# THE COMMERCIAL USE OF TEXAS HIGHWAYS IS A PRIVILEGE, NOT A RIGHT 

- The highways of Texas are the property of its citizens. They constitute a system of nearly 200,000 miles of road of which 20,000 miles are desig. nated as State highways and the remainder are county roads. All types of road are represented in this system, less

The total cost of these highways is unknown but it amounts to many hundred million dollars. From 1917 to 1930, inclusive, counties and road istricts of the State issued $\$ 243,592,834$ in bonds for the construction and mprovement of roads and bridges. In the two-year period ending August 22,488,426 was for maintenance of th- State highways.

In view of these tremendous costs the preservation of our highways from rapid wear and destruction is a matter of very vital interest to their ers, viz., the public. It is especially important that they be made to outlast
from 20 to 30 years.
The use of the public highways for commercial purposes is not a right
but a privilege which may be withheld or granted subject to such restric-
but a privilege which may be withheld or granted subject to such restric-
tions, regulations and charges as the Legislature may see fit to impose. Such regulations are intended to promote safety, preserve the highways and safeguard the interests of the public.

Texas Railroads, which pay the entire cost of construction and maintenance of their own roadbeds and, in addition, make substantial contributions to the cost of Texas highways, are thoroughly regulated with respect their services, rates, methods and practices. There is no good reason why commercial users of the highways, built and maintained at the expense of the public, should not likewise be regulated to such extent as the public
interest requires and pay such charges as will represent proper compensation for the privileges granted them.

The statutes governing highway transportation as enacted by the Fortyecond Legislature represent the wishes of the citizens of this State and These statutes should be given a fair trial and their value ascertained, Unless this is done, a chaotic condition in transpertation as a whole will surely ensue
