## Boy Scouts May Form March 15

## About 800 Eligible To Vote In Pct. 3, Lynn Co.

J. E. Red Brown said Monday that 510 of O'Donnell had paid poll taxes this year and he estimates 150 overs and unders as exemptions here. 100 had paid poll taxes at New Moore. The county had 2754 poll taxes paid with an estimated 1,000 exemptions or a total voting list of 3750. He reported 96 percent of county and state taxes paid or a total of \$198,000 collected.

## DEVICE WARNS OF TWISTERS

The U. S. Weather Bureau has recently installed a Microdatalograph inside the home of the Benny Moore family. This interesting device records on tape the minute changes in atmospheric pressures. There are only 170 of these machines in the state and not even Lubbock has one. The machine will operate from February thru September to indicate weather conditions which possibly could breed a tornado belt. The snow and rain gauge is also at the Moore residence.

Twisters are associated with a bottom blanket of cool air with a warm, humid layer of air above coupled with a falling air pressure. Pop cold fronts of spring and summer trigger the storms.

A number of school board members and superintendents of this area will meet Wednesday nite at the Lamesa High School cafeteria for a discussion of mutual school problems. Leon Graham of the Texas Education Agency will speak.

## Heart Disease Not So Serious, Says Doctor

Optimistic state health officials don't think the picture of heart disease is as black as it has been painted. "True," says Dr. W. S. Brumage, director of the State Health Department's heart disease control activities, "it kills more people than any other disease. But thinks are appearing in its armor, and research scientists are widening those cracks daily." Take the old bogaboo of rheumatoid crippling fever. A few years ago it used to cripple or kill its victims like a relentless pirate. Today, inexpensive penicillin readily routs the causative organism, a malicious little speck of life known as "hemolytic streptococcus."

Or think about luetic heart disease, a deadly complication of syphilis. Modern penicillin therapy, Dr. Brumage says, has pulled its wings.

Perhaps the most impressive area of progress against heart killers is modern surgery to correct congenital heart defects. Many babies are hale and hardy today who, had they been born a few brief years ago, would have surely succumbed to heart malformation.

Also, congenital heart deformities can be prevented today by the expedient of preventing expectant mothers from contracting German measles at a critical stage of pregnancy.

"We cannot yet do anything to prevent other forms of heart disease," Dr. Brumage says, "but we can add long years to heart disease patient's life through patient education—teaching him to live usually in spite of his heart impairment."

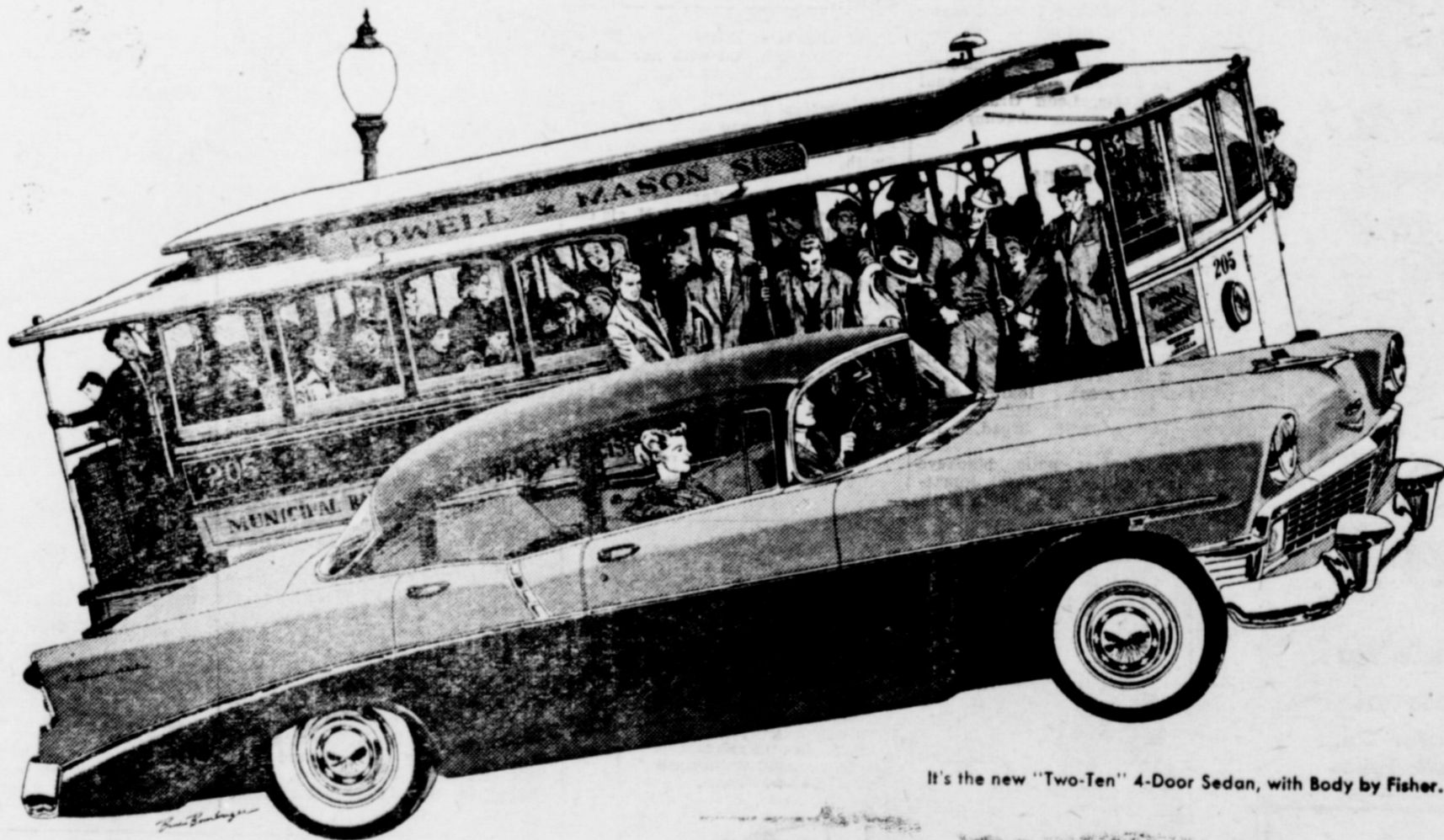

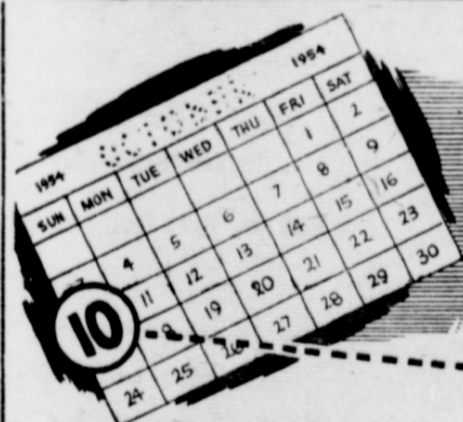

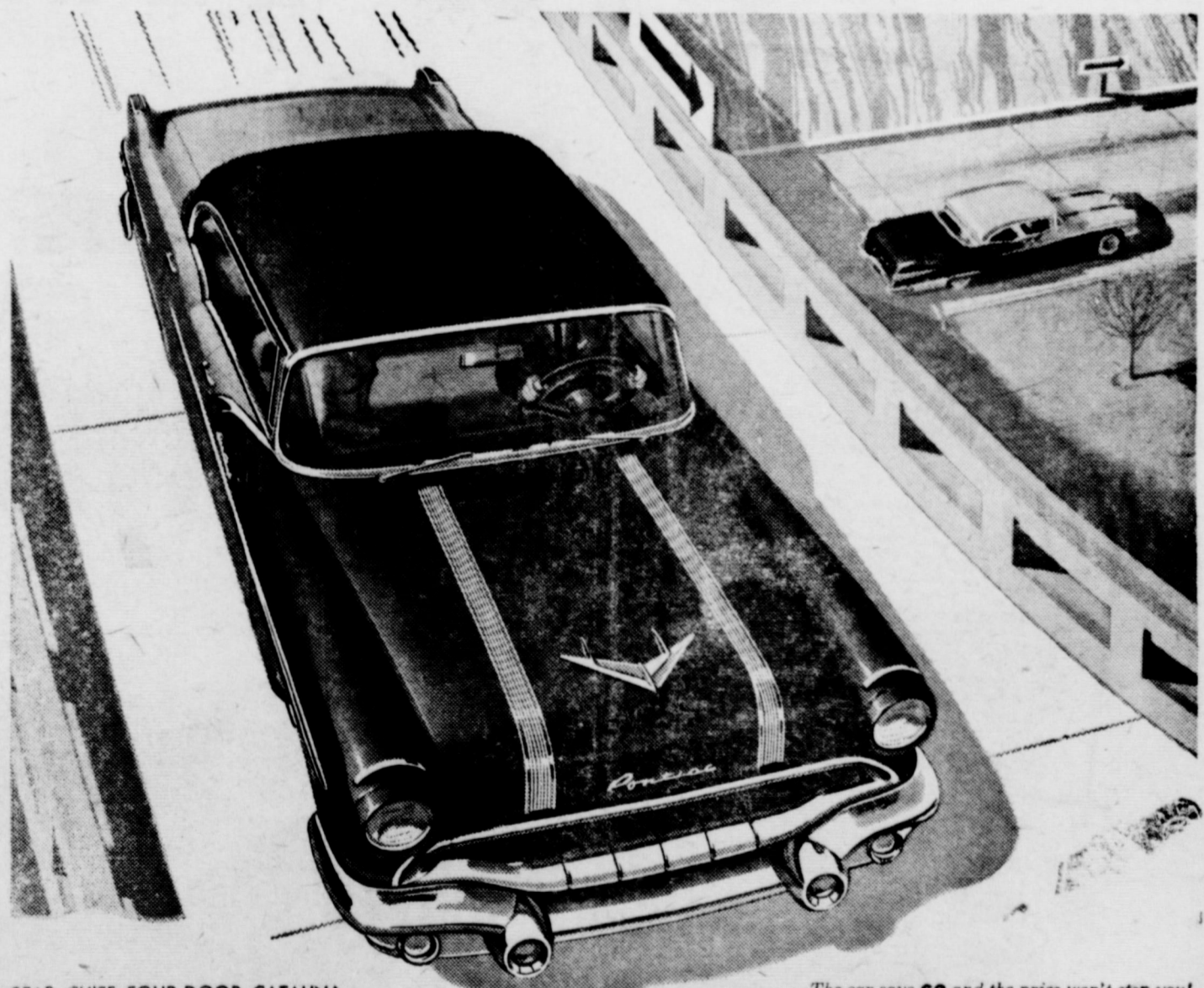

**GIVES SAFETY RULES IN FLYING KITES**

Safety rules for boys and girls who fly kites were outlined today by Jimmy Lemons, manager for Texas Electric Service Company, in anticipation of the opening of the 1956 kite flying season.

As explained by Mr. Lemons, the five safety rules in order of their importance are: First, fly your kite out in the open where it won't be caught in wires or trees. Second, use only string made of cotton, linen, nylon or rayon. Third, use only wood in your kite frames. Fourth, fly kites only in good weather. You don't want to get them rain soaked. And fifth, if your kite should get caught in electric wires, call Texas Electric Service Company. They will send someone to get it down for you.

"Local youngsters who fly kites have been very careful in the past about where and when they fly their kites," Lemons stated. "We had a perfect record last year with not one boy or girl being injured and only a few kites demolished."

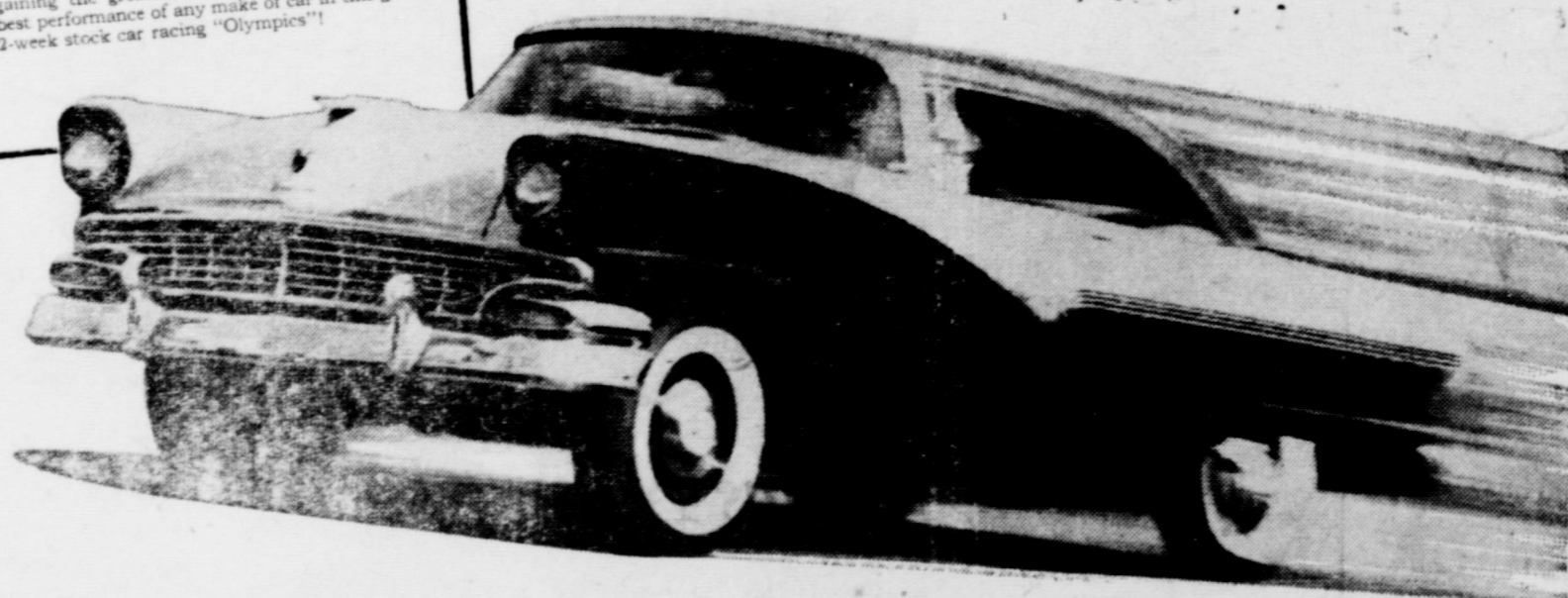

**Cancer Killer That Spares Life Sought**

BERKELEY, Calif.—What would be the ideal chemical to kill cancer cells and at the same time leave normal tissues of the body unharmed?

A new approach to this difficult question will be undertaken by a team of scientists in the University of California School of Medicine, San Francisco, with the aid of a \$10,000 grant from the Damon Runyon Fund.

At the present time the trial and error method usually guides the search for cancer-fighting chemicals. Chemicals are made in the laboratory, then tried on cancerous mice. If they have some effect on cancer, they are then tried on human patients.

There are at present two chief classes of cancer-fighting chemicals.

In each case the chemicals that inhibit cancer growth so far tried have not been able to make a sharp enough distinction between cancer cells and normal cells.

The scientists will study the basic chemical reactions that take place between the chemicals and both cancer and normal tissue.

Their goal is to learn enough about the reactions to be able to write specifications for chemicals that would carry out the desired inhibiting reactions with cancer cells but not with normal cells.
