March 2, 1885 was a busy, happy day at Austin, Texas. On that day, over 20,000 people gathered to watch the impressive ceremonies celebrating the laying of the corner stone of the Texas State Capitol Building. The huge 18,000 pound red granite stone was hauled 15 miles from the quarries near Marble Falls to Burnet by 15 yoke of oxen. It was loaded onto a new railroad at Burnet and was taken to Austin. The railroad was built expressly to handle the huge blocks of Texas red granite that were used in building the Capitol.

The building was completed in September, 1888 at a cost of 2 million acres of Texas public lands that were set aside for that purpose by the State Constitution of 1876.

The Texas Capitol is situated on a 26 acre site overlooking downtown Austin. The largest State Capitol Building in the nation is 309 feet high, 574 feet long and is almost 300 feet wide.

It contains a total of 409 rooms, 20 vaults, 924 windows and 401 doors. The building itself covers 3 acres of grounds and its four stories contain approximately 18 acres of floor space. The waist-cotting of the interior has an aggregate length of 7 miles.

The Capitol is in the shape of a Greek cross. At the center of the cross is a huge circular chamber or Rotunda which rises to the top of the dome. The terrazzo floor in the Rotunda shows in mosaic designs, the seals of the six nations that have ruled in Texas at various times.

Even non-Texans who visit the Capitol Building can understand why Texas people are so proud of the huge, impressive structure with its beautifully landscaped grounds and the stately and monuments on the grounds and in the building.

Jude Taylor visited his mother who is very ill in Slaton Wednesday.

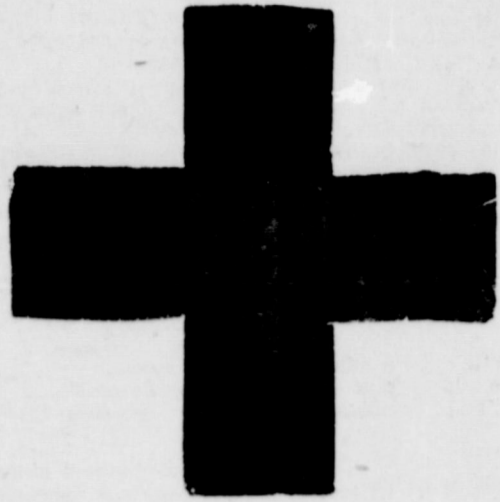
Bro. Blake of Woodrow has been preaching at Wells church from Wednesday night until Sunday. There were good crowds and some very good sermons.

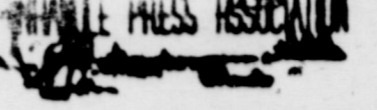

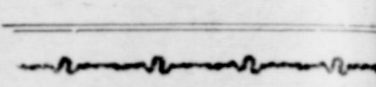

 A. Your application for Korean GI training should not be sent to VA headquarters in Washington. Instead, it should be sent to your nearest VA Regional office, which is responsible for acting on it. VA in Washington would only have to return your application to the proper Regional Office anyhow, so time would be lost by mailing it to Washington.  
 Q. I am about to finish a correspondence course in accounting under the World War II GI Bill. I have some entitlement left, and I would like to go to school and take an advanced accounting course.
