Little Flu Seen

About this time last year, Texas and most of the United States was swamped with the so-called Asiatic flu.

In fact the inroads of the Asian strains of influenza were so widespread that its effects were felt all over the world with varying intensity.

There is no doubt that influenza was a contributing factor in the slight rise of death rates during the winter months. Influenza may weaken an individual's resistance so that he is subject to more serious illness such as a pneumonia which may result in death.

The two most studied outbreaks were the highly fatal pandemics of 1889 and 1918 when hundreds of thousands were killed as a result of the disease. Since then attention has been directed to the epidemic of mild disease that have been yearly occurrences with varying intensity.

Fortunately, although there was a large number of cases, the severity of the Asian influenza epidemic was not great. The epidemic as measured by excess influenza pneumonia mortality was only slightly more severe than the "A prime" epidemic of 1953.

Although there are no indications at the present time of another epidemic of the Asian strain of influenza, there undoubtedly will be some influenza.

Drive Carefully

In the midst of the Christmas holidays, the thoughts of many Texans are turning toward safety. There can be no doubt but that a better acquaintance among drivers with the "rules of the road" and other traffic safety regulations could greatly reduce the death toll of our highways.

To obtain correct and authoritative information about driving is a simple matter. A letter or postcard to the Department of Public Safety, Driver's License Division, Austin, Texas, will bring an official publication, the "Texas Driving Handbook", to anyone who requests it.

Pioneer Rancher Dies

Funeral services for Robert (Bob) Orson, 77, longtime rancher in this area, were held at 3 p. m. Friday in the Lamesa First Presbyterian Church. Officiating were Rev. Dr. Jordan Grooms, pastor of the First Methodist Church in Big Spring and the Rev. H. Clyde Smith superintendent for the Methodist Big Spring District. Burial was in Lamesa Memorial Park under the direction of Higginbotham Funeral Home. Mr. Orson was a member of a titled English family and died last Wednesday at a hospital in San Angelo. He had been in ill health for several months.

He was born Feb. 2, 1881 in Tangley, England and came to Texas in 1883 with his family. In 1903 he moved to Borden County where he and his brother, William C. Orson were partners in ranching the past 50 years. He was a member of O'Donnell Masonic Lodge for 44 years. He lived with his brother, William, in Borden County, east of Lamesa. Other survivors include a brother, Frank of Midland, four nephews and two nieces.

Mr. Orson was well known and respected over this area.

V. A. Quiz

Q—Isn't there a new law that says a handicapped child of a deceased war veteran need not wait until age 18 to start training under the War Orphans Education program?

A—Yes. A law recently passed gave such children the right to begin special types of War Orphans training when they reach age 14.

Q—I carry life insurance issued by a private company, and I receive a pension from VA. In reporting my 1958 income for VA pension purposes should I include dividends from my private company life insurance policy?

A—Yes. Proceedings from private life insurance company policies are considered as income for VA pension purposes and must be reported.

Q—Is there a grace period for late payments of installments on GI loans?

A—No. Veterans should make their GI loan payments on or before the date they are due. An extra charge may be made by GI lenders when payments are received late.

Q—Is a "peacetime" veteran with a disability rated 50 percent entitled to more compensation for dependents?

A—Yes. Peacetime veterans rated 50 percent or more disability may be entitled to additional compensation for a wife, minor children, or dependent parents.

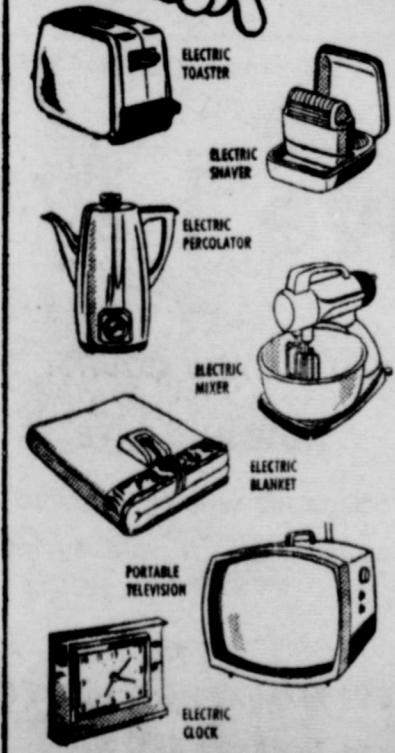

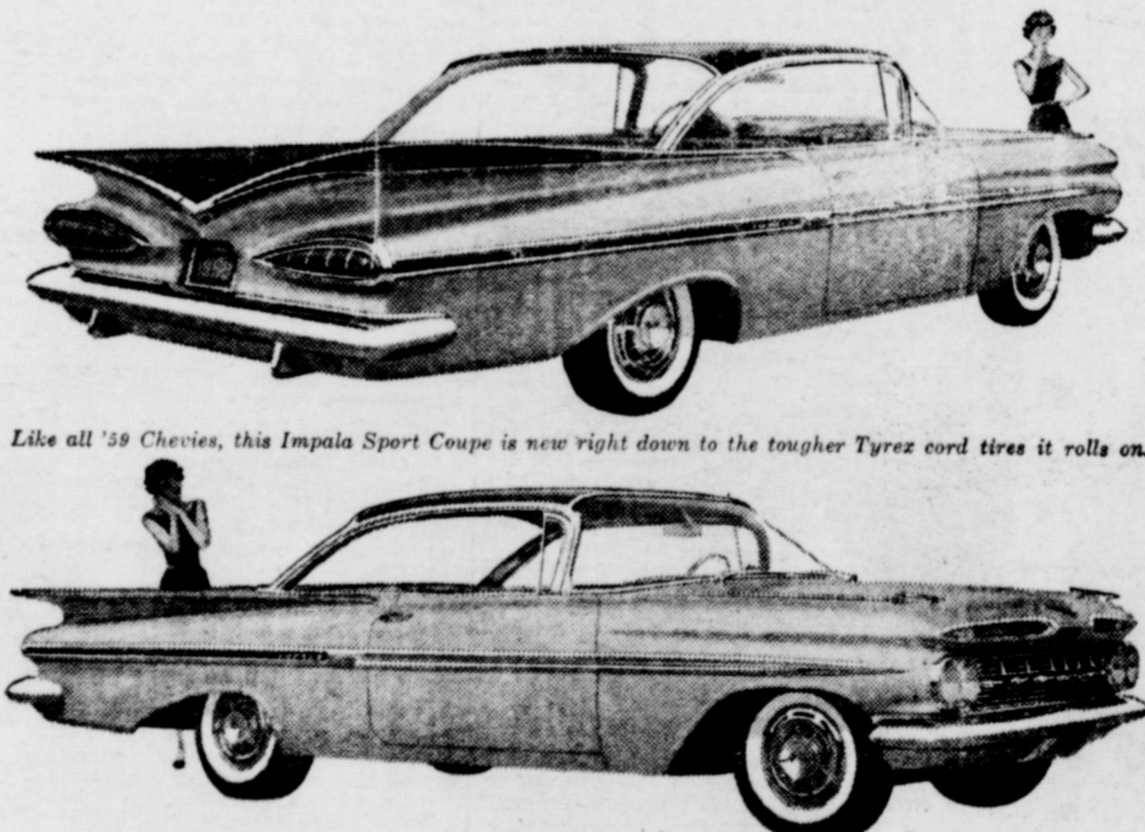

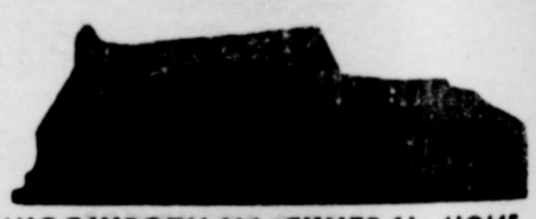

S. S. News

The social security district office has had far more inquiries than usual these past few weeks. John Hutton, manager, reported, A good many calls are from people who are receiving monthly retirement, disability or survivor checks and who are concerned about the increase that was authorized by Congress and the President recently.

Mr. Hutton reminds all social security beneficiaries that the increase in monthly benefits will come to them automatically; they do not have to phone, write, or visit the social security office to request or file any kind of application for the increase.

The checks for January of 1959, which will be mailed out on the first of February, will include the full increase the law provides, an average jump of about seven percent, he said. In dollars this means 65 year-old workers will receive

from \$3.00 to 7.50 more, depending upon the amount of their present benefits. Where total family payments reach \$254.00, individual benefits other than that paid to the worker may show a lesser percentage increase Mr. Hutton concluded. A representative of the Lubbock Social Security Office will be in O'Donnell on Dec. 17, 1958 at 2:00 p. m. at the Elementary School and will be glad to assist in all matters pertaining to Social Security.

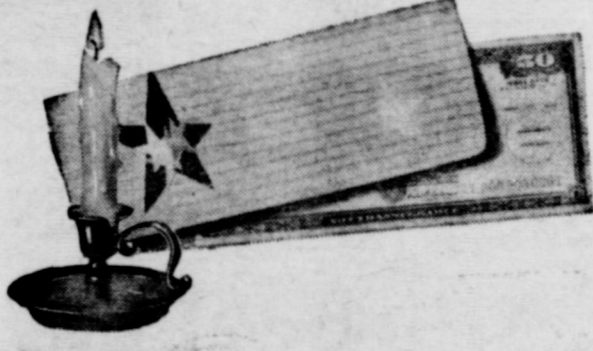

criminal case; and against having his private property taken for public use without just compensation. He is also secured against being held for trial for a capital or other infamous crime, unless upon a presentment or indictment of a grand jury. And, of course, no person may be deprived of life, liberty or property without orderly court procedures, or due process of law.

The right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury, in the locality where the crime was committed, the right to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation, and the rights to compel attendance of defense witnesses and to have the assistance of defense counsel in all criminal prosecutions are secured by another section of the "Bill of Rights."

Excessive bail and fines, and cruel and unusual punishments, are prohibited in Amendment VIII. Other articles insure the right to bear arms and ban quartering of soldiers in private homes during peace time.

HILL OF RIGHTS DAY

December 15 is observed each year as "Bill of Rights Day" throughout the United States. What does this important "document" mean to us?

The American "Bill of Rights", consisting of the first ten amendments to our federal constitution all adopted at one time in 1791, specifies in some detail a number of basic civil rights of the individual citizen. Unaltered by subsequent amendments and jealously guarded by our courts, these privileges must still be respected by our governing bodies today.

Among the most familiar of our constitutional guarantees are those relating to freedom of religion, speech, and of the press. The same article protects the rights of peaceable assembly and the privilege of petitioning the government for redress of grievances.

Another amendment secures our persons, houses, papers and effects against unreasonable searches and seizures, and specifies that no warrants shall issue but upon probable cause, and unless supported by oath or affirmation.

The due process of law amendment encompasses not one but several guarantees. Every American is secured against being placed twice in legal jeopardy for the same offense; against being compelled to be a witness against himself in a

- 1 cup very dry, toasted 1/2-in. bread cubes
- 1/2 teaspoon ground sage
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 1/4 cup finely cut onion
- 1/2 cup finely cut, unpeeled apple
- 1/2 cup PET Evaporated Milk
- 4 lean, boneless pork steaks or tenderloin slices (1/4 to 1/2 in. thick)
- 2 tablespoons hot shortening
- 1/4 cup water
- 1-lb. can whole kernel corn

In 1 1/2-qt. bowl mix bread cubes, sage, salt, pepper, onion, apple and PET Milk. Let stand until bread soaks up all milk. Put 1/2 stuffing mixture in center of each steak.
