

Cotton Allotment Cut By 10.5 Percent In Lynn

Lynn county farmers got the bad news last week that Secretary of Agriculture Orville Freeman had ordered a drastic cut in base cotton acreage allotment to 10.54 percent of 29,760 acres in this county. Lynn and Borden counties also received approximately same cuts.

The reduction in Lynn County means an estimated loss in income of \$3 million. It is hoped that Congress will adjust this cut before planting season. This year Lynn had 196,101 acres of cotton and next year will have 175,341 acres. In simple terms a farm with an allotment of 100 acres of cotton may harvest 89.5 acres of cotton in 1963.

The nation is producing too much cotton. Agriculture Department officials say the cotton industry, as well as such producers, say the trouble is that cotton is supported at such a high price that synthetics are taking the market. Export sales are dropping because of the high price of American cotton and cotton goods are being imported from cheaper foreign cotton to compete with U. S. cotton. The American farmer faces ever increasing production costs and smaller allotment acres each year.

Cotton is indeed a "sick" industry. Many area farmers had rather see a cut in support and in turn an increase in allotment.

3223 bales of cotton have been ginned at the local gins to 6 p. m. Monday night compared to over 15,000 the same time last year. Many farmers are reporting the cotton too green for ideal harvesting but a hog-killing freeze is in prospect for Tuesday night. After several days of drying the harvest should be in full swing. The crop here is estimated at only one third complete. Grain harvesting is completed or nearly so. This has been the latest crop in recent history on the South Plains and business is reflecting it all over the Plains.

STATE WILL SUPERVISE RADIO ACTIVE MATERIALS

Austin -- Early in January Gov. Price Daniel and Dr. Glenn Seaborg of the Atomic Energy Commission will meet in the Senate Chamber at the Texas Capitol where each will sign an important legal document.

The document will be a formal contract between the Federal Government and the State of Texas. And it will be full of the legal words and phrases usually found in such contracts.

But boiled down to its essence the signed contract will mean that any Texas firm or individual who finds it necessary to use radio active materials in their business or profession will deal directly with the State Department of Health for license and supervision rather than with the Atomic Energy Commission.

Farm people now make up about eight percent of the nation's total population but they buy 13 percent of the petroleum produced in this country -- more than any other single industry. In 1961 American farmers sold about \$35 billion worth of goods and spent \$25 billion on production costs. Because of the efficiency of the American farmer, he is now feeding and clothing himself and 27 others. Consumers have never had so much high quality food available at such favorable prices.

The simple process of grouping unginmed bales of cotton according to their moisture and trash content is suggested by B. G. Reeves, extension cotton ginning specialist, as an aid to better ginning and improved quality. This is especially true, he adds, during periods of damp weather.

Handle your seed more carefully during harvesting and processing and you will have better plants. Make sure that all conditions of harvesting are the best and run your combine at a slower speed than used for grain. Be careful about the chemicals that

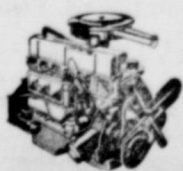
