

Community's Video Antenna Helps Areas in 'Fringe'

LACONIA, N.H.-Towns and villages in television "fringe areas" throughout the country can learn a lesson from this resort commu-

Video fans all over this mountainous area had been harassed by unclear and unsteady TV pictures. and sometimes no picture at all, largely because the signal from a television broadcasting antenna does not "bend" like radio beams. and, therefore, it won't go around or through a mountain. Many towns which are "around the corner of the earth" from the nearest broadcasting station-or which, like Laconia, are snuggled behind a mountain-receive little in the way of good television.

Citizens here got together and formed a company which has succeeded in building the first antenaplex community television antenna in New England. At recent opening ceremonies for the new system, Governor Sherman Adams of New Hampshire said it resulted in "the finest television picture I've ever seen."

The antenaplex system consists of a 40-foot antenna atop 2,400-foot Mount Belknap with amplifiers and a cable strung on poles 6,000 feet down the side of the mountain into Laconia. It took engineers of the RCA service company and a special construction crew nearly a year to complete the project, but residents agree it was worth wait-


