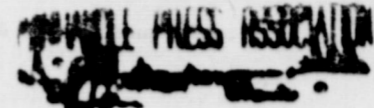

**Presence of Molecules
Explains Expansion**

SCHENECTADY, N. Y. — Why
does heat make things expand?

Matter is made of molecules
which are in constant motion, and
the higher the temperature, the
faster they move. If you have a
volume of gas in a rubber balloon,
the pressure of these molecules
against the rubber is balanced by
its pull. Warming the gas makes
the molecules move faster, so they
push harder against the rubber. It
yields a little, and the gas ex-
pands.

With cooling, their motion is
slowed, they exert less pressure,
and the volume of gas gets small-
er. Something similar occurs in a
liquid, and also in a solid, although
the molecules are held more tight-
ly together. The amount which a
solid expands for the same rise in
temperature is considerably less
than with a gas or liquid.

Add Life, Sparkle To Old Clothing With Simple Tricks

SLENDER budgets are the lion these days, and few put in a whole new wardrobe twice yearly. You've undoubtedly learned many new tricks on giving new life to old clothes, and here are others which have been successfully.

Looking over the suit from year or probably the year before. If it's been worn a great deal, skirt is shiny while the jacket still good!

Here's what you can do: Turn all the seams very carefully, reverse the material and sew back together again. It will be most like new. The jacket can probably use new shoulder pads and buttons, and a new blouse add that fresh sparkle so essential to suits.

Converting Clothes
 Almost every household has some worn and frayed slacks, fortunately the fraying is at the legs. This can be cut off to some popular pedal pushers which are knee length, or they may be made like the fashionable trousers, pants, knee-length, but lacking place of cuffing or fitting as done with pedal pushers.

Slacks might also be cut down and fitted to give a girl, or boy a pair of shorts. Lighter colors and denims can be cut with contrasting plaid for extra interest. The trimming might be made from an old plaid shirt or remnant.

Use Men's Shirts
 Sleeves and collars on men's shirts wear out, but the front remains in good condition. Plan to use it! Much of the back of a shirt can be used for tiny baby pants, but the lady of the house can have a good looking dress from the shirt front for her self. This is especially true when the front has some tucking.

Sleeveless blouses from good quality cottons such as are used in men's shirts are also another excellent idea. Many of these can be cut down without a pattern you're handy. Otherwise, they're very simple to make from a pattern.

Employ Decorative Tricks
 Some clothes need little extra than new trimming to revitalize them. Contrasting bands of material might be used for decoration on skirts. It can also be used to lengthen the skirt or to add new room to a too-tight skirt.

Cotton Babies Throng In Goldsmith, Ind.

GOLDSMITH, Ind.—Dr. S. M. Cotton was given a big day recently in this town of 300 population. He celebrated his 50th year as a "country doctor" with the aid of more than 3,000 persons.

Fifteen hundred of the celebrators wore cards on their lapels proudly proclaiming "I Am a Cotton Baby."

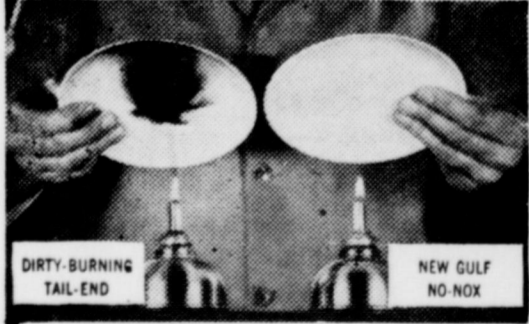

All veterans of the O'Donnell area, regardless of former military affiliations, who have been out of service since July 1951 and who possess a skill needed by the Air Force can now re-enlist with an attractive grade adjustment. It was announced today by T-Sgt. Herbert C. Ulbrich of the local Air Force Recruiting Station, located at the Post Office.

The re-enlistment program is part of a new policy designed by the Air Force to benefit the veteran and also insure the procurement of the much needed prior service technician. In addition the policy allows veterans with special qualifications a choice of base assignment or overseas theater where he would like to serve.

In the past, one of the greatest deterrents to re-enlistment was the 90-day after discharge time limitation. For veterans who possess skills which are needed by the Air Force, that time has been extended.

In other skills which are classed as surplus, grade determination will depend mostly on date of separation. Veterans re-enlisting with skill to present needs will be offered the opportunity to train in a specialty of their choice which is currently needed.

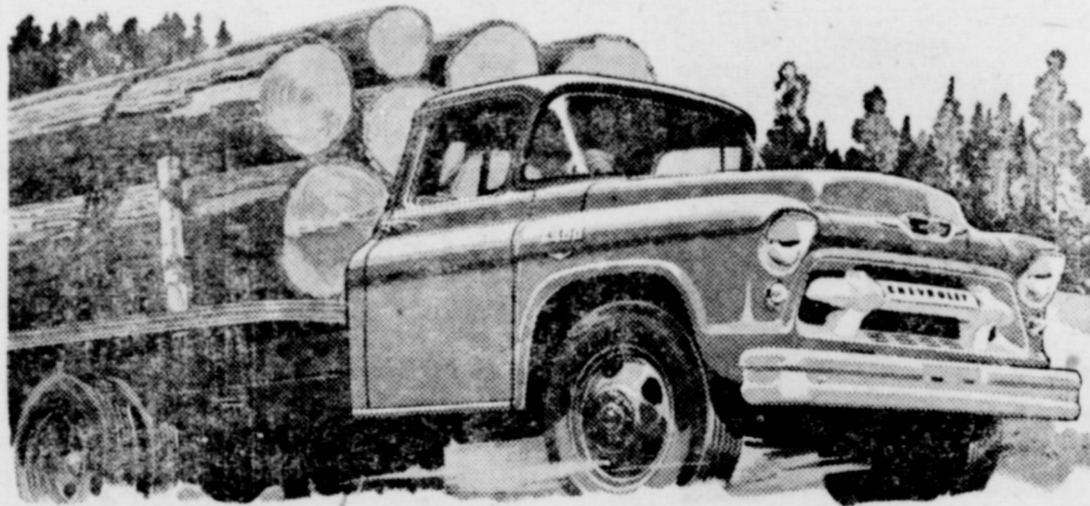

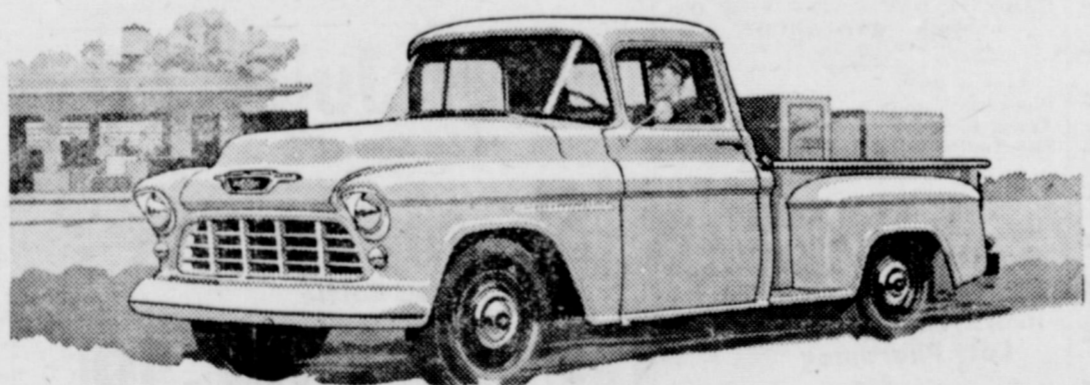
