## New Rural Mail Route

O'Donnell is to have another ural mail route
Postmaster Hal Singleton was notified to this effect by a dispatch from Postmaster Geueral New on January 16th.
This will be the second rural mail route to be secured for Donnell territory by Mr. Singleton in the last three months.
The new route will extend from
O'Donnell to Tredway and return, three times a week, the en tire distance being 37.03 miles. teaving the postoffice at $O^{\prime}$ Donreaving the postoffice at O'Don nell at $8: 30$ on Tuesdays, Thurs days and Satuidays, the route raversed will be east .50 and south to Frenoh corner. zast to Berry Flat school, south to Lansh corner, southeast 3.30 , northeast 1.00 southeast 1.00 to Mesquite school house, northeast 1.00 and orthwest 1.45 to Tredway, and on return trip, northwest to on return trip, northwest to
Stewart corner, west via Berry Flat school house, Russelt corner and Barnett corner to French corner, north 1.25 and weat to O'Donnell postoffice.
The mail will arriye at Tredway at 10:20 and dejart-at 12 m and arrive at O'Donnell at 1:45. Proposals for the carrying of this mail will be receired at the office of the Fourth Assistant Postmaster General at Washing ton until February 10th, the erm of carrying the 10th, the erm of carrying the mail to be rom March 1 to June B0th. 1926, motor vehicle to be used when the weather and road conditions will permit. Their purpose is to prevent the public from being defrauded. Such laws were first passed in 1911 in Kansas during a period of speculation. One of the advocates of the blue sky laws declared that many of the promoters, if they got a chance, would "capitallize the blue skles." Hence the name blue sky laws.
