Through the Courtesy of the North Texas Flying QUALIFICATIONS NECCESSARY FOR PILOTS All flying is under the supervision of the Aeronautics

It has estished certain rules and regulations which must be followed by any student desiring to obtain a license. The general public may not understand or appreciate the reasons behind all these regulations; these articles attempt to discuss the

man can understand. It is the intention of this newspaper to lay before the students certain facts which will save him mistakes, some of which are expensive.
The Federal Government, through the Department of
Commerce, has jurisdiction over all commercial flying. All Commerce, has jurisdiction over all commercial flying. All
