TEXAS HAS PLENTY OF STAR LIGHTING EQUIPMENT

There are 135 "skyscrapers" in Texas, according to a survey recently made by the Texas Public Service Information Bureau. Twenty Texas cities have buildings of ten stories or higher completed or under contact in the 37-story Gulf. San Annolio's 35-story Smith-Young tower is the second tallest. Dallas with thirty-four has the greatest number.
