Records Needed By All

"People who work for themselves on a farm or in a business, trade or profession should keep complete and accurate records of all of their business transactions," John G. Hutton, manager of the Lubbock social security office, pointed out. Maintaining complete and accurate records is good business from many standpoints and these records are particularly valuable when income tax time rolls around.

For these businessmen, Federal tax returns are not only used to report the amount of their income for income tax purposes but are also used to report the self employment income for social security credits. This means that the eligibility to social security benefits for these individuals and the amount of their monthly benefits are dependent on the accuracy their tax returns and accuracy of the basic records on which these returns have been pre

pared Mr. Hutton commented that in many cases his office is required to verify the income reported on the self employment tax returns. The lack of good records has in some instances caused considerable delays in awarding claims for benefits and in several cases has result ed in actual loss of benefits. So do not gamble on losing what you may be entitled to - keep an accurate and complete record of all

your business transactions.



POLIO CASES DOWN SHARPLY

Before the advent of the Salk vac cine. Texans prayed for a release from the ravages of paralytic polio for themselves and for their child-ren. The picture has changed a great deal since then. With the announcemen that Dr. Jonas Salk had dev-veloped an effective vaccine for the prevention of polio, parents swarmed to their doctors and clinics to have their children protected. Since then the incidence of paralytic polio has fallen many fold and an apathetic state of mind has fallen on many Texans concerning the need for protecting themselves. Many school children have received their shots, resulting in a favorable vaccination picture among school age children. As a result this year and last year has seen the preschool age children with the highest attack rate of paralytic polio.

Who should be vaccinated, Every one can benefit from polio vaccine inoculations since the disease strik es all ages. However the present goal is to vaccinate the most susceptible groups — from infants to age 40. You are not adequately pro tected unless you have all three shots porperly spaced. The second shot is given two to six weeks after the first and the third 7 to 12 mon-ths after the second. It is important to have that third shot.




