### Election Returns Bring Some Political Upsets

While results of a number of races last Saturday were somewhat surprising, others ratified pre-election prophecies. In the state races:

Texas Election Bureau's final tabulation Sunday night of returns from Saturday's statewide races gave the following results:

Senator—Belcher 46,888, Connally 63,410, Fisher 73,917.

Governor—Condon 2,518, Davis 3,833, Ferguson 72,290, Hines, 95,283, O'Donnell 467,365, Sadler 46,546, and Thompson 183,423.

Lieutenant Governor—Mead 114,172, Somerville 30,011, Stevenson 538,641.

Railroad Commissioner—Brooks 151,467, Copeland 9,490, Culberson 142,946, Everts 650, Hardin 90,153, Holt 12,485, Hood 20,000, Jones 15,160, Langford, 12,754, McDonald 46,117, Mills 7,644, Patterson 22,966, Pundt 9,210, Saubury 27,186, Shenepp 29,924, C. E. Smith 62,201, E. T. Smith 12,033, Terrell 24,930, Van Zandt 38,874.

Comptroller—Butler 165,110, Shepard 581,458.

Treasurer—Lockhart 567,736, McKee 190,968.

Superintendent Instruction—LeMay 33,948, Woods 438,875.

Agricultural Commissioner—Cory 129,567, King 130,000, McDonald 467,420.

Criminal Appeals—Bauchamp 351,594, Christian 333,338.

The returns were from 242 of the State's 254 counties including 74 counties. Election Bureau officials estimated that about 275,000 votes remained to be counted. They said the total probably would be the largest in Texas history.

**Mahon Easy Victor**  
Despite the fact that he was unable to make an active campaign, due to the pressure of congressional business, George Mahon, congressional representative from the 119th district, Saturday scored a comparatively easy victory over two opponents.

Rep. Mahon polled 35,995 votes to 11,949 for his closest competitor, C. L. Harris of Dickens county, on the basis of incomplete returns from the 25 counties of the district.

M. D. Ramsey of Floyd county, the third man in the race counted only 4,609 ballots.

Lynn county gave Mahon a decisive margin, putting up 24,950 votes for him as compared with 430 for Harris and 181 for Ramsey.

**Formby and Halsey Winners**  
Consistently holding a lead as voting results came in from over the 30th senatorial district, County Judge Marshall Formby of Dickens county was more than 7,000 votes ahead in announced results in one senate race and the apparent winner of the hottest race in the district.

With 48,148 votes reported, Judge Formby had a total of 27,761 and Arvin J. Allison of Hockley county, retiring representative from this district had a total of 20,387.

Incomplete returns Sunday gave Rip Halsey a lead of more than 8,000 votes over Jack Douglas for the office of representative, 119th district.

**Lynn County Vote Heavy**  
A last minute, or last week, flurry of interest in county politics called out an unusually large vote for Lynn county. In the district attorney's race, Lynn voted: Freeman, 299; Hackney, 501; Barber, 545; Price, 578; McCord, 1608. McCord and Freeman will, accordingly, battle it out in August, McCord leading with a vote of 2860 as compared with 2823 for Freeman.

Miss Hattie Server, district clerk, Mrs. Lois Daniels, county treasurer, and W. M. Mathis, county clerk were unopposed, as was Justice of the Peace George D. Foster here.

In the constable race here, Christopher polled 430 votes, Proctor 236, and Galneau 111.

She had become almost blind and deaf of late, so that her walks to town to get her candy were a source of anxiety to family and friends.

Little Mex is gone—may she rest in peace and have her own cushion and plenty of candy in a good little dog's Valhalla.
