A LITTLE HURT MAY SAVE YOUR LIFE ...

The paradox that a "little hurt" can prevent a lot of sickness was discobered by scientists about a hundred years ago.

-0-

An English country doctor named Fdward Jenner took a little serum from a cowpox pustule on the arm of a milkmaid and scratched it with a lancet into the arm of a neighbor oy. A smallpox like sore appeared in his arm and he had other mild smallpox like symptoms.

Teday, thanks to Dr. Jenner, we we can have a similiar immunizat-ion and avoid the disfiguring and killing epidemics which once swept Europe.

Several years later in France Louis Pasteur made a startling dis-covery one morning. The discoverya re-inoculation of some chickens with chichen cholera — set the wheels turning in Pasteur's creative mind.

"I've found a way to make a beast a little sick — inject some microbes into a chicken so that it gets the disease but only a little of it — and when it gets better — it can resist the disease. We can apply this to other diseases in man: we can save lives." These may have been some of the tthoughts running thru Pastaeur's mind.

Pasteur also explored and experimented until he found a way to prottect man from the dread rabie thru a series of inocluations. Today we use about the same method to keep a man bitten by a rabid animal from developing the disease. Another advance in immunology was made in 1923 when a toxin was

developed to save hundreds of bab les each year frof gasping death of diphtheria.

In the last 10 to 15 years we have read and watched the drama of polio vaccine unfold, Prinical play eres in that drama were Dr. Jonas Salk of the U of Pittsburg and Dr. Albert Sabin of University of Cinci nnatti

Dr. John Enders of the Children Hospital in Boston just recently deoped a measle vaccine to save lives and impairment in hundreds of NATIONAL POISON PREVENTION children.

These dedicated scientists did not croquer these diseases — smallpox rables, diphtheria, polio and measl-es in the literal seuse. They simply gave us a means of preventing them
