Route Boxes Must Be Maintained, Says Mr. Line

Postmaster Odie Line said this week — "May we appeal to postal customers on rural routes to help our rural carriers make mail deliveries during bad winter weather. The post office has three rural routes over this area. Mr. Line lists these points of concern — 1. Approaches to rural mail boxes must be kept open by patrons 2. Obstructions to delivery of mail on rural routes should be removed or minimized to the fullest extent possible. 3. Unless approaches are cleared, it may be necessary to temporarily withhold delivery of mail. Mr. Line said. Rural carriers are not required to perform service on foot when roads normally used can not be traveled but they are expected to use as many of their patrons as possible.

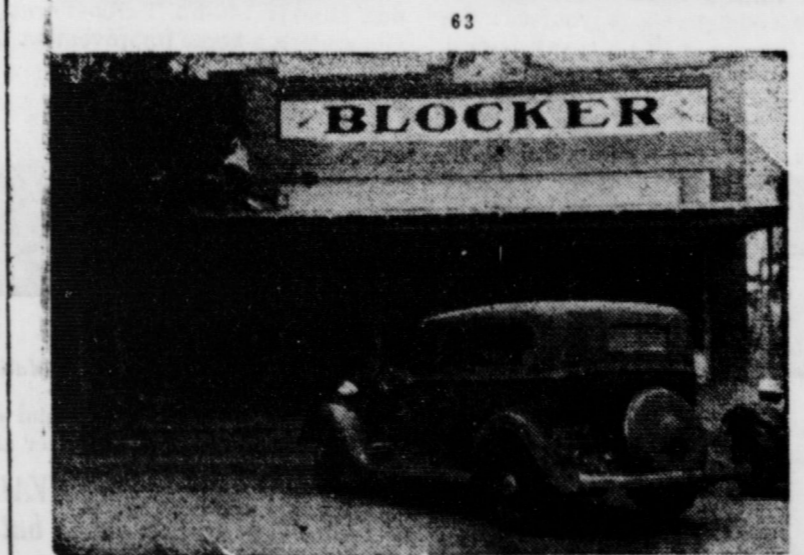

Mel Baker, local Army recruiter informed the Index that the Army is offering the graduate specialist program again this year to all high school seniors who wish to take advantage of this program. 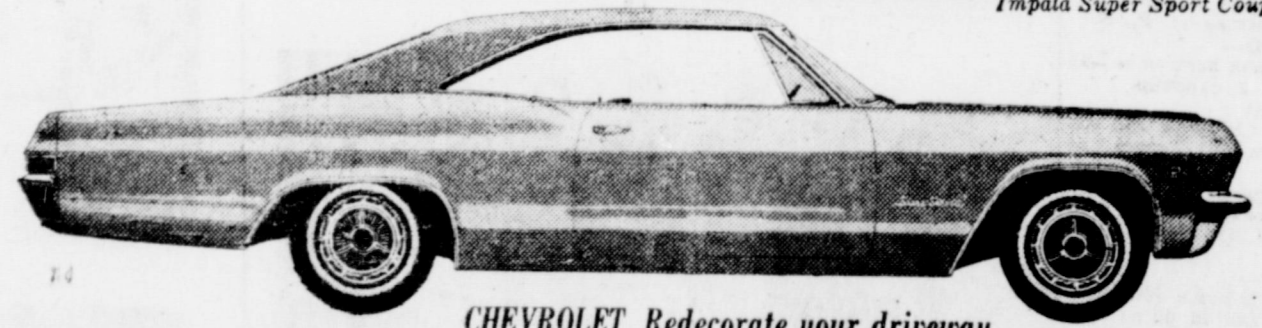
