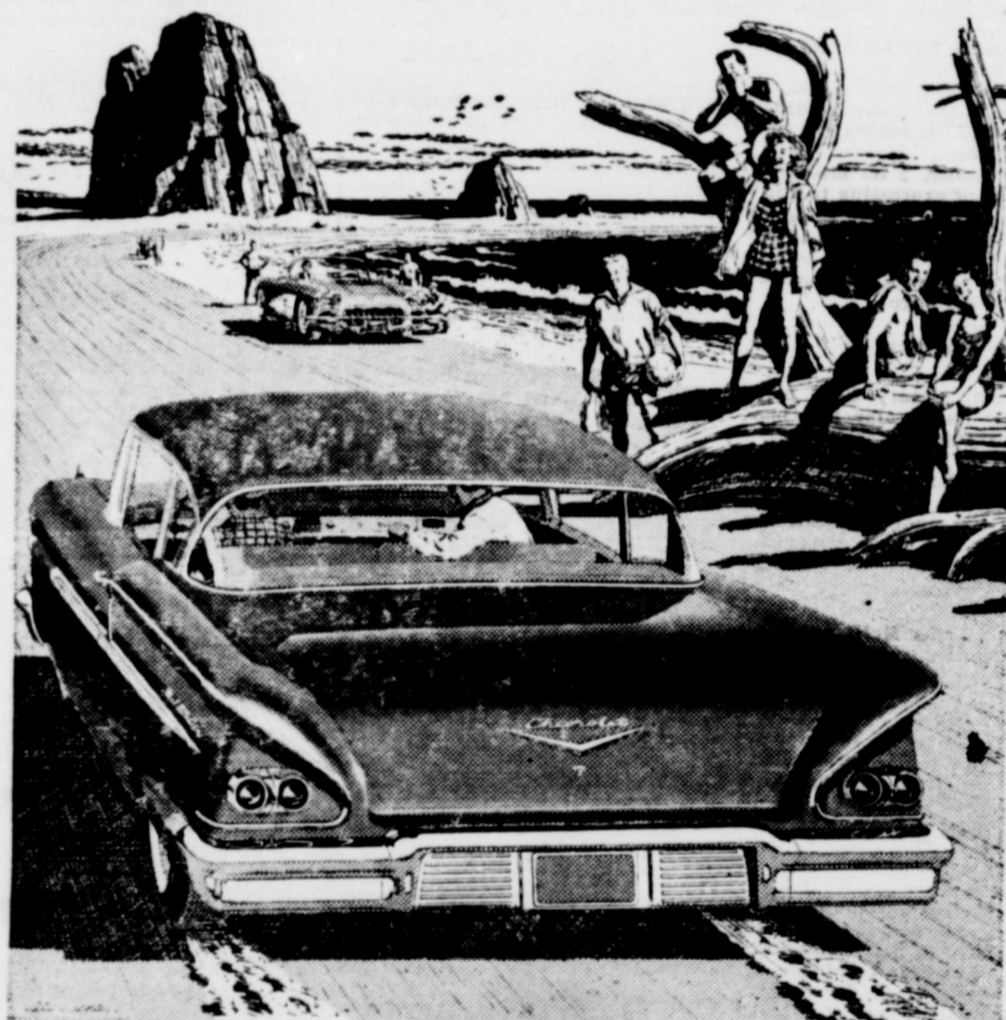

**Graders Need Birth Certificates**

Most school systems require a birth certificate to prove the child is six years old on September 1. Making early requests for birth records, parents can save themselves needless anxiety, their children missed classwork, and the department a great deal of time. Several hundred parents have already requested and received rec-

ords of their children's birth, but tens of thousands of additional records will have to be processed between now and the time school doors swing open for the new term. If too many people delay until August—as they usually do—the resulting bottleneck could very well mean your youngster will be barred when that first school bell rings.

The reason is obvious: The limited staff of the Division of Vital Statistics—despite long hours of night and week-end work without overtime pay—can search just so many files, extract just so many records, and photostat just so many copies in time for school's opening.

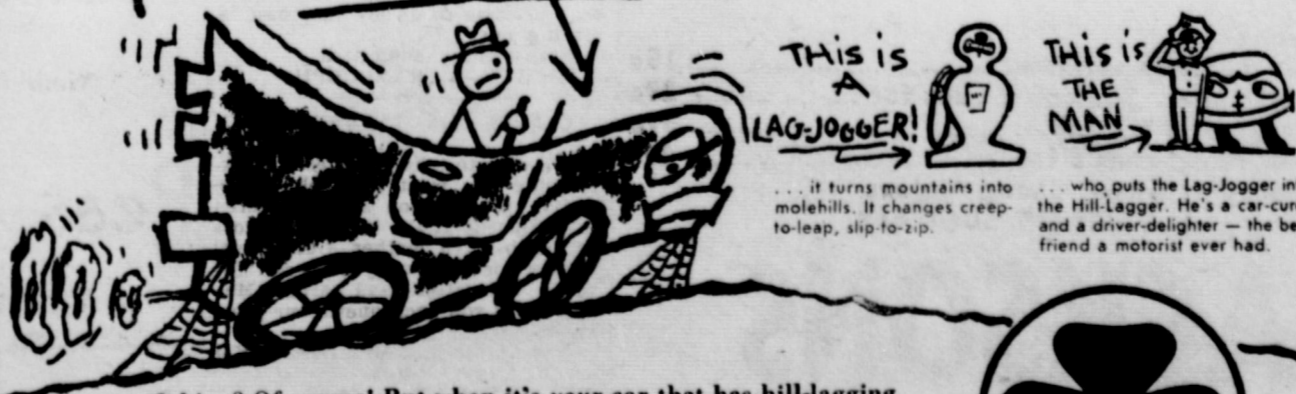
