

moisture stress heavier stands
appear to suffer more because
of need for more moisture,
The disease appears to be worse
on land continuously cropped

to sorghum, Adams said,
Since all hybrid grain sorghums are susceptible, management practices which will develop the sorghum past the danger period before moisture stress and high temperatures cocur should be used. Under irrigation needed moisture can be supplied,




