## WEST ASKS REDS FOR PEACE EFFORT; PACT NATIONS WOULD REARM ITALY; COSTLIEST STEEL STRIKE TERMINATED

### PEACE TRY: Reds Asked In

Russia's Andrei Vishinsky had said, in effect, to United Nations members: Set up an atomic control system of periodic inspection of manufacture and materials, and Russia will let you in to inspect Monday, Wednesday, Friday, this week and next week—but instead you want to inspect from minute to minute, day by day, week by week.

THE U. N. didn't go for that. Russia, its members claimed, was referring only to declared manufacture and materials, but what of the "hidden and undeclared" production and stockpiles. Vishinsky got nowhere with his proposal. Then, the U. N. turned around, placed the shoe of warmongering on the foot upon which they felt it belonged. The United States and other western powers called upon Russia to stop its "campaign of hate" and cooperate in a 12-point program for peace.

The 12 points were: Stop threatening or using force contrary to the U. N. charter. Stop interfering with the independence of any other country and the fomenting of civil strife. Carry out in good faith all international agreements. Afford all U. N. bodies full cooperation. Promote full freedom of religion and political expression and full respect of all other fundamental rights. Promote higher standards of living for all peoples. Remove information barriers. Participate fully in the U. N.'s work. Settle international disputes peacefully. Cooperate in armaments control. Agree to exercise national sovereignty jointly with other nations to attain international control of atomic energy. Urge five big powers to broaden their cooperation in the security council of the U. N., and to exercise restraint in using the veto.

THE FIRST REACTION of those conversant with Russian policy as it has been manifest thus far must have wondered if the western powers had taken complete leave of their senses in making any such proposal to Moscow. They might as well have asked the Russians to turn over the Kremlin to the Christian Endeavor society, enroll Joe Stalin as a Boy Scoutmaster, and to turn the politburo into a Sunday choral society. Even a kindergarten child would have known better than to expect Soviet agreement to any of the 12 points.

### STRIKE ENDS: Steel Costliest

America's costliest steel strike ended, appropriately enough on Armistice day, with the CIO steelworkers winning demands for an industry-financed insurance-pension formula.

THE CAPITULATION of U. S. steel, bellwether of the industry as regards labor relations, brought an end to the crippling strike. Four smaller firms settled on the same terms the same day, terms which followed the pattern accepted by Bethlehem steel, first big company to sign with the union.

According to a CIO spokesman, the union-company agreement embodied such terms as a minimum \$100 monthly pension to workers aged 65 with 25 years service, with the employer paying all the cost, and an insurance program, costing five cents an hour per man, with the company and worker sharing the cost.

### FARM RATS: A Formula

The farmers in the Rio Grande tomato fields were beginning to get results in their interminable war on rats after garnishing their crops with poisoned grain.

A FEW WEEKS AGO the rats were swarming into tomato and green pepper fields near La Grulla, Tex. They spread methodically up and down the Rio Grande until the invasion covered a 15-mile strip, one to two miles wide in places. Farmers lost first pickings completely in several fields.

Then they began to dust their crops with poisoned grain. Said grower Ralph Jones: "That poison sure does the business. It's stopped the losses."

But not before serious damage was done to 2,000 irrigated and cultivated acres.

### U.S. PAY ROLL: Tops 10 Billion

United States government operational expense, long in the astronomical bracket, had reached a total annual figure of 10 billion, 200 million dollars. That figure, in the aggregate, is almost meaningless to the average American. But broken down to show how it affects the individual, it could be brought very much home to the taxpayer. It was costing each American \$227 per capita.

### ITALY: New Weapons

Experience, though a hard teacher, is supposed to teach well. In international events, however, this doesn't always follow.

FOR INSTANCE, Italy, two-time foe of the democracies in as many world wars, will be rearmed soon if top-planners of the Atlantic pact countries have their way. Discussions looking toward rearming the Italians under the Atlantic pact already were underway between high-ranking U. S. and Italian military officers and diplomats.

James C. Dunn, U. S. ambassador to Italy, attended the first of a series of closed sessions aimed at modernizing and re-equipping Italy's treaty-limited armed forces under the Atlantic pact's defense system.

ITALY'S RECORD in connection with disservice to the democracies smells to high heaven. In World War I the country started out with Germany and the Central Powers and turned coat only when it was evident her side was losing. In World War II, she started out with Il Duce Mussolini and forsook him only when it became apparent she was on the wrong horse again.

### RAILS: Fares Up

The third fare increase for eastern railroads in the past three years has been authorized by the interstate commerce commission. The increase this time amounted to a 12.5 per cent hike in rail passenger fares in the East, estimated to give the railroads another 37.8 million dollars a year in revenue.

THE RISE applies to the area east of the Mississippi river and north of the Ohio and Potomac rivers. Commuter fares were not to be affected.

In 1947 these same roads were granted a 10 per cent boost in passenger fares, and last year another hike of approximately 17 per cent. Southern and western railroads did not apply for the increase granted the eastern roads.

THE NEW RATES, it was said, would raise eastern coach fares to about 3.37 cents a mile, and parlor-car and sleeping-car fares to about 4.5 cents a mile.

In New York, a railway official said the new increase would boost one-way coach fares from New York to Chicago from \$27.30 to \$30.75. First class fares would be raised from \$36.35 to \$40.80.

### A-BOMBS: Men at Work

According to a British-licensed Berlin newspaper, the Telegraf, Russians are operating a plant near Berlin to produce explosives used solely for making atomic bombs.

THE PAPER, giving no authority for the source of its information declared, nevertheless, that the plant where the explosives are being made is the people's owned Tschermie plant in Erkner, suburban east Berlin. The newspaper story said 600 workers were employed on the project.

It said the plant produced a chemical called "carbazol," which the paper described as highly explosive.

### Rocket With 'Brain'

The U. S. air force appeared ready to hold its own in the guided missile department. It announced it had a rocket-propelled guided missile with "human intelligence" in tracking and destroying enemy aircraft.

Launched from a "mother" jet fighter plane the missile, named the "Firebird," is capable of heading off and destroying its objective in a matter of seconds.

### SWEDEN Talks Back

The United States senate, collectively and individually, has been called by some colorful and lurid names—but it remained for some Swedish editors to hurl the most devastating blast at that august body.

A SWEDISH NEWSPAPER, the liberal afternoon Expressen, had this to say:

"The U. S. senate is certainly a high assembly, but it is also a dumping place for all sorts of quaint characters and the most ignorant politicians from the darkest corners of the union. And it must be pretty dark in Oklahoma." The shaft was aimed, really, at Oklahoma's Senator Thomas, a Democrat, who was critical of the way Sweden had received a senate appropriations subcommittee visiting Marshall plan countries to see how U. S. funds were being used.

Sweden, it appeared, had received quite a bit of Marshall plan aid, but had sort of "snubbed" Thomas and his committee. Thomas declared the country to which he "referred" in his criticism, expressed in Vienna, "had helped no one in the past 135 years," and if it got any more Marshall plan funds, it would be over his protest.

The "QUAINT CHARACTERS" and "most ignorant politicians" the Swedes referred to in the senate, or who had ever been a member of it, included some right influential fellows who might have much to say about continuing Marshall plan aid—among them, President and former Senator Harry S. Truman.

### GERMANY: GIs to Stay

Russia might do as she pleased about occupying Germany, but the western allies intend to keep their troops in that country whether or not the Russians pull out.

THAT was the statement of a west German government spokesman who indicated this was one of the decisions reached at the big three Paris conference.

U. S. secretary of state Dean Acheson and German chancellor Konrad Adenauer had agreed upon the need for keeping western troops in Germany.

This same spokesman said the appointment of Soviet Marshal Konstantin Rokossovsky as commander-in-chief of the Polish army was construed to mean that Russian troops would be withdrawn from eastern Germany soon.

EVEN THOUGH the Russians should withdraw their troops, this same source said, the Russian secret police and the Soviet-trained German people's police still would remain.

### No Fault of Recoil

The old alibi that muzzle recoil messes up one's shooting accuracy has been scrapped for all time by recent demonstrations at the research laboratories of the Western cartridge company division of Olin industries at East Alton, Ill.

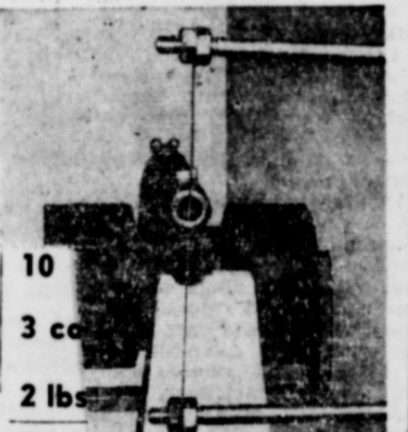
There science answered two questions asked by shooters since one first experienced the "kick" of a rifle. Questions answered were: Does the visible recoil of a gun occur before the bullet leaves the muzzle and destroy aim, or does the gun "kick" after the bullet is safely on its aimed way.

The answer was that visible recoil does not occur until after the bullet is some 30 feet away from the muzzle, which shows apparently indisputably that recoil, or "kick" has nothing to do with a shooter's aim.

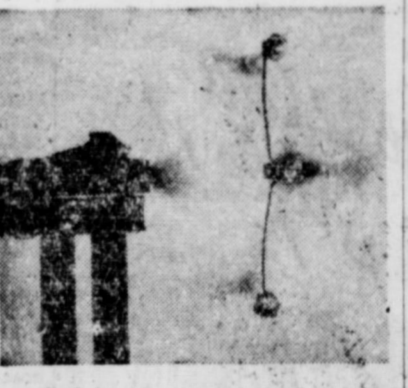
The photograph series here illustrates how this determination was made.



Here the test rifle is placed in recoil rest to simulate as far as possible conditions under which it would be fired by a man. The butt is in a sponge rubber pocket. The muzzle end rests upon a hard rubber cylinder with a depressed center and upon the block of wood used as a reference point for the tree micro-flash pictures. The trigger is pulled by a wire lanyard.



ing how the micro-flash s were made, this dis- wire, 1/100 of an inch in diameter, is stretched before the muzzle of the rifle across the path the bullet will take. When the bullet snips the wire in two, it breaks an electrical circuit thus having the bullet take its own picture.



And here's the proof that recoil doesn't interfere with aim, as the rifle muzzle is still securely on the rest, while the bullet has already left the muzzle and has broken the disjunctive wire. The snug fit of the muzzle on the rest shows recoil has not yet occurred. Other photos showed that visible recoil does not occur until bullet is some 30 feet from muzzle.

"Farmers and poultry raisers who suffer losses by rabid killings should be sure of the culprit before condemning the family dog," says Dayton Parsons, Division of Conservation trapper. "Nine times out of ten," he claims, "the poor dog gets blamed for the dirty work of the fox."

### Watch Bird Bands

Hunters are urged to watch for bands on ducks and geese they kill this year and to turn the bands in to the U. S. fish and wildlife service. Band numbers consist of two sets of figures, both of which are needed to identify the bird. Those cooperating are asked to record the band numbers in the latter, as well as flatten out, and enclose the band itself, since bands returned in the mail occasionally tear through the envelope and are lost.

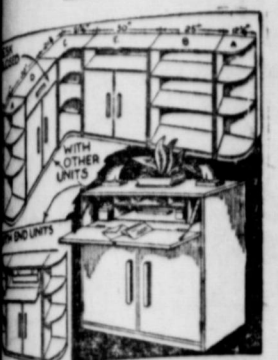

**Make Your Fruit Cakes, Plum Puddings in Time For Leisurely Ripening**

**BEFORE YOU GET CAUGHT** in the crush of holiday shopping or tangled in festive tinsel and wrapping, give a thought to your fruit cakes and plum puddings. These should be made at least a month or more before the holidays to give them time to ripen and mellow so their flavors will be perfect.

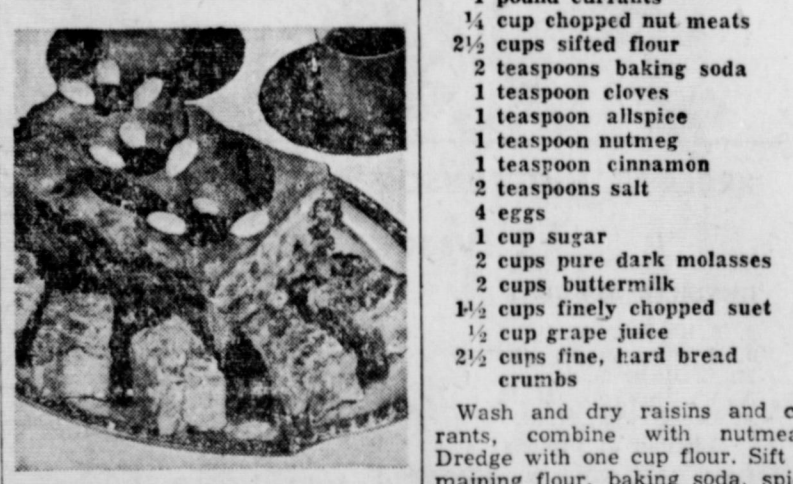
It's a comforting thought, too, many homemakers have found in years past, to have their Christmas desserts all snugly wrapped, ready to be eaten well in advance of all the other holiday food preparation.

In case you want to give away fruit cake and plum pudding as presents with "warmest regards" from your own kitchen, decide exactly who will be the lucky receivers, and plan accordingly.

**PLAN TWO DAYS** for making your fruit cake. The first day is usually spent ordering the fruits and nuts and getting them ready, along with lining the pans with paper. The second day is spent mixing and baking, as well as decorating and wrapping the cakes for storage.

- Horn of Plenty Fruit Cake (Makes 5 pounds)**
- 2 1/2 cups golden raisins
  - 1 cup dried apricots
  - 1 1/2 cups sliced citron
  - 1 cup cut candied pineapple
  - 1 cup halved candied cherries
  - 1 cup shredded coconut
  - 3/4 cup apricot whole fruit nectar
  - 1 1/2 teaspoons nutmeg
  - 2 teaspoons mace
  - 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
  - 3/4 cup thick orange marmalade
  - 1 cup butter or substitute
  - 1 1/4 cups granulated sugar
  - 4 eggs
  - 2 1/4 cups sifted all-purpose flour
  - 1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder
  - 1 teaspoon salt
  - 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
  - 1 1/4 cups finely chopped blanched almonds

Rinse raisins and drain. Pour boiling water over apricots and let stand five minutes. Cut into thin strips. Combine with raisins, citron, pineapple, cherries, coconut, nectar, spices and marmalade. Cover and let stand overnight. Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs, one at a time, and beat thoroughly. Add flour sifted with baking powder and salt and mix well. Blend in flavoring, almonds and fruit mixture and mix well. Pour into two loaf pans (8 x 4 x 3 inches) or one (9-inch) tube pan lined with two thicknesses of greased brown paper and one of waxed paper. Bake in a slow (275° F.) oven 3 to 4 hours, depending upon size of cake. Decorate top as desired.



Bake your fruit cakes in loaf pans or tube pans, whichever you like, but bake them early. Then they'll have a chance to ripen properly before the holidays and taste their mellow best. **"Checked" Enamel**

**QUESTION:** Is there any way to smooth the enamel on our woodwork without completely removing it? It has several coats of various colors of enamel and varnish on it. There are fine cracks or checks in some of the enamel. Could we rub it with turpentine or something, then sand it before repainting? If we have to remove all the old paint, how should we do that? Use a paint and varnish remover? We want to repaint our woodwork, but those checks show through so that it doesn't look nice.

**ANSWER:** You have the right idea, but in reverse—that is, you should use the sandpaper first, and then clean off with turpentine before repainting. If you were going to varnish, you would have to take off all the old finish; but as long as you are going to use paint again, I do not believe it will be necessary to take off all the paint, which would be quite a job. But the cracks and checks should be sanded out smoothly so that they will not show through the new finish.

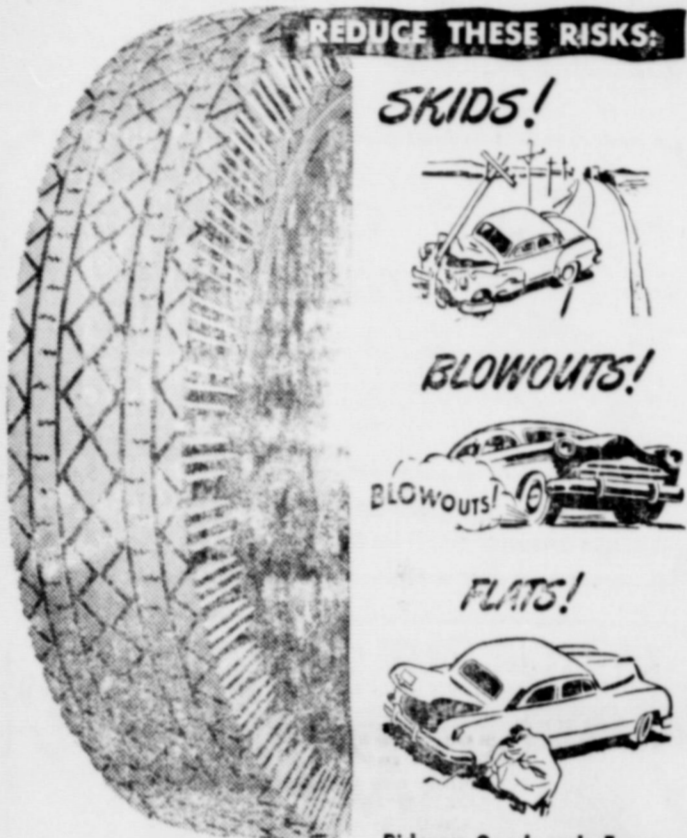

BORDEN CO. WATER REPORT IS RELEASED

Released by the Texas Board of Water Engineers of a report on the ground water resources of Borden County, Tex was announced recently by Director W E Wraether of the United States Geological Survey. The report, prepared by W C. Ellis, geologist of the Geological Survey, contains information based on his investigation in the field during the winter of 1948 and spring of 1949.

Ground water in Borden County is used principally to supply ranches, farms, and the community of Gall, the county seat. The pump age of ground water is small, averaging perhaps 250,000 gallons a day or less. None of the water bearing formations in the county can be expected to yield large supplies of water adequate for irrigation or heavy industrial use.

Included in the report are records of 129 wells and springs, the drillers logs of 41 wells, the chemical analyses of water from 82 wells and two streams, a map showing the location of all wells for which records were obtained, a regional geologic map and a brief discussion of ground water reservoirs that furnish water to wells in the county. A limited number of copies of the report are available for free distribution from the office of the Texas State Board of Water Engineers and the Geological Survey, Austin, Texas.

## Shopping Day Meals

**BUSY DAYS**, these, when you're trying to get holiday shopping done, attending club meetings and making final arrangements for the festivities. Sharp appetites, however, will have no mercy on you, and you'll be a wise homemaker to plan dinners that can be prepared early in the morning, then baked when you whisk into the house, while you set the table. Smart planning will be your best guide for days that you'll be spending away from home. You can do so relaxed, knowing that in the refrigerator sits the main dish for supper, needing only baking or heating.

**ALL OF THESE** casseroles may be prepared while you're awaiting the last straggler for breakfast. They may be refrigerated and need only baking for completion.

### \*Bright Salmon Loaf (Serves 5-6)

- 1 1-pound can pink salmon
- 1 egg, slightly beaten
- 1/2 cup condensed cream of celery soup
- 2 tablespoons chopped green pepper
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- 3 crushed shredded wheat biscuits
- 1/2 cup chili sauce

Drain salmon; remove bones and skin. Combine salmon juice, egg, soup, green pepper and lemon juice; mix thoroughly. Add salmon and crushed wheat biscuits; mix lightly. Place in a greased loaf pan (9 1/2 x 5 1/2 inches) or in a fish mold. Bake for one hour in a moderate (375°) oven. Allow loaf to stand for five minutes before removing from pan. Insert knife around all sides.

### Beef Dinner Casserole (Serves 6-8)

- 1 pound ground beef
- 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
- 1 pint tomato, chopped
- 1 No. 2 can whole kernel corn
- 1 can condensed tomato soup
- 1/2 cup cracker crumbs
- 1 tablespoon butter

Brown meat and green pepper in butter. Stir occasionally to keep meat particles separated. Add pimiento to meat and green pepper. Place half the corn into a greased 1 1/2 quart casserole. Add a layer of the meat mixture. Pour over half of the tomato soup. Repeat layers. Bake in a moderate (350°) oven for 45 minutes.

### Cabbage Bundles (Serves 6)

- 6 cabbage leaves
- 1/2 cup ground, cooked ham
- 1 1/2 cups cooked rice
- 1 cup shredded American cheese
- 1 egg yolk, beaten
- 1/2 cup chopped green pepper
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 cup tomato sauce or 1 cup thin cream sauce

Cook the cabbage leaves for a few minutes in boiling, salted water.

### LYNN SAYS: Salad Making Becomes An Art at its Best

To have the right beginning, use only salad greens that are crisp and clean. As soon as they arrive in the kitchen, wash thoroughly and drain on a rack or put with a soft towel. Store in vegetable crisper or plastic bag. Keep salad arrangements simple and avoid a cluttered look as well as one which is too artificial. Let the greens, fruit and vegetables arrange themselves naturally.

er until almost tender. Drain well. Combine all remaining ingredients except sauce. Place a tablespoon of this mixture on each cabbage leaf and wrap leaf around. Place the bundles in a shallow baking dish and pour sauce over all. Bake in a moderate (350°) oven for 30 minutes.

### Ham-Cauliflower Scallop (Serves 6)

- 1 cauliflower
- 3 tablespoons butter
- 3 tablespoons flour
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1/2 pound American cheese sliced
- 1 cup chopped, cooked ham
- 1 cup soft bread crumbs

Separate the cauliflower into flowerets and cook until almost done. Melt butter, add flour and blend in milk. Stir constantly and cook until thick. Add seasonings and cheese and stir until latter melts. Place cauliflowererets into casserole, sprinkle with ham and cover with sauce. Place border of crumbs around edge of casserole. Bake in a moderate (350°) oven until crumbs are browned, about 30 minutes.

### Supper Special (Serves 6)

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1/4 cup flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/2 cup evaporated milk
- 1/2 cup liquid, drained from peas
- 2 cups canned salmon, flaked
- 2 1/4 cups cooked or canned peas
- 1 cup crushed potato chips

Melt butter, blend in flour, salt and pepper. Add milk and pea liquid and cook until thickened stirring constantly. Add salmon to half of the sauce and place in buttered custard cups or in a large casserole.

Cover with potato chips and bake in a moderate (350°) oven for 45 minutes. Unmold and serve with remaining white sauce to which the peas were added.

### Scalloped Corn and Oysters (Serves 5-6)

- 1 No. 2 can corn kernels
- 1 pint oysters
- 3 tablespoons butter
- 2 tablespoons flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- Dash of pepper
- 1 1/2 cups milk
- 1 cup buttered crumbs

Heat corn. Drain oysters and add enough water to their liquid to make 3/4 cup. Melt butter, blend in flour, salt and pepper. Add milk and oyster liquid and cook, stirring, until thickened. Arrange corn, oysters, white sauce and crumbs in a casserole in alternate layers. Bake in a hot (400°) oven for 12-20 minutes.

Mayonnaise may be thinned for fruit salads with juices of any canned or citrus fruits. Cream or whipped cream may also be used.

Cream cheese, blue cheese and salad dressing, all blended together give an excellent, nippy topping for some fruit and vegetable salads.

Balls of cream cheese rolled in coconut make a frosty garnish for fruit salads.

Dark sweet cherries stuffed with cream cheese make a delightful as well as attractive garnish for fruit and salad plates.

## Prophets False & True

Lesson for December 4, 1949

**G**OD is neither silent nor dead. He has his spokesmen today. We hear myriads of voices—preachers, teachers, editors, columnists, poets and politicians, all professing to tell us the truth. When a man claims to speak in the name of truth, is there any way by which his claim can be tested? It is an old problem.

Away back in Bible times every prophet had his rivals, the false prophets. The false prophets were far more numerous, they often had immense prestige and government subsidies besides. How was the common man to tell the true prophets from the false?

### Notion of Man or Word of God?

**O**NE DIFFERENCE between the true and false prophets, of course, was that the false ones passed out their own ideas, while the true ones gave voice to the ideas of God. Some of the false prophets even dug down into what we now call the subconscious, and told their dreams as if they meant something.

The false prophets of our own times are still the people who draw on their own minds, even on their day-dreams, to furnish messages for the people. The gypsy dream-books are still with us. Astrologers flourish, and not always on the side streets. All sorts of queer cults profess to tell us what is coming next and what we ought to do.

Before we take a modern "prophet" seriously we should ask: Is what he is saying, his own idea or God's idea? In this 20th century after Christ, it should be easier to know God's ideas are than it was 27 centuries ago in Jeremiah's time.

For now that Christ has come, we can safely check all the self-styled prophets with the message and the mind of Christ.

### Is the voice of the people the voice of God?

**T**HE FALSE PROPHETS were always popular, the true ones seldom. Mere unpopularity does not prove a man a true prophet; but you may be sure that if a man says only what people like to hear, always tickling the ears and feeding the pride of his listeners, he is no true spokesman for God.

Not that the true prophet is always insulting his hearers. The Lord's prophets often speak comforting and welcome words, to be sure. But a steady outpouring of soothing-syrup is not what we would expect from a genuine prophet.

Man is often most proud when he is most wrong; and then God has to sweep the man down. Don't take too seriously the men who merely reinforce your prejudices and shore up your pride; they are more likely false prophets than true. The voice of the people is not always the will of God.

### Time is the Test

That great prophet Moses (Deut. 18) had already given a practical test of a true prophet: Does what he says turn out to be true? Can he really see into tomorrow? Alas, we may have to wait until tomorrow to find out for sure; but tomorrow always comes, and when it comes, the prophets of today will be shown up for what they are, true or false. Time is the test. Not, Is it likely?

### Truth and Right are Twins

**P**ERHAPS the worst feature of the false prophets who were Jeremiah's competitors was their real immorality. "Their course is evil and their might is not right," he said (23:10, American translation). "They commit adultery and walk in lies, they strengthen the hands of evildoers so that no one turns from his evil ways" (v. 14).

God's spokesman can never also speak for the enemies of God. Whenever you hear anyone talking as if we could now get "beyond good and evil," or as if the Ten Commandments were something we had outgrown, then you may know you are listening to a false prophet.

There are no new commandments but the one which sums up all of them: Love one another. Prophets of hate, prophets of dissension, of lust, these may be speaking for themselves or for the devil—but not for God.

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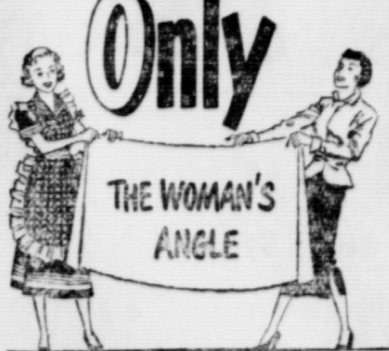


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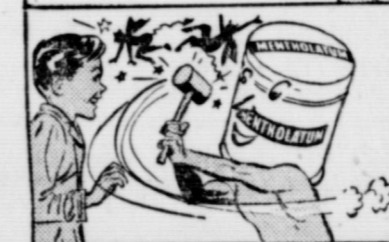
